10	An Act relating to oil and gas; creating the Hydrogen Production, Transportation and Infrastructure Task
11	Force; providing for membership of task force; providing duties of task force; requiring a quorum for contain action, requiring task force most with
12	for certain action; requiring task force meet with certain frequency; authorizing the chair to call meetings; subjecting meetings to Oklahoma Open
14	Meeting Act and the Oklahoma Open Records Act; providing that members receive no compensation;
15	requiring certain report by certain date; requiring task force report to certain persons; providing for
16	noncodification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
19	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
20	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
21	There is hereby created the Hydrogen Production, Transportation
22	and Infrastructure Task Force until December 31, 2021.
23	A. The task force shall be comprised of sixteen (16) members as
24	follows:

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1	1. The c	chair shall be the Secretary of Energy and Environment;
2	2. The c	co-chairs shall be:
3	a.	one member appointed by the President Pro Tempore of
4		the Senate, and
5	b.	one member appointed by the Speaker of the House of
6		Representatives;
7	3. Two r	nembers shall be:
8	a.	one member appointed by the President Pro Tempore of
9		the Senate, and
10	b.	one member appointed by the Speaker of the House of
11		Representatives;
12	4. Eleve	en members shall be appointed by the chair of the task
13	force as foll	lows:
14	a.	a member representing the Secretary of Commerce,
15	b.	a member representing the Secretary of Transportation,
16	c.	a member representing the Corporation Commission,
17	d.	a member representing the Oklahoma Water Resources
18		Board,
19	e.	a member representing the Oklahoma Center for Science
20		and Technology,
21	f.	a member representing the Grand River Dam Authority,
22	g.	a member representing an oil and gas midstream service
23		provider,
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1	h. a member representing a regulated natural gas
2	distribution company,
3	i. a member representing an electric service provider,
4	j. a member representing a company producing, or looking
5	to produce, hydrogen fuel, and
6	k. a member representing an electric energy developer.
7	B. A quorum of the task force shall be required to approve any
8	final action of the task force. A quorum shall be determined by the
9	chair of the task force.
10	C. The task force shall meet at least once per month. The
11	chair shall call the first meeting and all subsequent meetings shall
12	be made at the call of the chair.
13	D. The task force shall:
14	1. Investigate the viability of utilizing the existing pipeline
15	infrastructure in this state to move hydrogen fuel;
16	2. Investigate the existing and potential needs of the pipeline
17	industry to integrate hydrogen fuel;
18	3. Investigate opportunities to ensure this state is positioned
19	to support the future development of the hydrogen fuel sector;
20	4. Investigate the availability for cost competitive electric
21	power necessary for producing hydrogen fuel;
22	5. Investigate the taxation treatment of hydrogen fuel;
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6. Investigate incentives for necessary pipeline transmission
 of hydrogen fuel, the production of hydrogen fuel and enabling
 hydrogen fuel vehicle mobility; and

7. Investigate a state-wide roadmap for a hydrogen economy
including, but not limited to, vehicles, infrastructure, production,
distribution and off-taker market users.

E. The meetings of the task force shall be subject to the
Oklahoma Open Meeting Act and the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

F. The members of the task force shall receive no compensation
 or travel reimbursement.

G. The task force shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations including fiscal impact statements on all of the recommendations of the task force no later than December 1, 2021, to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2021. SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
