Supp. 2020, Section 427.13), which relates to medical marijuana; 4 requiring written operation procedures for certain 5 facilities; amending Section 14, Chapter 11, O.S.L. 2019, as last amended by Section 51, Chapter 161, 6 O.S.L. 2020 (63 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 427.14), which relates to the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana and 7 Patient Protection Act; grandfathering certain licensed location; allowing license transfer under certain conditions; defining term; providing for 8 certain foreign investments; amending Section 16, 9 Chapter 11, O.S.L. 2019 (63 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 427.16), which relates to medical marijuana transporter license; updating statutory references; 10 requiring each location to be registered; amending Section 2, Chapter 337, O.S.L. 2019 (63 O.S. Supp. 11 2020, Section 428.1), which relates to medical 12 marijuana waste management; modifying definitions; amending Section 4, Chapter 337, O.S.L. 2019 (63 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 430), which relates to medical 13 marijuana disposal license; limiting certain licenses until after certain date; providing for measurement 14 of prohibited distance from school; amending Section 7, State Question No. 788, Initiative Petition No. 15 412 (63 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 426), which relates to retail tax on medical marijuana; providing for 16 Oklahoma Tax Commission to assess, collect and enforce taxes; authorizing collection of certain 17 percentage of tax on retail medical marijuana sales; authorizing a percentage fee charged to the State 18 Department of Health; directing deposit of certain funds; providing exception; providing for 19 codification; and declaring an emergency. 20 21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 22 SECTION 1. 23 AMENDATORY Section 1, State Question No. 788,

24 Initiative Petition No. 412, as last amended by Section 44, Chapter

1 161, O.S.L. 2020 (63 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 420), is amended to read as follows: 2 3 Section 420. A. A person in possession of a state-issued medical marijuana license shall be able to: 4 5 1. Consume marijuana legally; Legally possess up to three (3) ounces of marijuana on their 6 2. 7 person; 3. Legally possess six mature marijuana plants; 8 9 4. Legally possess six seedling plants; 5. Legally possess one (1) ounce of concentrated marijuana; 10 11 6. Legally possess seventy-two (72) ounces of edible marijuana; 12 and 7. Legally possess up to eight (8) ounces of marijuana in their 13 residence. 14 B. Possession of up to one and one-half (1.5) ounces of 15 marijuana by persons who can state a medical condition, but are not 16 17 in possession of a state-issued medical marijuana license, shall constitute a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine not to exceed 18 Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) and shall not be subject to 19 imprisonment for the offense. Any law enforcement officer who comes 20 in contact with a person in violation of this subsection and who is 21 satisfied as to the identity of the person, as well as any other 22 pertinent information the law enforcement officer deems necessary, 23 shall issue to the person a written citation containing a notice to 24

answer the charge against the person in the appropriate court. Upon receiving the written promise of the alleged violator to answer as specified in the citation, the law enforcement officer shall release the person upon personal recognizance unless there has been a violation of another provision of law.

C. A regulatory office shall be established under the State
Department of Health which shall receive applications for medical
marijuana license recipients, dispensaries, growers, and packagers
within sixty (60) days of the passage of this initiative.

10 D. The State Department of Health shall, within thirty (30) 11 days of passage of this initiative, make available on its website, 12 in an easy-to-find location, an application for a medical marijuana license. The license shall be good for two (2) years. 13 The application fee shall be One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), or Twenty 14 Dollars (\$20.00) for individuals on Medicaid, Medicare or 15 SoonerCare. The methods of payment shall be provided on the website 16 17 of the Department.

A short-term medical marijuana license application shall 18 Ε. also be made available on the website of the State Department of 19 Health. A short-term medical marijuana license shall be granted to 20 any applicant who can meet the requirements for a two-year medical 21 marijuana license, but whose physician recommendation for medical 22 marijuana is only valid for sixty (60) days. Short-term medical 23 marijuana licenses shall be issued for sixty (60) days. 24 The fee for

a short-term medical marijuana license and the procedure for
 extending or renewing the license shall be determined by the
 Department.

A temporary license application shall also be made available 4 F. 5 on the website of the Department. A temporary medical marijuana license shall be granted to any medical marijuana license holder 6 7 from other states, provided that the state has a state-regulated medical marijuana program, and the applicant can prove he or she is 8 9 a member of such program. Temporary licenses shall be issued for 10 thirty (30) days. The cost for a temporary license shall be One 11 Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). Renewal shall be granted with resubmission of a new application. No additional criteria shall be 12 13 required.

G. Medical marijuana license applicants shall submit his or her applications to the State Department of Health for approval. The applicant shall be an Oklahoma state resident and shall prove residency by a valid driver license, utility bills, or other accepted methods.

H. The State Department of Health shall review the medical marijuana application, approve or reject the application, and mail the approval or rejection letter stating any reasons for rejection to the applicant within fourteen (14) business days of receipt of the application. Approved applicants shall be issued a medical marijuana license which shall act as proof of his or her approved

1 status. Applications may only be rejected based on the applicant 2 not meeting stated criteria or improper completion of the 3 application.

4 I. The State Department of Health shall only keep the following5 records for each approved medical marijuana license:

6 1. A digital photograph of the license holder;

7 2. The expiration date of the license;

8 3. The county where the card was issued; and

9 4. A unique 24-character identification number assigned to the10 license.

J. The State Department of Health shall make available, both on its website and through a telephone verification system, an easy method to validate the authenticity of the medical marijuana license by the unique 24-character identification number.

15 K. The State Department of Health shall ensure that all 16 application records and information are sealed to protect the 17 privacy of medical marijuana license applicants.

L. A caregiver license shall be made available for qualified caregivers of a medical marijuana license holder who is homebound. As provided in Section 11 of Enrolled House Bill No. 2612 of the 1st Session of the 57th Oklahoma Legislature <u>427.11 of this title</u>, the caregiver license shall provide the caregiver the same rights as the medical marijuana patient licensee₇ including the ability to possess marijuana, marijuana products and mature and immature plants or

cultivated medical marijuana pursuant to the Oklahoma Medical 1 Marijuana and Patient Protection Act, but excluding the ability to 2 3 use marijuana or marijuana products unless the caregiver has a medical marijuana patient license. An applicant for a caregiver 4 5 license shall submit proof of the license status and homebound status of the medical marijuana patient and proof that the applicant 6 is the designee of the medical marijuana patient. The applicant 7 shall also submit proof that he or she is eighteen (18) years of age 8 9 or older and proof of his or her Oklahoma residency. This shall be 10 the only criteria for a caregiver license. A licensed caregiver 11 shall not cultivate medical marijuana for more than five medical 12 marijuana patient licensees and shall not charge a medical marijuana patient licensee for cultivating medical marijuana in excess of the 13 actual costs incurred in cultivating the medical marijuana. 14

M. All applicants shall be eighteen (18) years of age or older.
A special exception shall be granted to an applicant under the age of eighteen (18); however, these applications shall be signed by two physicians and the parent or legal guardian of the applicant.

N. All applications for a medical marijuana license shall be signed by an Oklahoma physician. There are no qualifying conditions. A medical marijuana license must be recommended according to the accepted standards a reasonable and prudent physician would follow when recommending or approving any medication. No physician may be unduly stigmatized, penalized,

1 <u>subjected to discipline, sanctioned, reprimanded</u> or harassed for
2 signing a medical marijuana license application; provided, the
3 <u>physician acted in accordance with the provisions of this subsection</u>
4 <u>and all other rules governing the medical license of the physician</u>
5 <u>in this state</u>.

0. Counties and cities may enact medical marijuana guidelines
allowing medical marijuana license holders or caregivers to exceed
the state limits set forth in subsection A of this section.

9 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 6, State Question No. 788,
10 Initiative Petition No. 412, as last amended by Section 2 of
11 Enrolled Senate Bill No. 862 of the 1st Session of the 58th Oklahoma
12 Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 425. A. No school or landlord may refuse to enroll or lease to and may not otherwise penalize a person solely for his or her status as a licensed medical marijuana patient, unless failing to do so would cause the school or landlord the potential to lose a monetary or licensing-related benefit under federal law or regulations.

B. 1. Unless a failure to do so would cause an employer the potential to lose a monetary or licensing-related benefit under federal law or regulations, an employer may not discriminate against a person in hiring, termination or imposing any term or condition of employment or otherwise penalize a person based upon the status of the person as a licensed medical marijuana patient.

1 2. Employers may take action against a licensed medical 2 marijuana patient if the licensed medical marijuana patient uses or possesses marijuana while in his or her place of employment or 3 during the hours of employment. Employers may not take action 4 5 against the licensed medical marijuana patient solely based upon the status of an employee as a licensed medical marijuana patient or the 6 7 results of a drug test showing positive for marijuana or its components. 8

9 C. For the purposes of medical care, including organ 10 transplants, the authorized use of marijuana by a licensed medical 11 marijuana patient shall be considered the equivalent of the use of 12 any other medication under the direction of a physician and does not 13 constitute the use of an illicit substance or otherwise disqualify a 14 registered qualifying patient from medical care.

D. No licensed medical marijuana patient may be denied custody of or visitation or parenting time with a minor child, and there is no presumption of neglect or child endangerment for conduct allowed under this law, unless the behavior of the person creates an unreasonable danger to the safety of the minor child.

E. No licensed medical marijuana patient may unduly be withheld
from holding a state-issued license by virtue of their being a
licensed medical marijuana patient including, but not limited to, a
concealed carry permit.

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F. 1. No city or local municipality may unduly change or
 restrict zoning laws to prevent the opening of a medical marijuana
 dispensary.

2. For purposes of this subsection, an undue change or 4 5 restriction of municipal zoning laws means an act which entirely prevents medical marijuana dispensaries from operating within 6 municipal boundaries as a matter of law. Municipalities may follow 7 their standard planning and zoning procedures to determine if 8 9 certain zones or districts would be appropriate for locating 10 marijuana-licensed premises, medical marijuana businesses or any other premises where marijuana or its by-products are cultivated, 11 12 grown, processed, stored or manufactured.

3. For purposes of this section, a medical marijuana dispensary does not include those other entities licensed by the Department as marijuana-licensed premises, medical marijuana businesses or other facilities or locations where marijuana or any product containing marijuana or its by-products are cultivated, grown, processed, stored or manufactured.

19 G. The Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the 20 location of any retail marijuana establishment dispensary is 21 specifically prohibited within one thousand (1,000) feet of any 22 public or private school entrance. On and after the effective date 23 of this act, for purposes of calculating the 1,000-foot setback 24 distance, the measurement shall be determined by calculating the

4	<u>1. On an</u>	d after June 26, 2018, if any school is established

7	the setback d	istance between properties shall not apply as long as
8	the licensed	property is used for its original licensed purpose.
9	The licensed	location shall be grandfathered in as to the setback
10	distance as l	ong as the property is used in accordance with the
11	original lice	nsed purpose.
12	<u>2. On an</u>	d after June 26, 2018, the Authority, due to an error
13	in measuremen	t of the setback distance or failure to measure the
14	<u>setback dista</u>	nce by the Authority prior to issuance of an original
15	license at a	location, shall not:
16	<u>a.</u>	deny any issuance or renewal of a license at that
17		location,
18	<u>b.</u>	deny any transfer of license pursuant to a change in
19		ownership at that location, or
20	<u>C.</u>	revoke any license due to an error in measurement or
21		failure to measure the setback distance, except as
22		otherwise provided by law.
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1	The retail marijuana dispensary shall be grandfathered in as to
2	the setback distance, subject only to the municipal compliance
3	provisions of Section 426.1 of this title.
4	3. For purposes of this subsection:
5	a. "school" means the same as defined in Section 427.2 of
6	this title, and
7	b. "error in measurement" means a mistake made by the
8	Authority or a municipality in the setback measurement
9	process where either the distance between a retail
10	marijuana dispensary and a school is miscalculated due
11	to mathematical error or the method used to measure
12	the setback distance is inconsistent with this
13	section. The setback measurement process is allowed
14	an error in measurement up to and including five
15	hundred (500) feet when remeasured after an original
16	license has been issued.
17	H. Research shall be provided for under this law. A researcher
18	may apply to the State Department of Health for a special research
19	license. The license shall be granted, provided the applicant meets
20	the criteria listed under subsection B of Section 421 of this title.
21	Research licensees shall be required to file monthly consumption
22	reports to the State Department of Health with amounts of marijuana
23	used for research. Biomedical and clinical research which is

1 subject to federal regulations and institutional oversight shall not
2 be subject to State Department of Health oversight.

3 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY Section 4, Chapter 509, O.S.L. 4 2019 (63 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 426.1), is amended to read as 5 follows:

Section 426.1. A. Except for revocation hearings concerning 6 licensed patients, as defined in Section 2 of Enrolled House Bill 7 No. 2612 of the 1st Session of the 57th Oklahoma Legislature 427.2 8 9 of this title, all licensure revocation hearings conducted pursuant 10 to marijuana licenses established in the Oklahoma Statutes shall be 11 recorded. A party may request a copy of the recording of the 12 proceedings. Copies shall be provided to local law enforcement if the revocation was based on alleged criminal activity. 13

The State Department of Health shall assist any law 14 Β. enforcement officer in the performance of his or her duties upon 15 such request by the law enforcement officer or the request of other 16 local officials having jurisdiction. Except for license information 17 concerning licensed patients, as defined in Section 2 of Enrolled 18 House Bill No. 2612 of the 1st Session of the 57th Oklahoma 19 Legislature 427.2 of this title, the Department shall share 20 information with law enforcement agencies upon request without a 21 subpoena or search warrant. 22

C. The State Department of Health shall make available allinformation displayed on medical marijuana licenses, as well as

whether or not the license is valid, to law enforcement
 electronically through the Oklahoma Law Enforcement
 Telecommunications System.

D. The Department shall make available to political
subdivisions a list of marijuana-licensed premises, medical
marijuana businesses or any other premises where marijuana or its
by-products are licensed to be cultivated, grown, processed, stored
or manufactured to aid county and municipal governments in
identifying locations within their jurisdiction and ensure
compliance with local regulations.

E. 1. All marijuana-licensed premises, medical marijuana 11 12 businesses or any other premises where marijuana or its by-products 13 are licensed to be cultivated, grown, processed, stored or manufactured shall submit with their application, after notifying 14 the political subdivision of their intent, a certificate of 15 compliance from the political subdivision where the facility of the 16 17 applicant or use is to be located certifying compliance with zoning classifications, applicable municipal ordinances and all applicable 18 safety, electrical, fire, plumbing, waste, construction and building 19 specification codes. 20

2. Beginning on the effective date of this act, upon the
 initial request for renewal or transfer of a retail marijuana
 dispensary license, a municipal government may object to the
 continued licensure of the medical marijuana dispensary if the

1	municipal government determines it is operating contrary to the
2	required setback distance from a school including the error in
3	measurement allowance authorized by Section 425 of this title.
4	3. To prevent the granting of the grandfather provisions of
5	Section 425 of this title as a matter of law, the municipal
6	government shall provide the following documentation prior to the
7	initial renewal or transfer of a license:
8	a. a municipal resolution finding that the marijuana
9	dispensary is located within the prohibited setback
10	distance from a school that was openly in existence in
11	such a way that the public generally would have known
12	of the school's existence and operation in that
13	location prior to the original marijuana dispensary
14	being licensed. For purposes of this subparagraph,
15	"openly in existence" means any building, location or
16	structure on a school site that has visible outward
17	markings indicating the building, location or
18	structure was operating as a school which would serve
19	as sufficient notice of the existence of the school or
20	a reason for further inquiry on the part of the
21	marijuana dispensary license applicant. "Openly in
22	existence" shall not mean any school that operated
23	secretly or discreetly without any signs or other
24	markings on any building, location or structure on the

1	school site, undeveloped land or a structure owned by
2	a school that was not openly used and marked as a
3	school site, or any school site that was established
4	after the marijuana dispensary had been established
5	and licensed by the Authority, and
6	b. documentation of the measured distance from the school
7	to the marijuana dispensary utilizing the method for
8	determining the setback distance less any allowable
9	error in measurement calculated and remeasured on and
10	after the effective date of this act as authorized by
11	Section 425 of this title.
12	4. Prior to initial renewal or transfer of a license and upon
13	receipt of documentation required by paragraph 3 of this subsection,
14	if the Authority determines that the medical marijuana dispensary is
15	operating contrary to the required setback distance from a school
16	including the error in measurement allowance authorized by Section
17	425 of this title, the Authority may deny the renewal or transfer of
18	the medical marijuana dispensary license and shall cause the license
19	to be revoked.
20	5. For purposes of this subsection, "school" means the same as
21	defined in Section 427.2 of this title.
22	SECTION 4. AMENDATORY Section 2, Chapter 11, O.S.L.
23	2019, as last amended by Section 48, Chapter 161, O.S.L. 2020 (63
24	O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 427.2), is amended to read as follows:

Section 427.2. As used in this act the Oklahoma Medical
 <u>Marijuana and Patient Protection Act</u>:
 1. "Advertising" means the act of providing consideration for
 the publication, dissemination, solicitation, or circulation, of

visual, oral, or written communication to induce directly or indirectly any person to patronize a particular medical marijuana business, or to purchase particular medical marijuana or a medical marijuana product. Advertising includes marketing, but does not include packaging and labeling;

2. "Authority" means the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority;
 3. "Batch number" means a unique numeric or alphanumeric
 identifier assigned prior to testing to allow for inventory tracking
 and traceability;

14 4. "Cannabinoid" means any of the chemical compounds that are15 active principles of marijuana;

16 5. "Caregiver" means a family member or assistant who regularly 17 looks after a medical marijuana license holder whom a physician 18 attests needs assistance;

19 6. "Child-resistant" means special packaging that is:

a. designed or constructed to be significantly difficult
for children under five (5) years of age to open and
not difficult for normal adults to use properly as
defined by 16 C.F.R. 1700.15 (1995) and 16 C.F.R.
1700.20 (1995),

- b. opaque so that the outermost packaging does not allow
 the product to be seen without opening the packaging
 material, and
- 4 c. resealable to maintain its child-resistant
 5 effectiveness for multiple openings for any product
 6 intended for more than a single use or containing
 7 multiple servings;

8 7. "Clone" means a nonflowering plant cut from a mother plant 9 that is capable of developing into a new plant and has shown no 10 signs of flowering;

"Commissioner" means the State Commissioner of Health; 11 8. 12 9. "Complete application" means a document prepared in accordance with the provisions set forth in this act the Oklahoma 13 Medical Marijuana and Patient Protection Act, rules promulgated 14 15 pursuant thereto, and the forms and instructions provided by the Department τ including any supporting documentation required and the 16 applicable license application fee; 17

18 10. "Department" means the State Department of Health;
19 11. "Director" means the Executive Director of the Oklahoma
20 Medical Marijuana Authority;

21 12. "Dispense" means the selling of medical marijuana or a
22 medical marijuana product to a qualified patient or the designated
23 caregiver of the patient that is packaged in a suitable container

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1 appropriately labeled for subsequent administration to or use by a
2 qualifying patient;

3 13. "Dispensary" means a medical marijuana dispensary, an entity that has been licensed by the Department pursuant to this act 4 5 the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana and Patient Protection Act to purchase medical marijuana or medical marijuana products from a 6 licensed medical marijuana commercial grower or medical marijuana 7 processor, sell medical marijuana or medical marijuana products to 8 9 patients and caregivers as defined under this act the Oklahoma 10 Medical Marijuana and Patient Protection Act, or sell or transfer 11 products to another dispensary;

12 14. "Edible medical marijuana product" means any medical-13 marijuana-infused product for which the intended use is oral 14 consumption including, but not limited to, any type of food, drink 15 or pill;

16 15. "Entity" means an individual, general partnership, limited 17 partnership, limited liability company, trust, estate, association, 18 corporation, cooperative, or any other legal or commercial entity;

19 16. "Flower" means the reproductive organs of the marijuana or 20 cannabis plant referred to as the bud or parts of the plant that are 21 harvested and used to consume in a variety of medical marijuana 22 products;

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17. "Flowering" means the reproductive state of the marijuana
 or cannabis plant in which there are physical signs of flower or
 budding out of the nodes of the stem;

18. "Food-based medical marijuana concentrate" means a medical
marijuana concentrate that was produced by extracting cannabinoids
from medical marijuana through the use of propylene glycol,
glycerin, butter, olive oil, coconut oil or other typical food-safe
cooking fats;

9 19. "Good cause" for purposes of an initial, renewal or 10 reinstatement license application, or for purposes of discipline of 11 a licensee, means:

12 a. the licensee or applicant has violated, does not meet, or has failed to comply with any of the terms, 13 conditions or provisions of the act, any rules 14 15 promulgated pursuant thereto, or any supplemental relevant state or local law, rule or regulation, 16 b. the licensee or applicant has failed to comply with 17 any special terms or conditions that were placed upon 18 the license pursuant to an order of the State 19 Department of Health, Oklahoma Medical Marijuana 20 Authority or the municipality, or 21 the licensed premises of a medical marijuana business 22 с. or applicant have been operated in a manner that 23 adversely affects the public health or welfare or the 24

"Harvest batch" means a specifically identified quantity of medical marijuana that is uniform in strain, cultivated utilizing 4 5 the same cultivation practices, harvested at the same time from the same location and cured under uniform conditions; 6 "Harvested marijuana" means post-flowering medical 7 21. marijuana not including trim, concentrate or waste; 8 9 22. All applicants for a medical marijuana business license, 22 research facility license or education facility license authorized 23 by this act the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana and Patient Protection 24

Act shall undergo an Oklahoma criminal history background check conducted by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI) within thirty (30) days prior to the application for the license, including:

- a. individual applicants applying on their own behalf,
 b. individuals applying on behalf of an entity,
 c. all principal officers of an entity, and
 d. all owners of an entity as defined by this act Section
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427.2 of this title;

10 10. All applicable fees charged by OSBI are the responsibility 11 of the applicant and shall not be higher than fees charged to any 12 other person or industry for such background checks;

11. In order to be considered an Oklahoma resident for purposes 13 of a medical marijuana business application, all applicants shall 14 15 provide proof of Oklahoma residency for at least two (2) years immediately preceding the date of application or five (5) years of 16 continuous Oklahoma residency during the preceding twenty-five (25) 17 years immediately preceding the date of application. Sufficient 18 documentation of proof of residency shall include a combination of 19 the following: 20

a. an unexpired Oklahoma-issued driver license,
b. an Oklahoma voter identification card,

10 business applications and conduct all investigations, inspections
11 and interviews before approving the application.

12 2. Approved applicants shall be issued a medical marijuana business license for the specific category applied under which shall 13 act as proof of their approved status. Rejection letters shall 14 provide a reason for the rejection. 19 4. A person under twenty-five (25) years of age;

20 5. A person licensed pursuant to this section who, during a 21 period of licensure, or who, at the time of application, has failed 22 to:

6. A sheriff, deputy sheriff, police officer or prosecuting

has been revoked by the Department Authority.

9 I. In investigating the qualifications of an applicant or a 10 licensee, the Department, Authority and municipalities may have 11 access to criminal history record information furnished by a 12 criminal justice agency subject to any restrictions imposed by such an agency. In the event the Department Authority considers the 13 criminal history record of the applicant, the Department Authority 14 shall also consider any information provided by the applicant 15 regarding such criminal history record $_{\tau}$ including but not limited to 16 17 evidence of rehabilitation, character references and educational achievements, especially those items pertaining to the period of 18 time between the last criminal conviction of the applicant and the 19 consideration of the application for a state license. 20

J. The failure of an applicant to provide the requested information by the Authority deadline may be grounds for denial of the application.

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K. All applicants shall submit information to the Department
 and Authority in a full, faithful, truthful and fair manner. The
 Department and Authority may recommend denial of an application
 where the applicant made misstatements, omissions,

5 misrepresentations or untruths in the application or in connection 6 with the background investigation of the applicant. This type of 7 conduct may be considered as the basis for additional administrative 8 action against the applicant. Typos and scrivener errors shall not 9 be grounds for denial.

L. A licensed medical marijuana business premises shall be subject to and responsible for compliance with applicable provisions for medical marijuana business facilities as described in the most recent versions of the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code, the International Building Code and the International Fire Code, unless granted an exemption by the Authority or municipality.

M. All medical marijuana business licensees shall pay the relevant licensure fees prior to receiving licensure to operate a medical marijuana business, as defined in this act the Oklahoma <u>Medical Marijuana and Patient Protection Act</u> for each class of license.

N. An original medical marijuana business license issued on or
 after June 26, 2018, by the Authority, for a medical marijuana
 commercial grower, a medical marijuana processor or a medical
 marijuana dispensary shall be deemed to have been grandfathered into

The licensed 3 premises shall meet all security requirements applicable to a 4 medical marijuana business.

H. A medical marijuana transporter licensee shall use the seedto-sale tracking system developed pursuant to this act the Oklahoma
Medical Marijuana and Patient Protection Act to create shipping
manifests documenting the transport of medical marijuana,
concentrate and products throughout the state.

I. A licensed medical marijuana transporter may maintain and
operate one or more warehouses in the state to handle medical
marijuana, concentrate and products. Each location shall be
registered and inspected by the Authority prior to its use.

J. All medical marijuana, concentrate and product shall be transported:

In vehicles equipped with Global Positioning System (GPS)
 trackers;

In a locked container and clearly labeled "Medical Marijuana

K. A transporter agent may possess marijuana at any location while the transporter agent is transferring marijuana to or from a licensed medical marijuana business, medical marijuana research

The Department may revoke or suspend the transporter license of a transporter that the Department determines knowingly aided or facilitated a violation of any provision of this section, and the licenseholder <u>license-holder</u> is subject to any other penalties established in law for the violation.

S. Vehicles used in the transport of medical marijuana ormedical marijuana product shall be:

Insured at or above the legal requirements in Oklahoma this

As provided in Section 426 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes, 15 the State Department of Health and the Oklahoma Tax Commission shall 16 enter into a contract whereby the Tax Commission shall have 17 authority to assess, collect and enforce the seven percent (7%) tax 18 on retail medical marijuana sales and any penalties and interest 19 thereon. Such assessment, collection and enforcement authority 20 shall apply to any tax and any penalty or interest liability on 21 retail medical marijuana sales existing at the time of contracting. 22 The contract shall provide for the assessment, collection and 23 enforcement of the tax on retail medical marijuana sales in the same 24

1	manner as the administration, collection and enforcement of any tax
2	payable by any taxpayer subject to taxation under any state tax law.
3	For providing such collection assistance, the Tax Commission shall
4	charge the State Department of Health a fee of one and five-tenths
5	percent (1.5%) of the gross collection proceeds. All funds retained
6	by the Tax Commission for the collection services shall be deposited
7	in the Tax Commission Reimbursement Fund in the State Treasury.
8	SECTION 15. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
9	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
10	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
11	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
