11	An Act relating to teacher education; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1-116, as last amended by Section
12	1, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2019 (70 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 1-116), which relates to positions in a
13	school system; modifying definition of student teacher to allow certain compensation; prohibiting
14	compensation from being considered for certain purposes; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 6-186, as
15	last amended by Section 2, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2019 (70 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 6-186), which relates to
16	teacher education programs; removing language allowing only students who have completed certain
17	requirement to participate in certain paid internship; updating statutory reference; providing
18	an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
22	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1-116, as
23	last amended by Section 1, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2019 (70 O.S. Supp.
24	2020, Section 1-116), is amended to read as follows:

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Section 1-116. As used in this title:

2 "Teacher" means any person who is employed to serve as 1. district superintendent, principal, supervisor, a counselor, 3 librarian, school nurse or classroom teacher or in any other 4 5 instructional, supervisory or administrative capacity. The person shall not be deemed qualified unless the person holds a valid 6 certificate issued by and in accordance with the rules of the State 7 Board of Education or the rules of the State Board of Career and 8 9 Technology Education, to perform the particular services for which 10 the person is employed;

11 2. "Superintendent" or "superintendent of schools" means the 12 executive officer of the board of education and the administrative 13 head of the school system of a district maintaining an accredited 14 school, provided the person holds an administrator's certificate 15 recognized by the State Board of Education;

3. "Principal" means any person other than a district superintendent of schools having supervisory or administrative authority over any school or school building having two or more teachers. A teaching principal shall be a principal who devotes at least one-half (1/2) the time school is in session to classroom teaching. Teaching principals shall be required to hold administrative certificates;

4. "Teachers" means, for purposes of complying with the StateAid Law and other statutes, but not any other provision of law,

which apportion money on the basis of teaching units or the number of teachers employed or qualified, all persons holding proper certificates and connected in any capacity with the instruction of pupils;

5. "Inductee" means any certified teacher who is employed in a
6 local school to serve as a classroom teacher under the guidance and
7 assistance of a mentor teacher or teachers;

6. "Student teacher" means any student who is enrolled in an 8 9 institution of higher learning approved by the State Board of 10 Education for teacher training and who is jointly assigned by the 11 institution of higher learning and a board of education of a school 12 district to perform practice teaching under the direction of a regularly employed and certified teacher. A student teacher, while 13 serving an internship under the supervision of a certified teacher, 14 15 shall be accorded the same protection of the laws as that accorded 16 the certified teacher and shall be eligible to receive compensation beginning on the first day of the internship for up to one full 17 school year; provided, however, that such compensation shall not be 18 considered compensation for purposes of teacher retirement or the 19 minimum salary schedule; 20

7. "School nurse" means a person employed full time by a board
of education who is a registered nurse licensed by the Oklahoma
State Board of Nurse Registration and Nursing Education and is
certified the same as a teacher by the State Board of Education.

Provided, that any person who is employed as a full-time school nurse in any school district in Oklahoma who is not registered on the effective date of this act July 2, 1971, may continue to serve in the same capacity; however, such person shall, under rules adopted by the State Board of Education, attend classes in nursing and prepare to become registered.

7 A school nurse employed by a board of education shall be 8 accorded the same protection of laws and all other benefits accorded 9 a certified teacher; and

8. "Support employee" means an employee who provides those
 services which are not performed by certified teachers, principals,
 superintendents or administrators and which are necessary for the
 efficient and satisfactory functioning of a school district.

 AMENDATORY
 70 O.S. 2011, Section 6-186, as

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 last amended by Section 2, Chapter 273, O.S.L. 2019 (70 O.S. Supp.

 2020, Section 6-186), is amended to read as follows:

Section 6-186. A. Criteria for the approval and accreditation of teacher education programs in Oklahoma institutions of higher education shall include, but not be limited to, substantial evidence that persons who enter teacher education programs demonstrate:

Competency in the oral and written use of the English
 language;

23 2. A minimum grade point average as established by the24 Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability; and

3. The ability to meet criteria established pursuant to the
 Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act at the completion of the teacher
 education program and provide evidence of having worked with
 children or youth in a variety of situations.

5 Criteria shall also include a greater emphasis upon field work
6 in accredited schools by prospective teachers under the supervision
7 of higher education faculty.

The Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability 8 Β. 9 shall work with the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and 10 the various institutions of higher education in developing 11 guidelines for a paid teacher internship program which may be 12 offered at each institution for prospective teachers. The purpose of each program shall be to provide mentorship and support for 13 prospective teachers. Students enrolled in a teacher education 14 15 program shall be eligible to participate in the program. Only students who have completed the minimum teacher internship 16 requirement as established by the institution shall be eligible to 17 participate in the paid teacher internship program. 18

19 C. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the Legislature 20 that the Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability work 21 with the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and the various 22 institutions of higher education in establishing a procedure whereby 23 full-time teacher education faculty continue their professional 24 development during their tenure at an institution of higher

1 education to ensure that the future teachers of this state are 2 taught by professional educators fully trained in their area of 3 expertise. Each approved or accredited program of teacher education shall have a system for documenting and reporting the annual 4 5 professional development activities of all teacher education faculty members. Faculty professional development reports shall be reviewed 6 by the Commission along with professional development activities as 7 a normal part of the accreditation process. 8

9 It is further declared to be the intent of the Legislature that 10 such professional development plans provide alternative means of 11 education including, but not limited to:

- 12 1. Professional development programs;
- 13 2. Higher education courses;

Exchange programs with public school classroom teachers,
 administrators, and other school personnel; and

4. Programs whereby all full-time teacher education faculty
members directly involved in the teacher education process,
including all administrators of the teacher education program, are
required to serve in a state accredited public school for at least
ten (10) clock hours per school year in responsibilities related to
their respective teacher education teaching fields.

All public school systems shall participate in the programsprovided for in this subsection when needed.

D. The Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability shall adopt rules requiring specific improvements to strengthen the screening of student applicants and field activity and placement as set out in subsection A of this section. Such rules shall be reviewed and amended or readopted by the Commission at least once every five (5) years.

7 Ε. To assist the Commission in setting specific requirements as set out in subsections A and D of this section, the Commission shall 8 9 annually prepare a statistical report showing the percentage of 10 students from each of the Oklahoma institutions of higher education 11 who have successfully completed or who have failed the competency 12 examination for certification. The annual report shall show the percentages for each institution of higher education and each 13 assessment area separately by student degree status and shall be 14 distributed annually to each member of the Commission for 15 Educational Quality and Accountability, the Oklahoma State Regents 16 for Higher Education, the governing board of each institution which 17 has an approved or state accredited teacher education program, the 18 State Board of Education, the State Board of Career and Technology 19 Education and the Legislature. 20

F. By November 1, 2017, the Commission shall adopt rules
requiring coursework or training in the use of digital and other
instructional technologies as a requisite for program accreditation.
SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2021.

1	SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
2	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
3	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
4	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
