6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to the State Commissioner of Health;
8 amending 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-104, which relates
9 to the State Board of Health; deleting certain power;
10 authorizing the Governor to make certain appointment
11 and fix certain salary; providing for codification;
12 and declaring an emergency.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-104, is
15 amended to read as follows:

16 Section 1-104. A. The State Board of Health shall elect
17 annually from its membership a President, Vice President and
18 Secretary. The Board shall adopt rules for its government, and may
19 adopt an official seal for the State Department of Health. It shall
20 hold such meetings as it deems necessary. Each member of the Board
21 shall be paid travel expenses, as provided in the State Travel
22 Reimbursement Act.

23 B. The Board shall have the following powers and duties:

24 1. ~~Appoint and fix the compensation of a State Commissioner of
Health;~~

1 ~~2.~~ Adopt such rules and standards as it deems necessary to
2 carry out any of the provisions of this Code;

3 ~~3.~~ 2. Accept and disburse grants, allotments, gifts, devises,
4 bequests, funds, appropriations, and other property made or offered
5 to it; and

6 ~~4.~~ 3. Establish such divisions, sections, bureaus, offices, and
7 positions in the State Department of Health as it deems necessary to
8 carry out the provisions of this Code.

9 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
10 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-104a of Title 63, unless there
11 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

12 The Governor shall appoint and fix the compensation of a State
13 Commissioner of Health.

14 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
15 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
16 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
17 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
