AMENDATORY 51 O.S. 2011, Section 152, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 233, O.S.L. 2018 (51 O.S. Supp. 2019, 13 Section 152), is amended to read as follows: 14 Section 152. As used in The Governmental Tort Claims Act: 15 1. "Action" means a proceeding in a court of competent 16 jurisdiction by which one party brings a suit against another; 17 2. "Agency" means any board, commission, committee, department 18 or other instrumentality or entity designated to act in behalf of 19 the state or a political subdivision; 20 3. "Charitable health care provider" means a person who is 21 licensed, certified, or otherwise authorized by the laws of this 22 state to administer health care in the ordinary course of business 23 or the practice of a profession and who provides care to a medically 24

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1 indigent person, as defined in paragraph 9 of this section, with no 2 expectation of or acceptance of compensation of any kind;

4. "Claim" means any written demand presented by a claimant or
the claimant's authorized representative in accordance with this act
<u>The Governmental Tort Claims Act</u> to recover money from the state or
political subdivision as compensation for an act or omission of a
political subdivision or the state or an employee;

8 5. "Claimant" means the person or the person's authorized
9 representative who files notice of a claim in accordance with The

- 7 (6) any person who is licensed to practice medicine pursuant to Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, 8 9 who is under an administrative professional services contract with the Oklahoma Health Care 10 11 Authority under the auspices of the Oklahoma 12 Health Care Authority Chief Medical Officer, and 13 who is limited to performing administrative duties such as professional guidance for medical 14 reviews, reimbursement rates, service 15 utilization, health care delivery and benefit 16 17 design for the Oklahoma Health Care Authority, only while acting within the scope of such 18 contract, 19
 - (7) licensed medical professionals under contract with city, county, or state entities who provide medical care to inmates or detainees in the custody or control of law enforcement agencies,
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1 (8) licensed mental health professionals as defined in Sections 1-103 and 5-502 of Title 43A of the 2 3 Oklahoma Statutes, who are conducting initial examinations of individuals for the purpose of 4 5 determining whether an individual meets the criteria for emergency detention as part of a 6 contract with the Department of Mental Health and 7 Substance Abuse Services, and 8

9 (9) licensed mental health professionals as defined in Sections 1-103 and 5-502 of Title 43A of the 10 11 Oklahoma Statutes, who are providing mental health or substance abuse treatment services 12 13 under a professional services contract with the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse 14 Services and are providing such treatment 15 services at a state-operated facility. 16

17Physician faculty members and staff of the University18of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center and the College of19Osteopathic Medicine of Oklahoma State University not20acting in an administrative capacity or engaged in21teaching duties are not employees or agents of the22state.

"Loss" means death or injury to the body or rights of a 4 5 person or damage to real or personal property or rights therein; 9. "Medically indigent" means a person requiring medically 6 7 necessary hospital or other health care services for the person or the dependents of the person who has no public or private third-8 9 party coverage, and whose personal resources are insufficient to 10 provide for needed health care; 11 10. "Municipality" means any incorporated city or town, and all 12 institutions, agencies or instrumentalities of a municipality; 11. "Political subdivision" means: 13 14 a. a municipality, a school district, including, but not limited to, a 15 b. technology center school district established pursuant 16 to Section 4410, 4411, 4420 or 4420.1 of Title 70 of 17 the Oklahoma Statutes, 18 19 с. a county, a public trust where the sole beneficiary or 20 d. beneficiaries are a city, town, school district or 21 county. For purposes of The Governmental Tort Claims 22 Act, a public trust shall include: 23 24

1 (1)a municipal hospital created pursuant to Sections 2 30-101 through 30-109 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma 3 Statutes, a county hospital created pursuant to Sections 781 through 796 of Title 19 of the 4 5 Oklahoma Statutes, or is created pursuant to a joint agreement between such governing 6 7 authorities, that is operated for the public benefit by a public trust created pursuant to 8 9 Sections 176 through 180.4 of Title 60 of the 10 Oklahoma Statutes and managed by a governing 11 board appointed or elected by the municipality, 12 county, or both, who exercises control of the 13 hospital, subject to the approval of the governing body of the municipality, county, or 14 15 both, 16

a public trust created pursuant to Sections 176 (2) 17 through 180.4 of Title 60 of the Oklahoma Statutes after January 1, 2009, the primary 18 purpose of which is to own, manage, or operate a 19 20 public acute care hospital in this state that serves as a teaching hospital for a medical 21 residency program provided by a college of 22 23 osteopathic medicine and provides care to indigent persons, and 24

- 1 (3) a corporation in which all of the capital stock 2 is owned, or a limited liability company in which 3 all of the member interest is owned, by a public 4 trust,
- 5 e. for the purposes of The Governmental Tort Claims Act only, a housing authority created pursuant to the 6 7 provisions of the Oklahoma Housing Authority Act, f. for the purposes of The Governmental Tort Claims Act 8 9 only, corporations organized not for profit pursuant 10 to the provisions of the Oklahoma General Corporation Act for the primary purpose of developing and 11 providing rural water supply and sewage disposal 12 facilities to serve rural residents, 13
- 14 g. for the purposes of The Governmental Tort Claims Act 15 only, districts formed pursuant to the Rural Water, 16 Sewer, Gas and Solid Waste Management Districts Act, 17 h. for the purposes of The Governmental Tort Claims Act 18 only, master conservancy districts formed pursuant to 19 the Conservancy Act of Oklahoma,
- i. for the purposes of The Governmental Tort Claims Act
 only, a fire protection district created pursuant to
 the provisions of Section 901.1 et seq. of Title 19 of
 the Oklahoma Statutes,
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1 i. for the purposes of The Governmental Tort Claims Act 2 only, a benevolent or charitable corporate volunteer 3 or full-time fire department for an unincorporated area created pursuant to the provisions of Section 592 4 5 et seq. of Title 18 of the Oklahoma Statutes, for purposes of The Governmental Tort Claims Act only, 6 k. an Emergency Services Provider rendering services 7 within the boundaries of a Supplemental Emergency 8 9 Services District pursuant to an existing contract 10 between the Emergency Services Provider and the State 11 Department of Health. Provided, however, that the 12 acquisition of commercial liability insurance covering 13 the activities of such Emergency Services Provider performed within the State of Oklahoma shall not 14 15 operate as a waiver of any of the limitations, immunities or defenses provided for political 16 subdivisions pursuant to the terms of The Governmental 17 Tort Claims Act, 18

for purposes of The Governmental Tort Claims Act only,
 a conservation district created pursuant to the
 provisions of the Conservation District Act,

22 m. for purposes of The Governmental Tort Claims Act <u>only</u>, 23 districts formed pursuant to the Oklahoma Irrigation 24 District Act,

- n. for purposes of The Governmental Tort Claims Act only,
 any community action agency established pursuant to
 Sections 5035 through 5040 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma
 Statutes,
- o. for purposes of The Governmental Tort Claims Act only,
 any organization that is designated as a youth
 services agency, pursuant to Section 2-7-306 of Title
 10A of the Oklahoma Statutes,
- 9 p. for purposes of The Governmental Tort Claims Act only,
 10 any judge presiding over a drug court, as defined by
 11 Section 471.1 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes,
- q. for purposes of The Governmental Tort Claims Act only,
 any child-placing agency licensed by this state to
 place children in foster family homes, and
- r. <u>for purposes of The Governmental Tort Claims Act only,</u>
 a circuit engineering district created pursuant to
 Section 687.1 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes,
 and
- 19s.for purposes of The Governmental Tort Claims Act only,20a substate planning district, regional council of21government or other entity created pursuant to Section221001 et seq. of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes,23and all their institutions, instrumentalities or agencies;
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1 12. "Scope of employment" means performance by an employee
 acting in good faith within the duties of the employee's office or
 employment or of tasks lawfully assigned by a competent authority
 including the operation or use of an agency vehicle or equipment
 with actual or implied consent of the supervisor of the employee,
 but shall not include corruption or fraud;

7 13. "State" means the State of Oklahoma or any office,
8 department, agency, authority, commission, board, institution,
9 hospital, college, university, public trust created pursuant to
10 Title 60 of the Oklahoma Statutes of which the State of Oklahoma is
11 the beneficiary, or other instrumentality thereof; and

12 14. "Tort" means a legal wrong, independent of contract, 13 involving violation of a duty imposed by general law, statute, the 14 Constitution of the State of Oklahoma, or otherwise, resulting in a 15 loss to any person, association or corporation as the proximate 16 result of an act or omission of a political subdivision or the state 17 or an employee acting within the scope of employment.
