8 An Act relating to vulnerable adults; amending 43A  
9 O.S. 2011, Section 10-103, which relates to  
10 definitions; modifying inclusions; and providing an  
11 effective date.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 43A O.S. 2011, Section 10-103, is  
14 amended to read as follows:

15 Section 10-103. A. When used in the Protective Services for  
16 Vulnerable Adults Act:

17 1. "Protective services" means services which are necessary to  
18 aid a vulnerable adult in meeting the essential requirements for  
19 mental or physical health and safety that the vulnerable adult is  
20 unable to provide or obtain without assistance. The term  
21 "protective services" includes but is not limited to services  
22 provided to or obtained for such person in order to prevent or  
23 remedy the abuse, neglect, or exploitation of such person;

1           2. "Services which are necessary to aid an individual to meet  
2 essential requirements for mental or physical health and safety"  
3 include, but shall not be limited to:

- 4           a. the identification of vulnerable adults in need of the  
5                services,
- 6           b. the provision of medical care for physical and mental  
7                health needs,
- 8           c. the provision of social services assistance in  
9                personal hygiene, food, clothing, and adequately  
10              heated and ventilated shelter,
- 11           d. protection from health and safety hazards,
- 12           e. protection from physical mistreatment,
- 13           f. guardianship referral,
- 14           g. outreach programs, and
- 15           h. the transportation necessary to secure any of such  
16              services.

17 The term shall not include taking the person into physical custody  
18 without the consent of the person except as provided for in Sections  
19 10-107 and 10-108 of this title, and the evaluation, monitoring, and  
20 provision of protective placements;

21           3. "Meet essential requirements for mental or physical health  
22 and safety" means those actions necessary to provide the health  
23 care, food, shelter, clothing, personal hygiene and other care  
24

1 without which physical injury or illness to the vulnerable adult is  
2 likely to occur;

3 4. "Incapacitated person" means:

4 a. any person eighteen (18) years of age or older:

5 (1) who is impaired by reason of mental or physical  
6 illness or disability, dementia or related  
7 disease, mental retardation, developmental  
8 disability or other cause, and

9 (2) whose ability to receive and evaluate information  
10 effectively or to make and to communicate  
11 responsible decisions is impaired to such an  
12 extent that such person lacks the capacity to  
13 manage his or her financial resources or to meet  
14 essential requirements for his or her mental or  
15 physical health or safety without assistance from  
16 others, or

17 b. a person for whom a guardian, limited guardian, or  
18 conservator has been appointed pursuant to the  
19 Oklahoma Guardianship and Conservatorship Act;

20 5. "Vulnerable adult" means an individual who is an  
21 incapacitated person or who, because of physical or mental  
22 disability, including persons with Alzheimer's disease or other  
23 dementias, incapacity, or other disability, is substantially  
24 impaired in the ability to provide adequately for the care or

1 custody of himself or herself, or is unable to manage his or her  
2 property and financial affairs effectively, or to meet essential  
3 requirements for mental or physical health or safety, or to protect  
4 himself or herself from abuse, verbal abuse, neglect, or  
5 exploitation without assistance from others;

6 6. "Caretaker" means a person who has:

7 a. the responsibility for the care of a vulnerable adult  
8 or the financial management of the resources of a  
9 vulnerable adult as a result of a family relationship,

10 b. assumed the responsibility for the care of a  
11 vulnerable adult voluntarily, by contract, or as a  
12 result of the ties of friendship, or

13 c. been appointed a guardian, limited guardian, or  
14 conservator pursuant to the Oklahoma Guardianship and  
15 Conservatorship Act;

16 7. "Department" means the Department of Human Services;

17 8. "Abuse" means causing or permitting:

18 a. the infliction of physical pain, injury, sexual abuse,  
19 sexual exploitation, unreasonable restraint or  
20 confinement, or mental anguish, or

21 b. the deprivation of nutrition, clothing, shelter,  
22 health care, or other care or services without which  
23 serious physical or mental injury is likely to occur

24

1 to a vulnerable adult by a caretaker or other person  
2 providing services to a vulnerable adult;

3 9. "Exploitation" or "exploit" means an unjust or improper use  
4 of the resources of a vulnerable adult for the profit or advantage,  
5 pecuniary or otherwise, of a person other than the vulnerable adult  
6 through the use of undue influence, coercion, harassment, duress,  
7 deception, false representation or false pretense;

8 10. "Financial neglect" means repeated instances by a  
9 caretaker, or other person, who has assumed the role of financial  
10 management, of failure to use the resources available to restore or  
11 maintain the health and physical well-being of a vulnerable adult,  
12 including, but not limited to:

- 13 a. squandering or negligently mismanaging the money,  
14 property, or accounts of a vulnerable adult,
- 15 b. refusing to pay for necessities or utilities in a  
16 timely manner, or
- 17 c. providing substandard care to a vulnerable adult  
18 despite the availability of adequate financial  
19 resources;

20 11. "Neglect" means:

- 21 a. the failure to provide protection for a vulnerable  
22 adult who is unable to protect his or her own  
23 interest,

- 1           b.    the failure to provide a vulnerable adult with  
2                   adequate shelter, nutrition, health care, or clothing,  
3                   or  
4           c.    negligent acts or omissions that result in harm or the  
5                   unreasonable risk of harm to a vulnerable adult  
6                   through the action, inaction, or lack of supervision  
7                   by a caretaker providing direct services;

8    12.   "Sexual abuse" means:

- 9           a.    oral, anal, or vaginal penetration of a vulnerable  
10                   adult by or through the union with the sexual organ of  
11                   a caretaker or other person providing services to the  
12                   vulnerable adult, or the anal or vaginal penetration  
13                   of a vulnerable adult by a caretaker or other person  
14                   providing services to the vulnerable adult with any  
15                   other object, or  
16           b.    for the purpose of sexual gratification, the touching,  
17                   feeling or observation of the body or private parts of  
18                   a vulnerable adult by a caretaker or other person  
19                   providing services to the vulnerable adult, or  
20           c.    indecent exposure by a caretaker or other person  
21                   providing services to the vulnerable adult;

22    13.   "Indecent exposure" means forcing or requiring a vulnerable  
23    adult to:  
24

1 a. look upon the body or private parts of another person  
2 or upon sexual acts performed in the presence of the  
3 vulnerable adult, or

4 b. touch or feel the body or private parts of another;

5 14. "Self-neglect" means the action or inaction of a vulnerable  
6 adult which causes that person to fail to meet the essential  
7 requirements for physical or mental health and safety due to the  
8 vulnerable adult's lack of awareness, incompetence or incapacity;

9 15. "Sexual exploitation" includes, but is not limited to, a  
10 caretaker's causing, allowing, permitting or encouraging a  
11 vulnerable adult to engage in prostitution or in the lewd, obscene,  
12 or pornographic photographing, filming or depiction of the  
13 vulnerable adult as those acts are defined by state law; and

14 16. "Verbal abuse" means the use of words, sounds, or other  
15 communication including, but not limited to, gestures, actions or  
16 behaviors, by a caretaker or other person providing services to a  
17 vulnerable adult that are likely to cause a reasonable person to  
18 experience humiliation, intimidation, fear, shame or degradation.

19 B. Nothing in this section shall be construed to mean a  
20 vulnerable adult is abused or neglected for the sole reason the  
21 vulnerable adult, in good faith, selects and depends upon spiritual  
22 means alone through prayer, in accordance with the practices of a  
23 recognized religious method of healing, for the treatment or cure of  
24 disease or remedial care, or a caretaker or other person

1 responsible, in good faith, is furnishing such vulnerable adult  
2 spiritual means alone through prayer, in accordance with the tenets  
3 and practices of a recognized church or religious denomination, for  
4 the treatment or cure of disease or remedial care in accordance with  
5 the practices of or express consent of the vulnerable adult.

6 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2016.
