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11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
12	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 567.3a, as
13	amended by Section 1, Chapter 281, O.S.L. 2017 (59 O.S. Supp. 2017,
14	Section 567.3a), is amended to read as follows:
15	Section 567.3a. As used in the Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act:
16	1. "Board" means the Oklahoma Board of Nursing;
17	2. "The practice of nursing" means the performance of services
18	provided for purposes of nursing diagnosis and treatment of human
19	responses to actual or potential health problems consistent with
20	educational preparation. Knowledge and skill are the basis for
21	assessment, analysis, planning, intervention, and evaluation used in
22	the promotion and maintenance of health and nursing management of
23	illness, injury, infirmity, restoration or optimal function, or
24	death with dignity. Practice is based on understanding the human

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1	condition acro	ss the human lifespan and understanding the
2	relationship o	f the individual within the environment. This
3	practice inclu	des execution of the medical regime including the
4	administration	of medications and treatments prescribed by any
5	person authori	zed by state law to so prescribe;

1 who has acquired advanced clinical knowledge and с. 2 skills in preparation for providing both direct and 3 indirect care to patients; however, the defining factor for all Advanced Practice Registered Nurses is 4 5 that a significant component of the education and practice focuses on direct care of individuals, 6 d. whose practice builds on the competencies of 7 Registered Nurses by demonstrating a greater depth and 8 9 breadth of knowledge, a greater synthesis of data, and increased complexity of skills and interventions, and 10 11 e. who has obtained a license as an Advanced Practice 12 Registered Nurse in one of the following roles: Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist, Certified 13 Nurse-Midwife, Clinical Nurse Specialist, or Certified 14 15 Nurse Practitioner.

16 Only those persons who hold a license to practice advanced practice registered nursing in this state shall have the right to 17 use the title "Advanced Practice Registered Nurse" and to use the 18 abbreviation "APRN". Only those persons who have obtained a license 19 in the following disciplines shall have the right to fulfill the 20 21 roles and use the applicable titles: Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist and the abbreviation "CRNA", Certified Nurse-Midwife and 2.2 the abbreviation "CNM", Clinical Nurse Specialist and the 23

1 abbreviation "CNS", and Certified Nurse Practitioner and the 2 abbreviation "CNP".

3 It shall be unlawful for any person to assume the role or use 4 the title Advanced Practice Registered Nurse or use the abbreviation 5 "APRN" or use the respective specialty role titles and abbreviations or to use any other titles or abbreviations that would reasonably 6 lead a person to believe the user is an Advanced Practice Registered 7 Nurse, unless permitted by this act the Oklahoma Nursing Practice 8 9 Act. Any individual doing so shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, 10 which shall be punishable, upon conviction, by imprisonment in the 11 county jail for not more than one (1) year or by a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than One Thousand 12 13 Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by both such imprisonment and fine for each offense; 14

15 6. "Certified Nurse Practitioner" is an Advanced Practice
16 Registered Nurse who performs in an expanded role in the delivery of
17 health care:

18	a.	consistent with advanced educational preparation as a
19		Certified Nurse Practitioner in an area of specialty,
20	b.	functions within the Certified Nurse Practitioner
21		scope of practice for the selected area of
22		specialization, and
23		

c. is in accord with the standards for Certified Nurse
 Practitioners as identified by the certifying body and
 approved by the Board.

A Certified Nurse Practitioner shall be eligible, in accordance 4 5 with the scope of practice of the Certified Nurse Practitioner, to obtain recognition as authorized by the Board to prescribe, as 6 defined by the rules promulgated by the Board pursuant to this 7 section and subject to the medical direction of a supervising 8 9 physician. This authorization shall not include dispensing drugs, 10 but shall not preclude, subject to federal regulations, the receipt 11 of, the signing for, or the dispensing of professional samples to 12 patients.

The Certified Nurse Practitioner accepts responsibility, accountability, and obligation to practice in accordance with usual and customary advanced practice registered nursing standards and functions as defined by the scope of practice/role definition statements for the Certified Nurse Practitioner;

18 7. a. "Clinical Nurse Specialist" is an Advanced Practice
 19 Registered Nurse who holds:

- (1) a master's degree or higher in nursing with
 clinical specialization preparation to function
 in an expanded role,
- (2) specialty certification from a national
 certifying organization recognized by the Board,

(3) an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse license from the Board, and

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- (4) any nurse holding a specialty certification as a Clinical Nurse Specialist valid on January 1, 1994, granted by a national certifying organization recognized by the Board, shall be deemed to be a Clinical Nurse Specialist under the provisions of the Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act.
- b. In the expanded role, the Clinical Nurse Specialist
 performs at an advanced practice level which shall
 include, but not be limited to:
- (1) practicing as an expert clinician in the
 provision of direct nursing care to a selected
 population of patients or clients in any setting,
 including private practice,
 - (2) managing the care of patients or clients with complex nursing problems,
- enhancing patient or client care by integrating
 the competencies of clinical practice, education,
 consultation, and research, and
- (4) referring patients or clients to other services.
 c. A Clinical Nurse Specialist in accordance with the
 scope of practice of such Clinical Nurse Specialist

1 shall be eligible to obtain recognition as authorized 2 by the Board to prescribe, as defined by the rules 3 promulgated by the Board pursuant to this section, and subject to the medical direction of a supervising 4 5 physician. This authorization shall not include dispensing drugs, but shall not preclude, subject to 6 federal regulations, the receipt of, the signing for, 7 or the dispensing of professional samples to patients. 8 9 d. The Clinical Nurse Specialist accepts responsibility, accountability, and obligation to practice in 10 11 accordance with usual and customary advanced practice 12 nursing standards and functions as defined by the scope of practice/role definition statements for the 13 Clinical Nurse Specialist; 14

15 8. "Nurse-Midwife" is a nurse who has received an Advanced
16 Practice Registered Nurse license from the Oklahoma Board of Nursing
17 who possesses evidence of certification according to the
18 requirements of the American College of Nurse-Midwives.

A Certified Nurse-Midwife in accordance with the scope of practice of such Certified Nurse-Midwife shall be eligible to obtain recognition as authorized by the Board to prescribe, as defined by the rules promulgated by the Board pursuant to this section and subject to the medical direction of a supervising physician. This authorization shall not include the dispensing of drugs, but shall

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 signing for, or the dispensing of professional samples to patients.

The Certified Nurse-Midwife accepts responsibility, accountability, and obligation to practice in accordance with usual and customary advanced practice registered nursing standards and functions as defined by the scope of practice/role definition statements for the Certified Nurse-Midwife;

9. "Nurse-midwifery practice" means providing management of 8 9 care of normal newborns and women, antepartally, intrapartally, 10 postpartally and gynecologically, occurring within a health care 11 system which provides for medical consultation, medical management 12 or referral, and is in accord with the standards for nurse-midwifery practice as defined by the American College of Nurse-Midwives; 13 10. "Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist" is an 14 a. 15 Advanced Practice Registered Nurse who: (1) is certified by the National Board of 16 Certification and Recertification for Nurse 17 Anesthetists as a Certified Registered Nurse 18 Anesthetist within one (1) year following 19 completion of an approved certified registered 20 nurse anesthetist education program, and 21 continues to maintain such recertification by the 2.2 National Board of Certification and 23 Recertification for Nurse Anesthetists, and 24

- 1 (2) administers anesthesia under the supervision of a 2 medical doctor, an osteopathic physician, a 3 podiatric physician or a dentist licensed in this 4 state and under conditions in which timely onsite 5 consultation by such doctor, osteopath, podiatric 6 physician or dentist is available.
- b. A Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist, under the 7 supervision of a medical doctor, osteopathic 8 9 physician, podiatric physician or dentist licensed in this state, and under conditions in which timely, on-10 11 site consultation by such medical doctor, osteopathic 12 physician, podiatric physician or dentist is available, shall be authorized, pursuant to rules 13 adopted by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing, to order, 14 15 select, obtain and administer legend drugs, Schedules II through V controlled substances, devices, and 16 medical gases only when engaged in the preanesthetic 17 preparation and evaluation; anesthesia induction, 18 maintenance and emergence; and postanesthesia care. A 19 Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist may order, 20 select, obtain and administer drugs only during the 21 perioperative or periobstetrical period. 2.2
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c. A Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist who applies
 for authorization to order, select, obtain and
 administer drugs shall:

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- be currently recognized as a Certified Registered
 Nurse Anesthetist in this state,
- 6 (2) provide evidence of completion, within the two-7 year period immediately preceding the date of 8 application, of a minimum of fifteen (15) units 9 of continuing education in advanced pharmacology 10 related to the administration of anesthesia as 11 recognized by the National Board of Certification 12 and Recertification for Nurse Anesthetists, and
- 13 (3) complete and submit a notarized application, on a
 14 form prescribed by the Board, accompanied by the
 15 application fee established pursuant to this
 16 section.
- 17 d. The authority to order, select, obtain and administer
 18 drugs shall be terminated if a Certified Registered
 19 Nurse Anesthetist has:
- 20 (1) ordered, selected, obtained or administered drugs
 21 outside of the Certified Registered Nurse
 22 Anesthetist scope of practice or ordered,
 23 selected, obtained or administered drugs for
 24 other than therapeutic purposes, or

1		(2) violated any provision of state laws or rules or
2		federal laws or regulations pertaining to the
3		practice of nursing or the authority to order,
4		select, obtain and administer drugs.
5	e.	The Oklahoma Board of Nursing shall notify the Board
6		of Pharmacy after termination of or a change in the
7		authority to order, select, obtain and administer
8		drugs for a Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist.
9	f.	The Board shall provide by rule for biennial
10		application renewal and reauthorization of authority
11		to order, select, obtain and administer drugs for
12		Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists. At the time
13		of application renewal, a Certified Registered Nurse
14		Anesthetist shall submit documentation of a minimum of
15		eight (8) units of continuing education, completed
16		during the previous two (2) years, in advanced
17		pharmacology relating to the administration of
18		anesthesia, as recognized by the Council on
19		Recertification of Nurse Anesthetists or the Council
20		on Certification of Nurse Anesthetists.
21	g.	This paragraph shall not prohibit the administration
22		of local or topical anesthetics as now permitted by
23		law. Provided further, nothing in this paragraph

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shall limit the authority of the Board of Dentistry to

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establish the qualifications for dentists who direct the administration of anesthesia;

3 "Supervising physician" means an individual holding a 11. current license to practice as a physician from the State Board of 4 5 Medical Licensure and Supervision or the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners, who supervises a Certified Nurse Practitioner, a Clinical 6 Nurse Specialist, or a Certified Nurse-Midwife, and who is not in 7 training as an intern, resident, or fellow. To be eligible to 8 9 supervise such Advanced Practice Registered Nurse, such physician 10 shall remain in compliance with the rules promulgated by the State 11 Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision or the State Board of 12 Osteopathic Examiners;

12. "Supervision of an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse with 13 prescriptive authority" means overseeing and accepting 14 15 responsibility for the ordering and transmission by a Certified Nurse Practitioner, a Clinical Nurse Specialist, or a Certified 16 Nurse-Midwife of written, telephonic, electronic or oral 17 prescriptions for drugs and other medical supplies, subject to a 18 defined formulary, and shall not include any financial arrangement 19 in which the physician accepts monetary payment in exchange for 20 supervision; and 21

13. "Advanced Unlicensed Assistant" means any person who has
successfully completed a certified training program approved by the
Board that trains the Advanced Unlicensed Assistant to perform

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1	specified technical skills identified by the Board in acute care
2	settings under the direction and supervision of the Registered Nurse
3	or Licensed Practical Nurse.
