6	An Act relating to higher education accreditation; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 4103, which relates to

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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 4103, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	Section 4103. A A. As used in this section:
17	1. "Degree-granting institution" means an institution that
18	offers education leading to an associate's degree or higher; and
19	2. "Non-degree-granting activity" means offering education or
20	training that does not lead to an associate's degree or higher.
21	B. All private educational institution and out-of-state public
22	degree-granting institutions shall be accredited under rules
23	promulgated and adopted by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
24	Education unless such institution is accredited by a national or

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    regional accrediting agency which is recognized by the Secretary of
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    the United States Department of Education as a reliable authority as
    to the quality of education or training offered by institutions of
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    higher education for the purposes of the Higher Education Act of
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    1965, as amended. To operate as a degree-granting institution,
    private institutions that do not participate in the Oklahoma Tuition
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    Equalization Grant program and out-of-state public institutions
    shall abide by policies and procedures that are established by the
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    Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education. The policies and
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    procedures shall include a complaint process provision, standards
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    for operation, stipulations for a written enrollment agreement
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    between the institution and the student and reporting requirements.
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    Private institutions not participating in the Oklahoma Tuition
    Equalization Grant program that engage in non-degree-granting
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    activity and out-of-state public institutions that engage in non-
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    degree-granting activity shall be subject to standards administered
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    by the Oklahoma Board of Private Vocational Schools. If an
    institution, as described in this section, engages in both degree-
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    granting and non-degree-granting activity, the Oklahoma State
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    Regents for Higher Education shall be the lead agency for all degree
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    matters, and the Oklahoma Board of Private Vocational Schools shall
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    be the lead agency for all non-degree matters.
