Supp. 2017, Section 11-902a), is hereby repealed. 16 SECTION 2. A new section of law to be codified 17 NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-902e of Title 47, unless 18 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 19 A. No person shall knowingly authorize or permit a motor 20 vehicle owned or under the control of that person which is not 21 equipped with an ignition interlock device to be driven upon any 22 street or highway of this state by any person who is required to 23 have an ignition interlock device installed upon the vehicle of that

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- person. A violation of this subsection shall be a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
 - B. No person shall willfully attempt to interfere in any way with the intended and proper functioning of an ignition interlock device installed in a vehicle as required by law, or intentionally fail to return an ignition interlock device when it is no longer required in the vehicle or upon request by the owner of the device. A violation of this subsection shall be a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
 - C. No person granted permission to drive a motor vehicle on the condition of installation of an ignition interlock device shall drive any vehicle that is not equipped with an ignition interlock device unless driving an employer's vehicle in accordance with Section 10 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1164 of the 2nd Session of the 56th Oklahoma Legislature or subsection A of Section 2 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1163 of the 2nd Session of the 56th Oklahoma Legislature. A violation of this subsection shall be a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
