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8	An Act relating to private education; amending Section 2, Chapter 276, O.S.L. 2014 (70 O.S. Supp.
9	2019, Section 21-101.1), which relates to entities that are exempt from licensing by the Oklahoma Board
10	of Private Vocational Schools; adding certain
11	exempted entities; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 2, Chapter 276, O.S.L.
16	2014 (70 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 21-101.1), is amended to read as
17	follows:
18	Section 21-101.1. The term "private school" shall not include
19	the following which are exempt from licensing by the Oklahoma Board
20	of Private Vocational Schools:
21	1. Barber schools, beauty schools or other schools which are
22	exclusively regulated or licensed pursuant to the provisions of any
23	school-licensing law of this state, although such school may choose
24	to apply to secure a license for state authorization from the Board;

Any form of flight instruction subject to regulations 2 promulgated by the Federal Aviation Administration; 3 Parochial, private or other nonpublic schools offering 3. programs of general education accredited or approved by the State 4 5 Board of Education, the State Board of Career and Technology Education or the State Regents for Higher Education; 6 7 4. Education or training, as approved by the Board, provided 8 and paid for by: 9 an employer for its own employees, a. b. a professional organization, as approved by the Board, 10 11 for its members, a parochial, denominational, eleemosynary school or 12 с. institution, which is sectarian in nature and uniquely 13 useful for and intrinsic to the propagation of a faith 14 15 or the pursuit of the mission of the school or institution as approved by the Board, or 16 d. an entity supported by taxation of a local or state 17 source; 18 5. Education or training, as approved by the Board, which 19 offers instruction solely in the field of an avocation, hobby, 20 recreation or entertainment, as approved by the Board; 21 6. Professional prelicensing programs or continuing education 22 programs when an alternate state agency maintains complete authority 23 or jurisdiction over the right to offer or certify such a program, 24

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1 regardless if the other agency mandates the subject matter of the 2 program;

7. Postgraduate certificates offered or provided by a school
4 that has approval for that specific program issued by another state
5 agency or an accrediting agency approved by the Board;

8. If a private school combines training or education that is 6 both licensed and not licensed by another state agency, licensing by 7 the Board will be required for the entity's combined programs. 8 9 However, the Board will defer to the other state agency on matters 10 contained in the other agency's regulations and will refrain from 11 establishing conflicting requirements. Matters to be governed by 12 the other state agency may include but are not limited to curriculum, testing or certification completion. The Board may 13 require a private school to document its approval by any other state 14 agency or an accrediting organization; and 15

16 9. Seminars or workshops offered by an entity that:

a. is not primarily in the business of providing programsof instruction,

- b. provides instruction to advance the personal
 development or general, transferable skills of a
 participant, and
- c. offers aggregate clock or contact hours of no more
 than twenty-four (24) clock or defined contact hours
 per calendar quarter of the calendar year;

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1	10. An entity that offers only a degree(s) and has and
2	maintains proper approval by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
3	Education; and
4	11. An entity that is based outside of Oklahoma, maintains
5	regional or national accreditation by an accrediting organization
6	approved by the U.S. Department of Education, does not offer degrees
7	and provides all of its training through mechanism(s) of distance
8	education.
9	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2020.
10	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
11	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
12	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
13	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
