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1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

2 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 11 O.S. 2021, Section 50-111.3, is 3 amended to read as follows:

4 Section 50-111.3 A. In lieu of terminating employment and 5 accepting a service retirement pension pursuant to Section 50-114 of this title, any member of the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement 6 7 System who has not less than twenty (20) years of creditable service and who is eligible to receive a service retirement pension may make 8 9 an irrevocable election to participate in the Oklahoma Police 10 Deferred Option Plan and defer the receipts of benefits in 11 accordance with the provisions of this section.

B. For purposes of this section, creditable service shall
include service credit reciprocally recognized pursuant to Section
50-101 et seq. of this title but for eligibility purposes only.

15 C. The duration of participation in the Oklahoma Police 16 Deferred Option Plan for a member shall not exceed five (5) years. 17 Participation in the Oklahoma Police Deferred Option Plan must begin 18 the first day of a month and end on the last day of a month. At the 19 conclusion of a member's participation in the Oklahoma Police 20 Deferred Option Plan, the member shall terminate employment with all 21 participating municipalities as an officer, and shall start 22 receiving the member's accrued monthly retirement benefit from the 23 System. Such a member may receive in-service distributions of such 24 member's accrued monthly retirement benefit from the System if such

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1 member is reemployed by a participating municipality only if such 2 reemployment is as a police chief or in a position not covered under 3 the System.

When a member begins participation in the Oklahoma Police 4 D. 5 Deferred Option Plan, the contribution of the employee shall cease. The employer contributions shall continue to be paid in accordance 6 7 with Section 50-109 of this title. Municipal contributions for employees who elect the Oklahoma Police Deferred Option Plan shall 8 9 be credited equally to the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System and to the Oklahoma Police Deferred Option Plan. The monthly 10 11 retirement benefits that would have been payable had the member 12 elected to cease employment and receive a service retirement shall 13 be paid into the Oklahoma Police Deferred Option Plan account.

14 E. 1. A member who participates in this plan shall be eligible15 to receive cost of living increases.

16 2. A member who participates in this plan shall earn interest 17 at a rate of two percentage points below the rate of return of the 18 investment portfolio of the System, but no less than the actuarial 19 assumed interest rate as certified by the actuary in the yearly 20 evaluation report of the actuary seven and one-half percent (7.5%) 21 interest effective July 1, 2022. The interest shall be credited to 22 the individual account balance of the member on an annual basis. 23 F. A participant in the Oklahoma Police Deferred Option Plan 24 shall receive, at the option of the participant:

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A lump sum payment from the account equal to the option
 account balance of the participant, payable to the participant;
 A lump sum payment from the account equal to the option
 account balance of the participant, payable to the annuity provider
 which shall be selected by the participant as a result of the
 research and investigation of the participant; or

3. Any other method of payment if approved by the State Board.
Notwithstanding any other provision contained herein to the
contrary, commencement of distributions under the Oklahoma Police
Deferred Option Plan shall be no later than the time as set forth in
subsection C of Section 50-114 of this title.

12 G. If the participant dies during the period of participation 13 in the Oklahoma Police Deferred Option Plan, a lump sum payment 14 equal to the account balance of the participant shall be paid to the 15 recipients, which may include a trust, properly designated in 16 writing by the participant or, if none, to the surviving spouse who 17 was married to the participant for the thirty (30) continuous months 18 immediately preceding the death of the participant; provided, a 19 surviving spouse of a participant who died in, and as a consequence 20 of, the performance of the participant's duty for a participating 21 municipality shall not be subject to the thirty-month marriage 22 requirement for survivor benefits or, if no surviving spouse, to the 23 estate of the participant.

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H. In lieu of participating in the Oklahoma Police Deferred
Option Plan pursuant to subsections A, B, C, D, E, and F of this
section, a member may make an irrevocable election to participate in
the Oklahoma Police Deferred Option Plan pursuant to this subsection
as follows:

6 1. For purposes of this subsection, the following definitions7 shall apply:

a. "back drop date" means the date selected by the
9 member, which is up to five (5) years before the
10 member elects to participate in the Oklahoma Police
11 Deferred Option Plan, but not before the date at which
12 the member completes twenty (20) years of credited
13 service,

14 b. "termination date" means the date the member elects to 15 participate in the Oklahoma Police Deferred Option 16 Plan pursuant to this subsection, and the date the 17 member terminates employment with all participating 18 municipalities as an active police officer, such 19 termination has at all times included reemployment of 20 a member by a participating municipality only if such 21 reemployment is as a police chief or in a position not 22 covered under the System,

c. "earlier attained credited service" means the credited
 service earned by a member as of the back drop date,

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and earlier attained credited service cannot be	
reduced to less than twenty (20) years of credite	d
service, and	

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"deferred benefit balance" means all monthly 4 d. 5 retirement benefits that would have been payable had the member elected to cease employment on the back 6 7 drop date and receive a service retirement from the back drop date to the termination date, all of the 8 9 member's contributions and one-half (1/2) of the employer contributions from the back drop date to the 10 11 termination date, with interest based on how the 12 benefit would have accumulated as if the member had 13 participated in the Oklahoma Police Deferred Option 14 Plan pursuant to subsections A, B, C, D, and E of this 15 section from the back drop date to the termination 16 date;

17 2. At the termination date, the monthly pension benefit shall 18 be determined based on earlier attained credited service and on the 19 final average salary as of the back drop date. The member's 20 individual deferred option account shall be credited with an amount 21 equal to the deferred benefit balance; the member shall terminate 22 employment with all participating municipalities as a police officer 23 and shall start receiving the member's accrued monthly retirement 24 benefit from the System. The provisions of subsections B, C, E, F,

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and G of this section shall apply to this subsection. A member shall not participate in the Oklahoma Police Deferred Option Plan pursuant to this subsection if the member has elected to participate in the Oklahoma Police Deferred Option Plan pursuant to subsections A, B, C, D, E, and F of this section; and

3. If a member who has not less than twenty (20) years of 6 creditable service and who is eligible to receive a service 7 retirement pension dies prior to terminating employment, the 8 9 surviving spouse shall be eligible to elect to receive a benefit 10 determined as if the member had elected to participate in the 11 Oklahoma Police Deferred Option Plan in accordance with this subsection on the day immediately preceding the death. The 12 13 surviving spouse must have been married to the member for the thirty 14 (30) continuous months preceding the member's death; provided, the 15 surviving spouse of a member who died while in, and as a consequence 16 of, the performance of the member's duty for a participating 17 municipality shall not be subject to the thirty-month marriage 18 requirement for this election.

19SECTION 2.AMENDATORY11 O.S. 2021, Section 50-112, is20amended to read as follows:

Section 50-112. A. All persons employed as full-time duly appointed or elected officers who are paid for working more than twenty-five (25) hours per week or any person hired by a participating municipality who is undergoing police training to

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1 become a permanent police officer of the municipality shall participate in the System upon initial employment with a police 2 department of a participating municipality. All such persons shall 3 submit to a physical-medical examination pertaining to sight, 4 5 hearing, agility and other conditions the requirements of which shall be established by the State Board. The person shall be 6 7 required to complete this physical-medical examination prior to the beginning of actual employment. This examination shall identify any 8 9 preexisting conditions. Except as otherwise provided in this 10 section, a police officer shall be not less than twenty-one (21) nor 11 more than forty-five (45) years of age when accepted for membership in the System. However, if a municipality should be found to be in 12 13 noncompliance with the provisions of Article 50 of this title, as 14 determined by the State Board, then any current full-time active 15 police officer employed by a municipality as of July 1, 2001, shall 16 not be denied eligibility to participate in the Oklahoma Police 17 Pension and Retirement System solely due to age. The State Board 18 shall have authority to deny or revoke membership of any person 19 submitting false information in such person's membership 20 application. The State Board shall have final authority in 21 determining eligibility for membership in the System, pursuant to 22 the provisions of this article.

B. The police chief of any participating municipality may be
exempt from membership in the System or may become a member provided

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1 the member is not a retired member and the requirements of this
2 section are met at the time of employment.

C. A member of the System who has attained his or her normal 3 4 retirement date may, if the member so elects, agree to terminate 5 employment and retire as a member of the System and make an election to receive distributions from the System. If a retired member is 6 7 reemployed by a participating municipality in the position of police chief or in a position which is not covered by the System, 8 9 retirement shall include receipt by such retired member of in-10 service distributions from the System.

11 A former member of the System who terminates from covered D. 12 employment and who has neither retired from the System nor entered 13 the Oklahoma Police Deferred Option Plan and is later employed in a 14 covered position with a participating municipality shall not be 15 denied eligibility to become a member of the System because he or 16 she is forty-five (45) years of age or older. If such member has 17 withdrawn his or her contributions prior to re-entering the System 18 and the member desires to receive credit for such prior service, 19 then the member shall pay back such contributions and interest 20 pursuant to Section 50-111.1 of this title.

E. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a municipality that employs two (2) or fewer full-time police officers with a population of four thousand five hundred (4,500) or less, according to the latest Federal Decennial Census, may employ a

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1 police officer retired police officers who is are more than forty-2 five (45) years of age and who has never have participated in the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System, but such police 3 4 officer and are receiving retirement benefits. Such officers shall 5 not be eligible to reenter and participate in the System. Such police officer shall be counted in the limitation imposed by this 6 subsection. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, the State 7 Board shall be granted access to information concerning a list of 8 9 actively working police officers within the municipalities and agencies under the purview provided by the Council on Law 10 11 Enforcement Education and Training.

12 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 50-112.1 of Title 11, unless 14 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

15 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any person who is 16 receiving retirement benefits from a state pension system may be 17 hired by a municipality with a population of four thousand five 18 hundred (4,500) or less, according to the latest Federal Decennial 19 Census, to fulfill the duties and obligations of a police officer. 20 Such persons shall not be subject to the requirements and 21 obligations of the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System and 22 shall not be eligible to enter into the System. A municipality, as 23 described by the provisions of this section, shall be required to 24 pay the employee contribution of eight percent (8%) to the Oklahoma

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1	Police Pension and Retirement System, as prescribed by Section 50-
2	110 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes, with respect to the
3	compensation paid only to retirees who retired from the Oklahoma
4	Police Pension and Retirement System.
5	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2022.
6	SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
7	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
8	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
9	be in full force from and after its passage and approval."

However, if a municipality should be found to be in 7 noncompliance with the provisions of Article 50 of this title, as 8 9 determined by the State Board, then any current full-time active police officer employed by a municipality as of July 1, 2001, shall 10 not be denied eligibility to participate in the Oklahoma Police 11 Pension and Retirement System solely due to age. The State Board 12 13 shall have authority to deny or revoke membership of any person submitting false information in such person's membership 14 application. The State Board shall have final authority in 15 determining eligibility for membership in the System, pursuant to 16 the provisions of this article. 17

B. The police chief of any participating municipality may be exempt from membership in the System or may become a member provided the member is not a retired member and the requirements of this section are met at the time of employment.

C. A member of the System who has attained his or her normal retirement date may, if the member so elects, agree to terminate employment and retire as a member of the System and make an election

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to receive distributions from the System. If a retired member is reemployed by a participating municipality in the position of police chief or in a position which is not covered by the System, retirement shall include receipt by such retired member of inservice distributions from the System.

D. A former member of the System who terminates from covered 6 employment and who has neither retired from the System nor entered 7 the Oklahoma Police Deferred Option Plan and is later employed in a 8 9 covered position with a participating municipality shall not be 10 denied eligibility to become a member of the System because he or she is forty-five (45) years of age or older. If such member has 11 withdrawn his or her contributions prior to re-entering the System 12 and the member desires to receive credit for such prior service, 13 then the member shall pay back such contributions and interest 14 pursuant to Section 50-111.1 of this title. 15

Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, 16 Ε. a municipality that employs two (2) or fewer full-time police 17 officers with a population of four thousand five hundred (4,500) or 18 less, according to the latest Federal Decennial Census, may employ a 19 police officer retired police officers who is are more than forty-20 five (45) years of age and who has never have participated in the 21 Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System, and are receiving 22 retirement benefits. but such police officer Such officers shall 23 not be eligible to reenter and participate in the System. Such 24

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police officer shall be counted in the limitation imposed by this
subsection. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, the State
Board shall be granted access to information concerning a list of
actively working police officers within the municipalities and
agencies under the purview provided by the Council on Law
Enforcement Education and Training.

SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 112.1 of Title 11, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

10 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any person who is receiving retirement benefits from a state pension system may be 11 12 hired by a municipality with a population of four thousand five 13 hundred (4,500) or less, according to the latest Federal Decennial Census, to fulfill the duties and obligations of a police officer. 14 Such persons shall not be subject to the requirements and 15 obligations of the Oklahoma Police Pension Retirement System and 16 17 shall not be eligible to enter into the System.
