ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 1193

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An Act relating to the Electric Vehicle Revenue Solutions Task Force; creating task force; stating purpose; stating membership; requiring appointments by certain date; providing for staffing and travel reimbursement; providing for administrative support; requiring report by certain date; providing for noncodification; and declaring an emergency.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

A. There is hereby created until January 1, 2021, the "Electric Vehicle Revenue Solutions Task Force" for the purpose of studying and evaluating a revenue solution for electric vehicles and their impacts on Oklahoma roads. Specifically, the task force shall study an alternative to the state motor fuel tax for Oklahoma citizens, and, most importantly, how to collect road use revenue for electrified vehicles traveling or staying in our state, but not registered in our state. A primary objective of this task force must be to develop a revenue model that does not require Oklahoma citizens to carry the financial burden for road revenues currently

- paid through fuel taxes by vehicles not registered in Oklahoma, as these vehicles are replaced by electric vehicles. The task force shall also address any other pertinent issues it deems necessary to
- B. The Electric Vehicle Revenue Solutions Task Force shall consist of eleven (11) members, as follows:

carry out the scope of such projects.

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- 1. The Secretary of Transportation, or a designee;
- 2. A representative from the Association of Central Oklahoma Governments;
- 3. A representative from the Indian Nation Council of Governments;
- 4. A representative from a transportation advocacy group appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate;
- 5. A representative from a transportation advocacy group appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
 - 6. Three members of the Senate, appointed by the President Pro
 Tempore of the Senate; and
- 7. Three members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 20 Any vacancy on the task force shall be filled in the same manner 21 as the original appointment.
- The President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the
 House of Representatives shall each designate one of the legislative
 members appointed to the task force to serve as cochair.

Appointments made pursuant to this section shall be finalized no later than July 1, 2020.

The cochair shall convene the first meeting of the task force. The task force shall meet as often as it deems necessary. Members of the task force shall serve without compensation. Legislative members of the task force shall be reimbursed for their necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with Section 456 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

Administrative support for the task force shall be provided by the Department of Transportation to be supplemented, if necessary, by the staff of the Senate and the House of Representatives. All participating state agencies shall provide for any administrative support as requested by the task force.

C. The task force shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Oklahoma Transportation Commission on or before January 1, 2021. The report shall be prepared by the staff of the Department of Transportation.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
