L5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
L 6	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
L7	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9090 of Title 74, unless there
L 8	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
L 9	A. Any electric utility that is regulated by the Corporation
20	Commission and that utilizes or operates natural gas or coal
21	generators shall follow weather systems for the purpose of winter
22	storm prediction. In the event of a predicted severe winter storm
23	warning, as defined by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric
24	Administration National Weather Service, the electric utility shall

1	ensure the in-service baseload generators are cycling in spinning
2	reserve and the fuel sources are thawed and winterized. The in-
3	service generators shall be placed online at least three (3) days
4	prior to the predicted arrival of the severe winter storm, to
5	replace the capacity of renewable failures, notwithstanding whether
6	the storm occurs. The electricity generated by placing the natural
7	gas or coal generator online in preparation for a predicted winter
8	storm shall be placed in the applicable power pool until the winter
9	storm passes.
10	B. An electric utility responsible for the duties outlined in
11	subsection A of this section shall recover related costs incurred by
12	the electrical utility for the fuel, generation, and transmission of
13	dedicated electricity from the source that failed to provide
14	capacity.
15	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
