11	Review Board; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 2-1002, which relates to composition and meetings of the
12	Board; modifying membership of the Board; modifying required frequency of meetings; providing an
13	effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 2-1002, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	Section 2-1002. A. The Opioid Overdose Fatality Review Board
19	shall be composed of <del>twenty-two (22)</del> <u>eighteen (18)</u> members, or their
20	designees, as follows:
21	1. <del>Twelve</del> <u>Eight</u> of the members shall be:
22	a. the Attorney General or designee,
23	b. the Chief Medical Examiner or designee,
24	c. the State Commissioner of Health or designee,

Ten of the members shall be appointed by the Attorney General, shall serve for terms of two (2) years and shall be 2 eligible for reappointment. The members shall be persons having 3 training and experience in matters related to opioid abuse and 4 5 prevention. The appointed members shall include: a county sheriff selected from a list of three names 6 a. submitted by the executive board of the Oklahoma 7 Sheriffs' Association, 8 9 b. a chief of a municipal police department selected from a list of three names submitted by the Oklahoma 10 Association of Chiefs of Police, 11 12 с. an attorney licensed in this state who is in private practice selected from a list of three names submitted 13 by the Board of Governors of the Oklahoma Bar 14 Association, 15 d. a district attorney selected from a list of three 16 names submitted by the District Attorneys Council, 17 a physician with emergency medical training selected 18 e. from a list of three names submitted by the Oklahoma 19 State Medical Association, 20 f. a physician with experience in drug addiction 21 treatment and recovery selected from a list of three 22 names submitted by the Oklahoma Osteopathic 23 Association, 24

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- g. a nurse selected from a list of three names submitted
   by the Oklahoma Nurses Association,
- h. two individuals, at least one of whom shall be a
  person who currently receives or formerly has been a
  consumer of addiction recovery services related to
  opioid use, selected from a list of three names
  submitted by the Department of Mental Health and
  Substance Abuse Services, and
- 9 i. a member of the judiciary selected from a list of three names submitted by the Oklahoma Supreme Court. 10 Every two (2) years the Board shall elect from among its 11 в. 12 membership a chair and a vice-chair vice chair. The Board shall meet at least quarterly and may meet more as frequently as necessary 13 as determined by the chair. Members shall serve without 14 compensation but may be reimbursed for necessary travel out of funds 15 available to the Office of the Attorney General and the Department 16 17 of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services pursuant to the State Travel Reimbursement Act; provided, that the reimbursement shall be 18 paid, in the case of state employee members, by the agency employing 19 the member. 20
  - 21 C. With funds appropriated or otherwise available for that 22 purpose, the Office of the Attorney General, jointly with the 23 Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services, shall
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provide administrative assistance and services to the Opioid
 Overdose Fatality Review Board.

3	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
4	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
5	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
6	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
7	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
