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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:						
15	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified						
16	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 34.204 of Title 62, unless there						
17	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:						
18	A. For any information technology that is more than one (1)						
19	year behind schedule, or for which the amount spent on the project						
20	is at least One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) more than the						
21	original cost estimate for the project, state agencies shall not pay						
22	for hours worked on a computer and billed by the hour to the state						
23	unless those hours are verifiable by data generated by automatic						
24	billing verification software.						

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B. Any such automatic billing verification software shall meet all of the following requirements:

<sup>3</sup> 1. Automatically count and report the number of keystrokes and <sup>4</sup> mouse events, but shall not record the actual keystrokes or mouse <sup>5</sup> events;

Automatically take a screenshot on a regular basis, but not
less than once every six (6) minutes; and

8 3. Meet all state and federal privacy and confidentiality laws
9 and protect all data that is private or confidential on individuals.

10 C. The software shall be procured by the contractor from an 11 independent entity. The data collected by the automatic billing 12 verification software shall be considered financial records 13 belonging to the contractor, who shall not sell or transfer the data 14 or use it in any other manner than to verify and manage hours worked 15 on a computer and billed to the state.

D. The provisions of this section shall not apply to:

17 1. State employees;

18 2. Departments contracting with other departments;

19 3. Law enforcement agencies or contracts with any agency which
 20 is the custodian of Criminal Justice Information as defined in
 21 Federal Bureau of Investigation Criminal Justice Information
 22 Services Security Policy; and

4. Any individual who works for a contractor that performs work
 on a state-owned device.
