8	modifying hours during which certain alcoholic beverages may be sold, dispensed, served or consumed;
9	allowing municipalities to enact ordinances relating to hours of operation of certain premises; and
10	providing an effective date.
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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 95, Chapter 366, O.S.L.
15	2016 (37A O.S. Supp. 2017, Section 3-125), is amended to read as
16	follows:
17	Section 3-125. A. No alcoholic beverages may be sold,
18	dispensed, served or consumed on the premises of a mixed beverage,
19	caterer, public event, charitable event, special event, on-premises
20	beer and wine, small brewer or brewpub licensee between the hours of
21	2:00 a.m. and <del>10:00 a.m.</del> <u>8:00 a.m. Municipalities may enact</u>
22	ordinances requiring such premises to be closed to the public
23	between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.
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B. Counties that elect to authorize sales of alcoholic
 beverages by the individual drink may designate any or all of the
 following days as days or portions thereof on which the sales of
 alcoholic beverages are not authorized:

5 1. On the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday; and
6 2. On Decoration or Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day,
7 Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.

8 C. Counties that elect to authorize sales of alcoholic 9 beverages by the individual drink shall not prohibit such sales on 10 the day of any national, state, county or city election, including 11 primary elections, provided that the election day does not occur on 12 any day on which such sales may otherwise be prohibited by any other 13 law.

14 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 98, Chapter 366, O.S.L. 15 2016 (37A O.S. Supp. 2017, Section 4-101), is amended to read as 16 follows:

Section 4-101. A. Municipalities are authorized to enact 17 ordinances consistent with the provisions of the Oklahoma Alcoholic 18 Beverage Control Act. In municipalities with populations of thirty-19 five thousand (35,000) or more according to the most recent federal 20 decennial census, these ordinances may provide for maximum penalties 21 of fines not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) plus court 22 costs, an imprisonment not to exceed ninety (90) days, or both such 23 fine and imprisonment. 24

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1	B. All municipalities of this state may enact ordinances
2	prohibiting or regulating nudity or drink solicitation in
3	establishments licensed pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma
4	Alcoholic Beverage Control Act.
5	C. The provisions of this section shall not authorize any
6	municipality to regulate by ordinance or issue any licenses for
7	activities for which a license is required to be issued pursuant to
8	the provisions of the Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage Control Act.
9	D. Municipalities are authorized to enact ordinances regulating
10	the closing time of ABLE Commission licensees who provide alcoholic
11	beverages for consumption on the premises; provided, no ordinance
12	shall be enacted for premises to open later than 6:00 a.m. or close
13	earlier than 2:00 a.m.
14	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective October 1, 2018.
