

1 2:00 a.m. and ~~10:00 a.m.~~ 8:00 a.m. Municipalities may enact
2 ordinances requiring such premises to be closed to the public
3 between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.

4 B. Counties that elect to authorize sales of alcoholic
5 beverages by the individual drink may designate any or all of the
6 following days as days or portions thereof on which the sales of
7 alcoholic beverages are not authorized:

- 8 1. On the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday; and
- 9 2. On Decoration or Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day,
10 Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.

11 C. Counties that elect to authorize sales of alcoholic
12 beverages by the individual drink shall not prohibit such sales on
13 the day of any national, state, county or city election, including
14 primary elections, provided that the election day does not occur on
15 any day on which such sales may otherwise be prohibited by any other
16 law.

17 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 98, Chapter 366, O.S.L.
18 2016 (37A O.S. Supp. 2017, Section 4-101), is amended to read as
19 follows:

20 Section 4-101. A. Municipalities are authorized to enact
21 ordinances consistent with the provisions of the Oklahoma Alcoholic
22 Beverage Control Act. In municipalities with populations of thirty-
23 five thousand (35,000) or more according to the most recent federal
24 decennial census, these ordinances may provide for maximum penalties

1 of fines not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) plus court
2 costs, an imprisonment not to exceed ninety (90) days, or both such
3 fine and imprisonment.

4 B. All municipalities of this state may enact ordinances
5 prohibiting or regulating nudity or drink solicitation in
6 establishments licensed pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma
7 Alcoholic Beverage Control Act.

8 C. The provisions of this section shall not authorize any
9 municipality to regulate by ordinance or issue any licenses for
10 activities for which a license is required to be issued pursuant to
11 the provisions of the Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage Control Act.

12 D. Municipalities are authorized to enact ordinances regulating
13 the closing time of ABLE Commission licensees who provide alcoholic
14 beverages for consumption on the premises; provided, no ordinance
15 shall be enacted for premises to open later than 6:00 a.m. or close
16 earlier than 2:00 a.m.

17 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective October 1, 2018.
