6	An Act relating to trespassing; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1835.2, as amended by Section 3,
7	Chapter 11, O.S.L. 2012 (21 O.S. Supp. 2017, Section 1835.2), which relates to trespassing upon private
8	land primarily devoted to farming, ranching or forestry; modifying permissive entities; and
9	providing an effective date.
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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1835.2, as
14	amended by Section 3, Chapter 11, O.S.L. 2012 (21 O.S. Supp. 2017,
15	Section 1835.2), is amended to read as follows:
16	Section 1835.2. A. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section
17	1835 of this title, the following provisions apply to private land
18	that is primarily devoted to farming, ranching, or forestry
19	purposes:
20	1. Except as provided in this section, whoever willfully enters
21	private land of another that is primarily devoted to farming,
22	ranching, or forestry purposes without permission by the surface
23	owner, surface lessee, hunting lessee, or lawful occupant thereof
24	shall be deemed guilty of trespass and, upon conviction thereof,

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1 shall be fined in any sum not less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) nor more than One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars 2 (\$1,500.00), and in addition, the court shall order restitution for 3 actual damages incurred. Persons convicted of a second or 4 5 subsequent offense under this paragraph shall be quilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine in any sum not less than 6 One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) nor more than Two 7 Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00), or by confinement in the 8 9 county jail for not less than thirty (30) days nor more than six (6) 10 months, or by both such fine and imprisonment, and in addition, the court shall order restitution for actual damages incurred; 11

12 2. This provision shall not apply to peace officers as defined in Section 99 of this title or any federal, state, or local 13 government employees engaged in the performance of their duties, or 14 to any firefighters, emergency medical personnel, or public utility 15 employees engaged in addressing an emergency that presents an 16 imminent danger to health, safety, or the environment in the 17 performance of their duties, or to parties engaged in oil and gas 18 operations, which shall include, without limitation, exploration, 19 drilling, production and sales activities, under authority of 20 mineral ownership, an oil and gas lease, seismic agreement or 21 permit, gas gathering, purchase, transportation, or treating 22 contracts, Corporation Commission order, or other lawful authority 23 from persons entitled to give the same. The provisions of this 24

section shall not prohibit railroad employees and emergency equipment from entering such land to restore rail service following an accident, derailment or natural disaster; nor the entrance of utility employees or contractors while acting in the scope of their employment; nor employees or contractors of valid easement or license holders while acting in the scope of their employment;

The following persons may enter such land of another unless 7 3. forbidden to do so, either orally or in writing, by the owner or 8 9 lawful occupier thereof: registered land surveyors and registered 10 professional engineers for the purpose of land surveying in the 11 performance of their professional services, persons making a delivery, selling a product or service, conducting a survey or poll, 12 13 working on behalf of a candidate for political office, or who otherwise have a legitimate reason for entering and who, immediately 14 upon entering, seek to conduct such business; and 15

4. Anyone who willfully or maliciously enters any such land of 16 another and therein commits or attempts to commit waste, theft, or 17 damage shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction 18 thereof, shall be fined in any sum not less than Two Hundred Fifty 19 Dollars (\$250.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or 20 by confinement in the county jail for not less than thirty (30) days 21 nor more than six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment, 22 and in addition, the court shall order restitution for actual 23 damages incurred. Persons convicted of a second or subsequent 24

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offense under this paragraph shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine in any sum not less than Seven Hundred Dollars (\$700.00) nor more than One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00), or by confinement in the county jail for not less than thirty (30) days nor more than six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment, and in addition, the court shall order restitution for actual damages.

B. This section shall not be construed to prohibit acts that
are permitted pursuant to Section 5-202 or 6-304 of Title 29 of the
Oklahoma Statutes.

11 C. 1. It shall be an affirmative defense to prosecution under 12 paragraph 1 of subsection A of this section that the accused had 13 express or implied permission or legal authority to be on the 14 property.

15 2. If an accused reasonably believed he or she was upon property for which they had permission to be upon, it shall be an 16 affirmative defense to prosecution under paragraph 1 of subsection A 17 of this section that the accused had with him or her, on his or her 18 person, written permission from the surface owner, surface lessee, 19 hunting lessee, or lawful occupant to be upon such person's land 20 while the accused was upon any adjoining property. This defense 21 shall not be available to the accused if: 22

a. the accused has previously pled guilty, nolocontendere, or has been convicted of any act of

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1	trespass or has been found civilly liable of any act
2	of trespass, or
3	b. the accused, while the accused was upon the adjoining
4	property, does not have with him or her, on his or her
5	person, the written permission specified in this
6	paragraph.
7	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
