7	An Act relating to public health and safety; creating the Oklahoma Medical Resident Loan Repayment Program;
8	defining terms; stating purpose of program; providing condition for loan repayment; providing for

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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-2724 of Title 63, unless there
18	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
20	Medical Resident Loan Repayment Program".
21	A. 1. The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall
22	administer the Oklahoma Medical Resident Loan Repayment Program.
23	2. For purposes of this section, "resident" shall mean a

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physician who holds the degree of Doctor of Medicine and who is

practicing in family medicine, geriatrics, general internal
medicine, general pediatrics, obstetrics/gynecology or emergency
medicine.

- 3. For the purpose of this section, "health center" shall mean a federally qualified health center as defined by 42 USC, Section 1905(1)(2)(B).
- 4. For the purposes of this section, "teaching health center" shall mean a health center that supports the residencies of primary care physicians within the operations of the health center.
- 5. The program, depending upon and subject to available funding, shall provide educational loan repayment assistance to medical residents who agree to practice medicine in a community located in Oklahoma approved by the Commission.
- 6. Each award shall be for a contracted period and shall be distributed to the participant by drafts made payable to the participant at the end of each contract year with disbursements not to exceed an amount of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per resident per year. In no event shall the amount of the award exceed the existing student loan indebtedness of the participant. Prior to any disbursement, the Commission shall certify and properly review reports submitted by the participating physician detailing performance of activities in accordance with the program.
- 7. The Commission shall review the performance in the program of the participating physician and determine whether an award may be

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granted for additional years, up to a maximum of three (3) years total, pursuant to rules promulgated by the Commission.

- B. The residents entering the program each year shall agree to provide medical care and services in areas designated by the Commission to provide medical care and services to Medicaid recipients as authorized by the Oklahoma Health Care Authority.
- C. In addition to appropriations, the Commission may accept donations of private funds to assist in funding the Oklahoma Medical Resident Loan Repayment Program. The Commission may, at its discretion, contract with other public entities and non-profit corporations for the endowment, management and administration of such funds.
- D. The Commission shall present a report on the operation of the program to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate within one (1) month of the beginning of each regular session of the Legislature, including but not limited to the progress made in accomplishing the goal of the program.
- E. The Commission shall promulgate rules necessary to carry out the purposes of this act.
 - F. This program shall terminate June 30, 2021.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2725 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the Physician Manpower Training Commission to be designated the "Oklahoma Medical Resident Loan Repayment Program Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies deposited to the credit of the fund by law. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Physician Manpower Training Commission for the purpose of repaying medical student loans. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2018.

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
