6 An Act relating to energy; creating the Oklahoma  
7 Consumer Energy Choice Act; providing short title;  
8 defining term; prohibiting certain entities from  
9 adopting certain policies that limit consumer access  
10 to certain energy sources; prohibiting certain  
11 limitations by political subdivisions; providing for  
12 codification; and providing an effective date.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

12 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5171 of Title 74, unless there  
14 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

15 A. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma  
16 Consumer Energy Choice Act".

17 B. For the purposes of this act, "energy source" means any fuel  
18 or power source used to power an engine including but not limited to  
19 any of the following: aviation fuel, biofuel, compressed natural  
20 gas, diesel, electricity to be utilized for the charging of electric  
21 vehicles, gasoline, gas distillates, hydrogen, liquified petroleum  
22 gas, and renewable diesel.

23 C. No city, town, county, or subdivision thereof shall adopt an  
24 ordinance, rule, or code which limits consumer access to an energy

1 source or that results in the de facto prohibition of a wholesaler,  
2 retailer, energy producer, or the related infrastructure that is  
3 necessary to provide consumer access to a specific energy source  
4 within the jurisdiction of a city, town, county, or subdivision  
5 thereof.

6 D. For the purposes of promoting commerce and the equitable  
7 treatment of the citizens of this state, limitations of consumer  
8 access to an energy source by any city, town, county, or subdivision  
9 thereof is declared to be a statewide concern and shall be  
10 prohibited pursuant to subsection C of this section.

11 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
