22	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-106.3, is

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- Section 1-106.3 A. There is hereby created within the State
 Department of Health the Oklahoma Food Service Advisory Council.
 The purpose of the Advisory Council shall be to:
 - 1. Advise the State Board of Health, the State Commissioner of Health, and the Department regarding food service establishments; and
 - 2. Recommend actions to improve sanitation and consumer protection.
 - B. The Advisory Council shall have the duty and authority to:
 - 1. Review and approve in an advisory capacity only rules and standards for food service establishments operating in this state;
 - 2. Evaluate, review and make recommendations regarding Department inspection activities; and
 - 3. Recommend and approve quality indicators and data submission requirements for food service establishments which shall be used by the Department to monitor compliance with licensure requirements and to publish an annual report of food service establishment performance.
 - C. The Oklahoma Food Service Advisory Council shall be composed of thirteen (13) fourteen (14) members as follows:
 - 1. Eight Nine members shall be appointed by the Commissioner, with the advice and consent of the Board, from a list of three names for each position provided by an association representing the

 initial term of the representative of the public shall be for one
 (1) year, and the initial terms of the independent food service
 operator, the food processor, and the representatives of food
 service education, and food processing education shall be for two
 (2) years. The initial terms of all other members appointed by the
 Commissioner shall be for three (3) years. After initial
 appointments to the Advisory Council, the Commissioner shall appoint
 members to three-year terms.
- E. The Advisory Council shall meet on a quarterly basis.

 Members of the Advisory Council shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for travel expenses by the Department pursuant to the provisions of the State Travel Reimbursement Act.
