Enter into public-private partnership agreements with the owners of operating railroads for the acquisition and/or use of railroad rights-of-way and trackage for establishing light rail passenger routes within the municipality of Tulsa on such terms, conditions, rates or rentals as the Department may consider to be in the best interests of the state;
- 3. Receive, accept and expend funds from any federal agency, or from private sources, for light rail passenger rail planning and for administration of light rail assistance projects, and for, or in aid of the acquisition, construction, reconstruction, replacement, repair, and maintenance of light rail rights-of-way and trackage within the municipality of Tulsa;
- 4. Make and enter into all contracts and agreements necessary or incidental to the performance of its duties and the execution of its powers under this act, and to employ light rail planning and management consultants, consulting engineers, attorneys, accountants, construction and financial consultants, superintendents, managers, and such other employees and agents as may be necessary in its judgment, and to fix their compensation; provided, that all such expenses shall be payable solely from funds made available under and pursuant to the provisions of this act; and
