10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

11 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
12 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1908.2 of Title 63, unless  
13 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

14 For the purpose of modernizing and improving the licensure and  
15 regulatory system for intermediate care facilities for individuals  
16 with intellectual disabilities (ICFs/IID), on or before the  
17 effective date of this act, the State Commissioner of Health shall  
18 update rules governing ICFs/IID including, but not limited to, rules  
19 pertaining to direct care staffing ratios and direct care staff  
20 training and qualifications. Such rules shall consider the  
21 standards provided by federal regulation, shall take into account  
22 the unique setting of ICFs/IID and the needs of residents served,  
23 and may alter requirements or standards based on factors determined  
24 by the Commissioner including, but not limited to, size of a

1 facility or acuity of the residents. In promulgating such rules,  
2 the Commissioner shall consider input from stakeholders including,  
3 but not limited to, associations representing long-term care  
4 facilities, staff, or residents.

5 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
