NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-7-111 of Title 27A, unless 13 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 14 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Spring 15 Creek Watershed Study Act". 16 В. The Legislature finds that: 17 Increasing pressure from agriculture and residential 18 development as well as stream bank erosion and other activities have 19 led to declining water quality levels in the Northeast Oklahoma 20 Watershed known as Spring Creek located in Cherokee, Delaware, and 21 Mayes counties near Kansas, Oklahoma resulting in increased concern 22 by the residents of the Spring Creek area and citizens of Oklahoma 23 as a whole as to the continued health of the watershed.

 year, support water supplies for growing urban centers in Oklahoma,

 and provide habitat for important wildlife and fisheries resources

 are threatened without cooperative, voluntary protective action by

 local communities and other stakeholders;
 - 2. Improved voluntary land management practices including soil conservation practices, riparian restoration and protection, reforestation, streambank livestock exclusion, and other methods of stewardship have great potential to improve and protect the quality of water in the Spring Creek watershed while improving the ecological health of the area; and
 - 3. It is in the interest of the citizens of this state as a whole and the residents of the Spring Creek watershed that the Oklahoma Conservation Commission, in partnership with other local, state, and federal agencies and non-governmental organizations undertake a comprehensive water quality study of Spring Creek to determine the best course of action to protect and improve the health of the aquatic habitat in the watershed.
 - C. It is the intent of the Legislature that the findings of this study will be used to direct implementation of voluntary, incentive-based conservation practices by the Commission in partnership with other local, state, and federal agencies and subject to availability of resources, in the Spring Creek watershed

- 1 to protect and improve the aquatic habitat and water quality in the 2 area.
- 3 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-7-112 of Title 27A, unless 5 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
 - A. There is hereby created the Spring Creek Watershed Water
 Quality Advisory Group. The group shall be organized and
 coordinated by the Oklahoma Conservation Commission and local
 conservation districts, and shall consist of the following members:
 - 1. Three members representing the local conservation districts in the watershed;
 - 2. Three local landowners, recommended by the conservation districts, who predominantly reside in the watershed full time and who represent major types of land management in the watershed include poultry production, livestock grazing, and forested land management;
 - 3. One landowner, recommended by the conservation districts, who predominantly resides outside the watershed;
- 4. One member representing the municipal government of Kansas,
 Oklahoma;
- 5. One member representing the municipal government of Oaks,
 Oklahoma; and
- 6. Any other members deemed necessary for inclusion by the Advisory Group.

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- B. In addition to the Advisory Group described in subsection A of this section, a technical advisory group shall be established to support the efforts of the study. Membership of the technical advisory group shall consist of:
 - 1. The Secretary of Agriculture or his or her designee;
 - 2. The Executive Director of the Department of Environmental Quality or his or her designee;
 - 3. One member representing the Natural Resources Conservation Service of the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA NRCS);
 - 4. One member representing the Farm Service Agency of the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA FSA);
 - 5. One member representing the Grand River Dam Authority;
- 6. One member representing the Department of Wildlife
 Conservation;
 - 7. One member representing the National Watershed Coalition;
 - 8. One member representing the Cherokee Nation.
 - C. Members of the working groups described in this section shall serve without compensation. The Commission shall provide space for meetings of the working groups and shall provide other assistance and staffing needs as they arise.
 - D. The watershed advisory group with support from the technical advisory group shall:

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- 1. Advise and assist the Commission in preparing any reports required by this section and in conducting the assessment pursuant to Section 3 of this act;
- 2. Recommend policies or programs to enhance the ability of agricultural and other landowners in the Spring Creek Watershed to participate in voluntary efforts to protect the water quality and aquatic habitat of the region. Such recommendations shall include potential policies or programs designed to optimize existing state and federal resources and initiatives that can be utilized to address water quality issues in the watershed. Such recommendations may include, but not be limited to, actions undertaken under the state water quality program, the USDA FSA Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP), the USDA NRCS Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP), the USDA Small Watershed Program, the USDA NRCS Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP), the U.S. Partners for Fish and Wildlife Program, the USDA NRCS Agriculture Conservation Easement Program (ACEP), or any other appropriate state or federal voluntary program identified by the working group; and
 - 3. Identify and recommend strategies for implementation of the plan created under Section 3 of this act.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-7-113 of Title 27A, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 The Oklahoma Conservation Commission shall, in consultation with the Spring Creek Watershed Water Quality Advisory Group, undertake a comprehensive watershed-based water quality plan designed to improve and protect the water quality and aquatic habitat in the Spring Creek watershed through the utilization of voluntary, incentive-based programs.

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- 2. On or before June 1, 2025, the Commission shall publish an electronic report of the findings. The Commission may, from time to time, update such findings as conditions change and pertinent information becomes available.
- The Commission may contract and cooperate with the Natural В. Resources Conservation Service of the United States Department of Agriculture and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to conduct activities provided for in this section.
- C. The Commission may apply for and accept grants, gifts, or other sources of public and private funds to carry out the purposes of the Spring Creek Watershed Study Act.
- A new section of law to be codified SECTION 4. NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-7-114 of Title 27A, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the Oklahoma Conservation Commission to be designated the "Spring Creek Watershed Study Cash Fund Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations,

1	and shall consist of all monies received by the Commission from
2	appropriations by the Legislature to the fund, and any money
3	received as gifts, grants, or other contributions from public or
4	private sources provided for the purpose of implementing the Spring
5	Creek Watershed Study Act. All monies accruing to the credit of the
6	fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the
7	Commission for the purpose provided for in this act. Expenditures
8	from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State
9	Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the
10	Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for
11	approval and payment.
12	SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
