Supp. 2017, Section 18-114.14), which relates to a minimum salary schedule; providing for 15 codification; providing effective date; and declaring 16 an emergency. 17 18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 19 SECTION 1. A new section of law to be codified 20 NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 18-114.15 of Title 70, unless 21 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 22 Beginning with the 2018-2019 school year, certified 23

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teachers, as defined in Section 1-116 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma

Statutes, in the public schools of Oklahoma shall receive in salary and/or fringe benefits not less than the amounts specified in the following schedule:

B. When determining the Minimum Salary Schedule, "fringe benefits" shall mean all or part of retirement benefits, excluding the contributions made pursuant to subsection A of Section 17-108.1 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes and the flexible benefit allowance pursuant to Section 26-105 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes from the flexible benefit allowance funds disbursed by the State Board of Education and the State Board of Career and Technology Education pursuant to Section 26-104 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

C. Any of the degrees referred to in this section shall be from a college recognized by the State Board of Education. shall accept teaching experience from out-of-state school districts that are accredited by the State Board of Education or appropriate state accrediting agency for the districts. The Board shall accept teaching experience from out-of-country schools that are accredited or otherwise endorsed by the appropriate national or regional accrediting or endorsement authority. Out-of-country certification documentation in a language other than English shall be analyzed by an educational credential evaluation service approved by the National Association of Credential Evaluation Services (NACES). person seeking to have credit granted for out-of-country teaching experience shall be responsible for all costs of the analysis by a credential evaluation service. The Board shall accept teaching experience from primary and secondary schools that are operated by the United States Department of Defense or are affiliated with the United States Department of State.

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D. For the purpose of state salary increments and retirement, no teacher shall be granted credit for more than five (5) years of active duty in the military service or out-of-state or out-of-country teaching experience as a certified teacher or its equivalent. Nothing in this section shall prohibit boards of education from crediting more years of experience on district salary schedules than those allowed for state purposes.

E. The State Board of Education shall recognize, for purposes of certification and salary increments, all the years of experience of a:

- 1. Certified teacher who teaches in the educational program of the Department of Corrections, beginning with fiscal year 1981;
- 2. Vocational rehabilitation counselor under the Department of Human Services if the counselor was employed as a certified teacher by the State Department of Education when the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation was transferred from the State Board of Career and Technology Education or the State Board of Education to the Oklahoma Public Welfare Commission on July 1, 1968;
- 3. Vocational rehabilitation counselor which were completed while employed by the Department of Human Services if such counselor was certified as a teacher or was eligible for certification as a teacher in Oklahoma;
- 4. Certified teacher which were completed while employed by the Department of Human Services Child Study Center at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center, if the teacher was certified as a teacher in Oklahoma; and
- 5. Certified school psychologist or psychometrist which were completed while employed as a doctoral intern, psychological assistant, or psychologist with any agency of the State of Oklahoma if the experience primarily involved work with persons of school- or preschool-age and if the person was, at the time the experience was

acquired, certified as, or eligible for certification as, a school psychologist or psychometrist.

- F. The provisions of this section shall not apply to teachers who have entered into postretirement employment with a public school in Oklahoma and are still receiving a monthly retirement benefit.
- G. The provisions of this section shall not apply to district superintendents.
- H. If a person employed as a certified teacher, as defined in Section 1-116 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, by a school district during the 2017-2018 school year was receiving a salary above the amounts provided in Section 18-114.14 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the person shall receive a salary increase of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) above the salary they received during the 2017-2018 school year, provided they remain employed by the same district, unless the hours or the duties of the certified teacher are reduced proportionately. The salary increase provided for in subsection A of this section shall be in addition to, and not as a replacement for, the step increase indicated for the certified teachers pursuant to the State Minimum Salary Schedule, as provided for in this subsection.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 18-114.16 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Beginning with the 2019-2020 school year, certified teachers, as defined in Section 1-116 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, in the public schools of Oklahoma shall receive in salary and/or fringe benefits not less than the amounts specified in the following schedule:

Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, certified teachers, as defined in Section 1-116 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, in the public schools of Oklahoma shall receive in salary and/or fringe benefits not less than the amounts specified in the following schedule:
