11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

12 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 34.33.1 of Title 62, unless  
14 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

15 A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, all state  
16 agencies may recruit or hire any technical staff deemed necessary to  
17 perform duties related to the information and telecommunications  
18 systems of such state agency. Such technical staff shall be  
19 employees of the state agency that recruited or hired them and not  
20 employees of the Information Services Division of the Office of  
21 Management and Enterprise Services.

22 B. The Chief Information Officer of the Information Services  
23 Division of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall  
24 promulgate rules regarding the information security certification of

1 technical staff hired under the provisions of this section. All  
2 such technical staff hired must receive information security  
3 certification from the Information Services Division of the Office  
4 of Management and Enterprise Services. Such certification must be  
5 repeated annually.

6 C. State agencies that choose to hire technical staff under the  
7 provisions of subsection A of this section may use state funds or  
8 enter into any agreement for the procurement of information  
9 technology and telecommunications software, hardware, equipment,  
10 peripheral devices, maintenance, consulting services, high  
11 technology systems, and other related information technology, data  
12 processing, telecommunications, and related peripherals and services  
13 by purchase, lease purchase, lease with option to purchase, lease,  
14 and rental, consistent with the provisions of the Oklahoma Central  
15 Purchasing Act, unless such procurement is related to information  
16 and telecommunications security, which shall require the written  
17 authorization of the Chief Information Officer or a designee.

18 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
