11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:											
12	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-2702, is											
13	amended to read as follows:											
14	Section 1-2702. A. 1. With available state or federal funds,											
15	the State Department of Health in consultation with the Oklahoma											
16	Rural Health Policy and Research Center shall be the state entity											
17	responsible for telemedicine and development of a statewide Oklahoma											
18	telemedicine network. The Department shall also be responsible for											
19	the continued development and implementation of a statewide system											
20	for the delivery of medical and other health care services through a											
21	telehealth system.											
22	2. In order to achieve these duties, the State Board of Health											
23	shall establish a separate office within the State Department of											
24	Health which shall be known as the Oklahoma Center for Telemedicine.											

1 The State Commissioner of Health shall appoint or employ a director 2 of the office who shall report to the Commissioner and the Board. 3 The Commissioner shall also employ such other personnel as necessary to carry out the duties of the Center. The director and other 4 5 Center personnel shall have no other duties within the Department 6 except those directly related to the duties and responsibilities of 7 the Center.

9 B. The Department shall enter into agreements with appropriate 10 entities to provide the Center with assistance in carrying out the 11 provisions of this section.

12 C. The director of the Center may form advisory groups as is13 necessary to work with the Center on telehealth issues.

D. The State Board of Health shall promulgate rules for the
implementation of the teleradiology responsibilities outlined in
this section. The rules shall be based on the American College of
Radiology Standards for Teleradiology.
