11	Section 1, Chapter 120, O.S.L. 2014 (70 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 6-122.7), which relates to
12	certification in the area of mild-moderate or severe- profound disabilities; allowing the State Board of
13	Education to issue a provisional certificate in the area of comprehensive special education; amending
14	Section 2, Chapter 336, O.S.L. 2013, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 120, O.S.L. 2014 (70 O.S. Supp.
15	2019, Section 6-122.8), which relates to the issuance of certain standard certificates in the area of mild-
16	moderate or severe-profound disabilities; allowing the State Board of Education to issue a standard
17	certificate in the area of comprehensive special education; amending Section 3, Chapter 120, O.S.L.
18	2014 (70 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 6-122.9), which relates to alternative certification in the areas of
19	mild-moderate or severe-profound disabilities; allowing the State Board of Education to issue an
20	alternative certificate in the area of comprehensive special education; providing for the State Board of
21	Education to issue a certain provisional certificate in the area of severe-profound disabilities;
22	establishing criteria; providing for the issuance of a standard certificate in the area of severe-profound
23	disabilities; establishing criteria; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and
24	declaring an emergency.

5	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 336, O.S.L.
6	2013, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 120, O.S.L. 2014 (70 O.S.
7	Supp. 2019, Section 6-122.7), is amended to read as follows:
, 8	Section 6-122.7. A. Notwithstanding any other provision of the
9	law, the State Board of Education shall issue a one-year provisional
10	certificate to teach in the area of mild-moderate <del>or</del> <u>disabilities,</u>
10	severe-profound disabilities or comprehensive special education to
12	any qualified candidate who has:
13	1. Earned a bachelor's level college degree from an accredited
14	institution of higher education;
15	2. Been recommended for a certificate by a school district
10	board of education or an accredited institution of higher education;
10	3. Satisfactorily completed a one-hundred-fifty-clock-hour
18	special education program prescribed by the Board; and
10	4. On file with the Board a national criminal history record
20	check as required pursuant to Section 5-142 of this title. The
20	individual applying for a provisional certificate shall be
21	responsible for the cost of the national criminal history record
22	check.

1 The one-year provisional certificate issued pursuant to this в. 2 section may be renewed for two (2) additional periods of one-year 3 each upon proof from an accredited institution of higher education that the individual has successfully completed at least six (6) 4 5 credit hours of prescribed coursework during the previous year in a nontraditional route to certification program in either mild-6 7 moderate or severe-profound disabilities or toward a master's degree in special education. 8

9 C. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the State Board 10 of Education shall issue a standard certificate in the area of mild-11 moderate or <u>disabilities</u>, severe-profound disabilities <u>or</u> 12 <u>comprehensive special education</u> to any individual who has:

Been issued one or more provisional certificates pursuant to
 this section;

Successfully completed the prescribed coursework of a 15 2. nontraditional route to certification program in either mild-16 17 moderate or severe-profound disabilities or a master's degree in special education from an accredited institution of higher education 18 within three (3) years of issuance of the original provisional 19 certificate and any examinations required to obtain a standard 20 certificate in mild-moderate or disabilities, severe-profound 21 disabilities or comprehensive special education; 22

3. Successfully completed the appropriate subject area
 competency examination as required pursuant to Section 6-187 of this
 title; and

4 4. Submitted an application and payment of the required5 certification fee.

D. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, an individual
who holds a current provisional certificate pursuant to subsection A
or B of this section or a current standard certificate pursuant to
subsection C of this section may satisfy the highly qualified
teacher requirement for early childhood education or elementary
education by successful completion of the early childhood education
or elementary education examinations.

E. To obtain standard certification in early childhood
education or elementary education, an individual shall complete an
appropriate teacher education program approved by the Oklahoma
Commission for Teacher Preparation.

F. Nothing in this section shall change the requirements an individual is required to satisfy to be considered highly qualified in a secondary core academic area.

20 G. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to implement 21 the provisions of this section.

22 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 2, Chapter 336, O.S.L. 23 2013, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 120, O.S.L. 2014 (70 O.S. 24 Supp. 2019, Section 6-122.8), is amended to read as follows:

Section 6-122.8. A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the State Board of Education shall issue a standard certificate in the area of mild-moderate or <u>disabilities</u>, severe-profound disabilities <u>or comprehensive special education</u> to any individual who has:

6 1. Earned a bachelor's level college degree from an accredited7 institution of higher education;

8 2. Successfully completed the prescribed coursework that may be
9 required for a master's degree in special education from an
10 accredited institution of higher education and any examinations
11 required to obtain a standard certificate in mild-moderate or
12 <u>disabilities</u>, severe-profound disabilities <u>or comprehensive special</u>
13 education;

3. Successfully completed the appropriate subject area competency examination as required pursuant to Section 6-187 of this title;

4. On file with the State Board of Education a national
 criminal history record check as required pursuant to Section 5-142
 of this title; and

20 5. Submitted an application and payment of the required21 certification fee.

B. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, an individual
who holds a current standard certificate pursuant to subsection A of
this section can satisfy the highly qualified teacher requirement

1 for early childhood education or elementary education by successful 2 completion of the early childhood education or elementary education 3 examinations.

C. To obtain standard certification in early childhood
education or elementary education, the individual shall complete an
appropriate teacher education program approved by the Oklahoma
Commission for Teacher Preparation.

8 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY Section 3, Chapter 120, O.S.L. 9 2014 (70 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 6-122.9), is amended to read as 10 follows:

Section 6-122.9. A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the State Board of Education shall issue a standard certificate in the area of mild-moderate <del>or</del> <u>disabilities</u>, severe-profound disabilities <u>or comprehensive special education</u> to any individual certified via an alternative certification route in early childhood education or elementary education who has:

Earned a bachelor's level college degree from an accredited
 institution of higher education;

Successfully completed the mild-moderate or disabilities,
 severe-profound disabilities or comprehensive special education
 competency examinations; and

3. Submitted an application and payment of the requiredcertification fee.

1 B. Notwithstanding any other provision of law and with the 2 exception of paraprofessionals under the Career Development areas, the State Board of Education shall issue a standard certificate in 3 4 the area of mild-moderate <del>or</del> disabilities, severe-profound 5 disabilities or comprehensive special education to any individual certified via an alternative certification route in a core academic 6 area, which includes Mathematics, Science, English, Language Arts, 7 History, Foreign Language, Music, Art, Elementary Education and 8 9 Early Childhood Education, who has:

Earned a bachelor's level college degree from an accredited
 institution of higher education;

Successfully completed the mild-moderate or disabilities,
 severe-profound disabilities or comprehensive special education
 competency examinations; and

Submitted an application and payment of the required
 certification fee.

17SECTION 4.NEW LAWA new section of law to be codified18in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-122.10 of Title 70, unless19there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The State Board of Education shall issue a two-year
provisional certificate in the area of severe-profound disabilities
to any individual who has:

23 1. Obtained a standard certificate in the area of mild-moderate 24 disabilities; 2. Been recommended for a certificate in the area of severe profound disabilities by a school district board of education; and

3 3. Submitted an application and payment of the required4 certification fee.

B. An individual who completes the requirements of subsection A
of this section may be eligible to receive a standard certificate in
the area of severe-profound disabilities upon completion of:

A micro-credentialing program in the area of severe-profound
 disabilities approved by the State Board of Education. The micro credentialing program shall include competencies described in
 Section 6-187 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes; or

The subject area competency examination required by Section
 6-187 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

14 SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2020.

15 SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 16 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby 17 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and

18 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
