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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 578.1 of Title 59, unless there
16	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
17	As used in this act:
18	"Certified midwife" or "CM" means a person who has:
19	a. graduated from a midwifery education program
20	accredited by the American College of Nurse-Midwives
21	Accreditation Commission for Midwifery Education,
22	b. passed a national certification examination
23	administered by the American Midwifery Certification
24	Board, and

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c. currently holds a certified midwife credential from the American College of Nurse-Midwives.

3 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 578.2 of Title 59, unless there 5 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. No person other than a certified midwife shall use the7 professional designation of "certified midwife".

B. No certified midwife shall perform services relating to a
vaginal birth after cesarean (VBAC), a breach presentation or
multiple gestations unless such services are delivered in a hospital
or birthing center, as such terms are defined in Section 1-701 of
Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes, or are delivered when medically
necessary to preserve the life and health of the mother or child.

14 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 578.3 of Title 59, unless there 16 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any person who performs midwifery services or holds himself or herself out to be a midwife shall notify all clients, at the outset of the professional relationship, which, if any, certification the person holds.

21 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 578.4 of Title 59, unless there 23 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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1	The provisions of this act shall not apply to certified nurse-
2	midwives, as defined in Section 567.3a of Title 59 of the Oklahoma
3	Statutes.
4	SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
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
