7	An Act relating noxious weeds; amending 2 O.S. 2011, Section 3-220, which relates to noxious weeds;
8	clarifying statutory language; modifying fine; allowing the Department of Agriculture, Food, and
9	Forestry to inspect and require a thistle management plan; allowing the Department to provide certain
10	information on website; removing annual survey requirement; requiring the State Board of Agriculture
11	to promulgate rules; authorizing the State Board of Agriculture to promulgate rules; and providing an
12	effective date.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2011, Section 3-220, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	Section 3-220. A. 1. The plants musk thistle (Carduus nutans
19	L.), Scotch thistle (Onoprodum acanthium L.), and Canada thistle
20	(Cirsium arvense) are designated as noxious weeds. The Legislature
21	finds that these thistles are a public nuisance in all counties
22	across this state.
23	2. It shall be the duty of every landowner in each county to
24	treat. control. or eradicate all Canada. musk. or Scotch thistles

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growing on the landowner's land every year as shall be sufficient to prevent these thistles from going to seed.

- 3. The Oklahoma Department of Transportation, the boards of county commissioners, and any other public, private, or corporate entity who shall maintain rights-of-way in the State of Oklahoma shall be responsible for removing any thistle infestation that occurs within their jurisdiction.
- 4. Failure of the landowner to treat, eradicate, or control all musk, Canada, or Scotch thistle may result in a fine not to exceed of no less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for each violation per day.
- 5. Upon written complaint, the State Oklahoma Department of Agriculture shall, Food, and Forestry may inspect the type of thistle infestation, assess the nature and extent of the thistle infestation on the property of the landowner and determine the most appropriate shall require implementation of a thistle treatment, control, or eradication method available management plan for the type of thistle and location of the property for a minimum of three (3) years.
 - B. The <u>State</u> Board <u>of Agriculture</u> shall:
- 1. Promulgate rules setting categories or degrees of infestation which would require specified treatment, control, or eradication;

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2. Include musk, Scotch, and Canada thistles as prohibited noxious weed and weed seed pursuant to the Department's authority and responsibility under Article 8 of the Oklahoma Agricultural Code;

- 3. By November 1, 2000, and annually thereafter prior to the growing season of musk, Scotch, and Canada thistles, complete an annual survey detailing the degree of infestation of these thistles across the state. The results of these surveys shall be reported to Oklahoma State University Promulgate rules providing for the development and implementation of short-term and long-term thistle management plans; and
- 4. In all counties of this state, provide Provide information to newspapers of general circulation on the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry's website stating that musk, Scotch, and Canada thistles are a public nuisance and that it is the duty of every public, private, or corporate landowner to treat, control, or eradicate these thistles growing on any property owned by the landowner. The information shall be provided at the beginning of the cycle of growth of the musk, Scotch, and Canada thistles and at other times as necessary to inform landowners of the provisions of this subsection. The information material shall also include:
 - a. information detailing the process by which an interested landowner may receive assistance pursuant

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1 to this subsection for the removal of thistles from 2 infested property, 3 b. the telephone number contact information of the Department, and 4 5 C. a statement informing the landowner that failure to remove musk, Scotch, and Canada thistles may subject 6 the landowner to legal action requiring the treatment, 7 control, or eradication of these thistles. 8 9 C. Upon request of the a landowner or the Department, the 10 designated Oklahoma State University extension agent for a 11 particular county shall may evaluate or, if there is no extension 12 agent for a particular county, the Department shall inspect the type 13 of thistle infestation, assess the nature and extent of the thistle infestation on the property of the landowner, and determine 14 15 recommend the most appropriate thistle treatment, control, or eradication method available for the type of thistle and location of 16 the property. 17 D. The State Board of Agriculture may promulgate rules 18 designating additional plants as noxious weeds as necessary. 19 SECTION 2.
