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1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

2 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-2721, is 3 amended to read as follows:

Section 1-2721. A. 1. The Physician Manpower Training
Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall administer the
Oklahoma Medical Loan Repayment Program.

7 2. For the purposes of this section, "primary care physicians"
8 shall mean physicians practicing in family medicine, geriatrics,
9 general internal medicine, general pediatrics,

10 obstetrics/gynecology $_{\tau}$ or emergency medicine.

The Program, depending upon and limited to available
 funding, shall provide educational loan repayment assistance to
 Oklahoma licensed primary care physicians who agree to establish a
 practice in a community located in Oklahoma approved by the
 Commission Department.

4. Each award shall be for a contracted period and shall be 16 distributed to the participant by drafts made payable to the 17 participant at the end of each contract year with disbursements not 18 to exceed an amount to be established annually by the Commission 19 Department. Prior to any disbursement, the Commission Department 20 shall certify and properly review reports submitted by the 21 participating physician detailing performance of activities in 22 accordance with the Program. 23

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5. At the conclusion of an initial two-year period, the
 Commission Department shall review the performance in the Program of
 the participating physician and determine whether an award may be
 granted for additional years pursuant to rules promulgated by the
 Commission Department.

B. The physicians entering the Program each year shall agree to
provide medical care and services in areas designated by the
Commission Department to provide medical care and services to
Medicaid recipients as authorized by the Oklahoma Health Care
Authority.

C. A physician shall be eligible to participate in the loan repayment program if the physician:

13 1. Is licensed to practice medicine in Oklahoma;

Is a new primary care residency graduate. Preference will
 be given to graduates of the primary care residency programs
 affiliated with the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic
 Medicine, the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and the
 teaching hospitals affiliated with both schools of medicine; or

Is a current practicing physician and has met criteria
 established by the Commission Department.

D. The physician shall agree to practice in the designated need areas identified by the <u>Commission Department</u> for no fewer than two (2) consecutive years as a condition of the loan repayment. If the physician does not fulfill the service obligation, the <u>Commission</u>

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1 <u>Department</u> may collect from the participant the entire amount of 2 loan payments made under the Program plus interest.

E. The <u>Commission Department</u> shall present a report on the operation of the Program to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate within one (1) month of the beginning of each regular session of the Legislature, including but not limited to the progress made in accomplishing the goal of the Program.

9 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-2722, is 10 amended to read as follows:

Section 1-2722. The amount of the award of educational loan repayment assistance shall not exceed any maximum or minimum amount as promulgated by rules of the Physician Manpower Training Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce pursuant to the Oklahoma Medical Loan Repayment Program. The actual amount of the award shall be based upon a determination of:

Actual funds available to the Program for expenditure; and
 The existing student loan indebtedness of the participating
 physician.

20 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-2723, is 21 amended to read as follows:

22 Section 1-2723. A. The Physician Manpower Training Commission 23 <u>Oklahoma Department of Commerce</u> shall have the option of utilizing 24 available funding in excess of the amount necessary to fund the

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Oklahoma Medical Loan Repayment Program described in Section 1-2721
 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title to fund new or
 expanded primary care residency programs in rural and underserved
 areas of the state. Such new or expanded primary care residency
 program funding shall include but not be limited to:

Payments to hospitals desiring to establish new primary care
 residency programs. Such payments shall be made to cover the costs
 of salaries, benefits and educational costs of residents in training
 at the facility;

Payments to hospitals with existing primary residency
 programs desiring to expand the number of residents participating in
 those programs. Such payments shall be made to cover the costs of
 salaries, benefits and educational costs of residents in training at
 the facility; or

3. Payments of stipends to residents of new or existing primary
care residency programs in exchange for a commitment to serve in a
rural or underserved area of the state as designated by the
Commission Department.

B. Provisions of this section shall be subject to the
promulgated rules of the Commission Department.

21 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.1, is 22 amended to read as follows:

23 Section 625.1. There is hereby established the Oklahoma Rural24 Medical Education Loan and Scholarship Fund. The fund shall be

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administered by the Physician Manpower Training Commission Oklahoma
 Department of Commerce under the provisions of Section 625.9 of this
 title.

4 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.2, is 5 amended to read as follows:

Section 625.2. The Physician Manpower Training Commission 6 Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall be authorized and empowered to 7 grant scholarships to qualified students who are bona fide residents 8 9 of the State of Oklahoma and who would not otherwise have funds 10 necessary to finance the cost of a program of study leading to the 11 Degree of Doctor of Medicine, or to the Degree of Doctor of 12 Osteopathic Medicine, to be granted by an accredited and recognized 13 college of medicine or college of osteopathic medicine.

14SECTION 6.AMENDATORY70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.3, is15amended to read as follows:

Section 625.3. A. The terms and conditions governing the 16 scholarships shall be as prescribed and formulated by the Physician 17 Manpower Training Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce, but 18 shall include the condition that each recipient, upon completion of 19 his course of study, shall repay his scholarship by practicing his 20 profession in a rural community in Oklahoma having a population of 21 seven thousand five hundred (7,500) persons or less according to the 22 last preceding United States Decennial Census and having a need 23 therefor, as determined by the Commission Department, for one (1) 24

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year for each one (1) year the scholarship is financed; provided, however, that the recipient will be given no credit for payment and reduction of said obligation by serving in the defined rural communities for a period less than two (2) years.

5 Β. The terms of this subsection shall apply to recipients who accept assistance before July 1, 1993. The contract shall provide 6 that in the event the recipient breaches the terms of the contract 7 by not serving the designated community for the specified period of 8 9 time he shall pay liquidated damages in an amount agreed upon by the 10 Commission Department and the recipient and representing a 11 reasonable estimate of the damage or loss to the community or the 12 state. Said damages shall not exceed one hundred percent (100%) of the principal. After payment of the liquidated damages, repayment 13 of the principal may be made in cash with interest at the rate of 14 twelve percent (12%) per annum, said interest to accrue from the 15 date each payment is made pursuant to the scholarship. No interest 16 however shall accrue during any one period of time that the 17 recipient thereof is required to serve in the Armed Forces of the 18 United States or during any period of internship. 19

20 C. The terms of this subsection shall apply to recipients who 21 accept assistance on or after July 1, 1993. The contract shall 22 provide that in the event the recipient breaches the terms of the 23 contract by not serving the designated community for the specified 24 period of time, the Commission Department shall be entitled to

1 recover an amount equal to three times the principal disbursed, 2 pursuant to the contract, plus interest. Interest on all amounts 3 paid to or on behalf of the participant shall be computed at the current prime rate plus one percent (1%) with said interest to 4 5 accrue from the date each payment is made, pursuant to the contract. The amount the Commission Department is entitled to recover shall be 6 paid within ninety (90) days of the date the recipient becomes 7 liable as determined by the Commission Department. 8

9 SECTION 7. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.4, is 10 amended to read as follows:

Section 625.4. The Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce 11 12 shall promulgate and adopt such rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act. The Commission 13 Department shall prescribe the form and regulate the submission of 14 applications for scholarship; conduct conferences and interviews 15 with applicants; determine the eligibility of applicants; allow or 16 disallow all applications for scholarships or renewal of 17 scholarships; contract, increase, decrease, terminate and otherwise 18 regulate all grants for scholarships and their repayment in cash or 19 services; and manage, operate and control all funds and property 20 appropriated or otherwise contributed for this purpose. 21 The Commission Department may acquire property or money by the 22 acceptance of gifts, grants, bequests or devise, and may contract 23 with the federal government in order to secure the benefit of any 24

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1 federal program consistent with the provisions of this act. Monies 2 received by the Commission Department in repayment of scholarships 3 granted from appropriated funds shall be deposited with the State Treasurer who shall place the same to the credit of the Commission 4 5 Department in depository funds to be known as the "Rural Medical Education Scholarship Fund" and the "Community Physician Education 6 Scholarship Fund" depending on the program in which the recipient 7 participated, under and subject exclusively to the control of the 8 9 Commission Department for the purpose of fulfilling and 10 accomplishing the conditions and purposes of the Physician Manpower 11 Training Commission Department. All monies so collected and deposited in the State Treasury as aforesaid shall constitute a 12 13 continuing fund, shall not be subject to fiscal limitations, and the unexpended balance shall at all times be available for expenditures 14 for the purposes and in the manner and form provided by this act. 15 All funds and property, and income therefrom, received by the 16 17 Commission Department through the acceptance of gifts, grants, bequests or devise shall be held by the Commission Department in 18 trust, and may be sold, transferred, invested and reinvested by the 19 Commission Department in accordance with the provisions of the 20 Oklahoma Trust Act, and all such funds and property, and income 21 therefrom, shall be used by the Commission Department in fulfilling 22 and accomplishing the conditions and purposes of the Physician 23 Manpower Training Commission Department. 24

SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.4a, as
 amended by Section 614, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (70 O.S. Supp.
 2015, Section 625.4a), is amended to read as follows:

Section 625.4a. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a 4 5 revolving fund for the Physician Manpower Training Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce to be designated the "Physician 6 Manpower Training Commission Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a 7 continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations and shall 8 9 consist of all payments received by the Commission Department 10 pursuant to Sections 625.3 and 625.10a of this title and all 11 payments received by the Commission Department pursuant to the 12 Allied Health Placement Program and the Nursing Home Demonstration 13 Program. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Physician 14 15 Manpower Training Commission Department for any expenses incurred in the implementation of its duties. Expenditures from the fund shall 16 17 be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of 18 Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment. 19 20 SECTION 9. 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.5, is AMENDATORY amended to read as follows: 21

22 Section 625.5. A. An applicant may be eligible for the award 23 of a scholarship upon demonstration that the applicant:

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Desires a scholarship to any accredited school of medicine
 or school of osteopathic medicine in the United States of America;

2. Is a bona fide resident of Oklahoma;

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3. Has personal financial resources such that, in the absence
of scholarship aid, will be unable to pursue the program of study
desired;

7 4. Is a person of good moral character;

8 5. Has successfully completed the program of instruction
9 prerequisite for admission to the program of study provided for in
10 Section 625.1 et seq. of this title and has applied for admission to
11 a medical school;

12 6. Has capacity to profit by the course of study for which the13 applicant seeks aid;

14 7. Desires to practice medicine in a rural community in15 Oklahoma; and

16 8. Submits proof that the applicant has not accepted or will 17 not accept any other scholarship assistance which has a conflicting 18 service obligation requirement.

In determining an applicant's capacity to profit by the course of study desired, the Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall consider the applicant's previous scholastic record, the results of examinations conducted under the provisions of Section 625.1 et seq. of this title, and the results of interviews and such other tests or examinations which the Commission Department may deem

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1 advisable. In establishing an applicant's financial need, the 2 Commission Department shall conduct a thorough and complete 3 investigation of the financial resources of the applicant and 4 family.

B. The amount of each scholarship grant shall not exceed
Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) per academic year for students
engaged in their first, second, third or fourth year of study, or
equivalent number of terms completed in an education program in a
given period of months.

10 C. The method of payment of funds to each recipient of a 11 scholarship grant shall be in accordance with rules formulated by 12 the Commission Department governing the grants for each type of 13 scholarship.

D. Each scholarship is renewable annually for the number of years required to complete the course of study in which the recipient is engaged. The <u>Commission Department</u> shall grant such an annual renewal only upon the recipient's application and upon the <u>Commission's Department's finding that the recipient:</u>

Has completed successfully the work of the preceding year
 and presented evidence that the recipient is a student in good
 standing;

22 2. Remains a resident of Oklahoma; and

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3. Is in a financial situation that warrants the award of a
 scholarship under the standards set forth in Section 625.1 et seq.
 of this title.

The Commission Department shall make an annual report to the 4 Ε. 5 Governor and Legislature on the activities of the Commission 6 Department. This report shall include the names of the recipients 7 of the scholarships, the amount of the scholarship awards, an accounting of the funds expended on scholarships and on the 8 9 administration of the program and a budget requesting the funds 10 necessary for the operation of the Commission Department. The 11 report shall also include an accounting of repayments of 12 scholarships, whether by services or in cash including interest. 13 SECTION 10. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.6, is amended to read as follows: 14

Section 625.6. Each applicant, before being granted a 15 scholarship, shall enter into a contract with the Commission 16 17 Oklahoma Department of Commerce agreeing to the terms and conditions upon which the scholarship shall be granted to him the applicant. 18 Said contract shall include such terms and provisions as will carry 19 out the full purpose and intent of this act and the form thereof 20 shall be prepared and approved by the Attorney General. 21 Said contracts The contract shall be signed by the Secretary of Commerce 22 and Tourism on behalf of the Commission Department and by the 23 The Commission Department is hereby vested with full and 24 applicant.

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1 complete authority and power to sue in its own name any applicant 2 for any balance due the <u>Commission Department</u> on any contract. The 3 <u>Commission Department</u> shall have authority to cancel any contract 4 made between it and any recipient of a scholarship upon cause deemed 5 sufficient by the <u>Commission Department</u>.

6 SECTION 11. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.9, is 7 amended to read as follows:

Section 625.9. The administration of the Oklahoma Rural Medical 8 9 Education Loan and Scholarship Fund is hereby transferred to the 10 Physician Manpower Training Commission Oklahoma Department of 11 Commerce as established by law. All the powers, duties, 12 responsibilities, rules and regulations and functions of the Board of Trustees of the Oklahoma Rural Medical Education Scholarship Fund 13 are hereby transferred to the Physician Manpower Training Commission 14 Department and The Board of Trustees of the Oklahoma Rural Medical 15 Education Scholarship Fund is hereby abolished and terminated. 16

17SECTION 12.AMENDATORY70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.10a, is18amended to read as follows:

Section 625.10a. The Physician Manpower Training Commission
Oklahoma Department of Commerce is hereby authorized and empowered
to establish and administer cost-sharing scholarships and loan fund
programs which shall provide for state assistance to and
participation with community physician education and scholarship
trust funds which are selected and approved by the Commission

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1 Department. Said The state assistance and participation shall be on a state and community matching formula basis for the funding of the 2 3 educational costs, fees and charges of a selected and qualified student in good standing and who is duly enrolled in an accredited 4 5 college of medicine or college of osteopathic medicine and pursuing a course of study leading to the degree of Doctor of Medicine or to 6 7 the degree of Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine. Said student shall be a bona fide resident of the State of Oklahoma who desires and agrees 8 9 to practice his profession on completion of the course of study and 10 training required for licensure and certification in the community 11 providing the initial funds to be matched by the state funds. Communities shall deposit the initial trust funds with the Physician 12 Manpower Training Commission Department to be administered and 13 matched by the Commission Department for the education of selected 14 15 and qualified students to serve and to practice in the communities with trust funds so established for that purpose with the Commission 16 Department. The Commission Department shall aid and advise 17 communities in the selection of qualified students to participate in 18 a given community scholarship program and the Commission Department 19 shall approve the selection of a given student for a particular 20 community physician education scholarship trust fund matching 21 The Commission Department shall determine the percentage 22 program. share for the state in the scholarship matching program with a given 23 community to educate a given and duly selected student on the basis 24

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of the extent of need of the community and its surrounding area for 1 2 the services of a practicing physician, the amount of the initial 3 trust funds the community has raised and deposited in the physician education scholarship trust fund that is duly established and the 4 matching funds schedule developed by the Commission Department and 5 based upon both the population of the community determined by the 6 latest Federal Decennial Census and the estimated median family 7 annual income level as determined on the basis of the estimates of 8 9 the Oklahoma Department of Commerce. The state matching assistance 10 and participation in a given scholarship trust fund program shall 11 not exceed seventy-five percent (75%) of the total amount calculated 12 to be necessary to fund the costs of a course of study for the degree of Doctor of Medicine or the degree of Doctor of Osteopathic 13 Medicine as determined annually by the Commission Department. 14 Repayment of the total amount of the scholarship by the student on 15 completion of his course of study and on the establishment of his 16 practice in the community shall be made to the state fund and to the 17 community trust fund in accordance with the percentage and total 18 amounts contributed by the state and by the community to the 19 matching scholarship trust fund program and in accordance with the 20 provisions of Section 625.5 of this title and contract requirements 21 of Section 625.6 of this title which shall apply in all cases to 22 students participating in said community physician education 23 scholarship trust fund programs administered by the Commission 24

<u>Department</u> with the exception of the maximum amount allowable in payment to the student which shall be based on an annual review of the costs, fees and charges of the school of medicine or school of osteopathic medicine in which the student is enrolled and participating which shall be made by the <u>Commission Department</u>.

6 The procedures, terms and conditions governing the scholarships 7 and how they are administered shall be as prescribed and formulated 8 by the Physician Manpower Training Commission Department but shall 9 include the following:

Communities desiring to participate in a loan and
 scholarship program shall select a student who meets the
 requirements for participation and give notice to the Commission
 Department.

14 2. The <u>Commission Department</u> shall aid and advise communities
15 in the selection of qualified students to participate in a given
16 community loan and scholarship program.

3. The communities shall deposit with the <u>Commission Department</u> the initial year scholarship funds provided by the community which funds shall be a percentage of the total educational and associated costs of the student in the course of study in an accredited college of medicine or college of osteopathic medicine and which funds are to be used in the education of the selected student.

4. The Commission Department shall review and approve the
selection of a given student and shall then match the initial

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1 community funds with state funds from the Oklahoma Community 2 Physician Education Loan and Scholarship Program Fund in the amount 3 needed to meet the total cost for educating the student for one (1) 4 year as agreed by the <u>Commission Department</u> and the community in 5 each particular case.

5. The Commission Department shall determine the percentage
7 share for the state in the loan and scholarship program with a given
8 community to educate a selected student on the basis of:

9 a. the extent of need of the community and its
10 surrounding area for the services of a practicing physician;

b. the amount of the initial trust funds the community has raised and deposited with the Commission Department for the education of a selected student;

14 c. the population of the community which shall be 15 determined on the basis of the current estimates made by the 16 Oklahoma Department of Commerce.

6. The state matching assistance and participation by the 17 Commission Department in a given loan and scholarship program for a 18 particular student shall not exceed seventy-five percent (75%) of 19 the total amount calculated to be necessary to fund one (1) year of 20 study for the degree of Doctor of Medicine or the degree of Doctor 21 of Osteopathic Medicine as determined annually by the Commission 22 Department at the school of medicine or osteopathic medicine in 23 which the selected student is enrolled. 24

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1 7. Each scholarship recipient, upon completion of his course of study, shall repay his loan and scholarship to the state and to the 2 3 community and receive forgiveness on repayment of the funds from the state and from the community by practicing his profession in the 4 5 community in Oklahoma providing the initial funds at a minimum for one (1) year for each Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) the 6 community and the state financed the scholarship program for the 7 student; provided, however, that the recipient will be given no 8 9 credit for payment, repayment and reduction of said obligation to 10 the community and the state by serving the given community for a 11 period less than two (2) years or, when approved by the Commission Department in agreement with the community and terms of the 12 contracts involved, repayment may be made in cash with interest at 13 the rate of twelve percent (12%) per annum, said interest to accrue 14 from the date each payment of funds pursuant to the loan and 15 scholarship program is made. In addition, should a recipient who 16 accepts financial assistance after July 1, 1977, elect not to 17 perform his obligated service in the sponsoring community, the 18 agreed upon sum denoted as liquidated damages in the contract shall 19 be assessed the recipient. No interest shall accrue on the 20 principal during any one period of time that the recipient thereof 21 is required to serve in the Armed Forces of the United States, or 22 during his internship or residency, if in a primary care area and 23 the required service, internship or residency does not exceed four 24

(4) years. Provided, that no interest shall accrue for six (6)
 months following each of the above exceptions.

3 Each student who applies to participate in a community and state matching loan and scholarship program shall enter into a contract 4 5 administered by the Commission Department on behalf of the state and a given community which has provided the initial scholarship funds 6 to educate a selected student. The contract shall be between the 7 State of Oklahoma and the selected student by which contract the 8 9 student agrees to return to the community which provided the initial 10 loan and scholarship funds and to practice his profession, on completion of the course of study and training required for 11 licensure and certification, for the number of years for which the 12 13 student received assistance from the community and the state and in accordance with the conditions specified in the contract agreed to 14 by the student and the given community which selected the student. 15 Any repayment of the total amount of the scholarship or any portion 16 17 thereof as provided in this act and in the contract between the state and the student shall be made to the state deposited into the 18 Community Matching Loan and Scholarship Repayment Revolving Fund 19 hereby created in the State Treasury. The community portion of any 20 repayment monies deposited in said fund shall be withdrawn from the 21 revolving fund and returned to the community on request or, if the 22 community so chooses, said repayment monies shall be held available 23 in said fund for reallocation by the community and the state to the 24

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1 Community Physician Education Loan and Scholarship Program Fund to educate another student selected by the community and approved by 2 the Commission Department. The form of the contracts shall be 3 prepared and approved by the Attorney General. The Commission 4 5 Department is hereby vested with full and complete authority and power to sue in its own name any applicant for any balance due the 6 Commission Department for repayment of the scholarship on any 7 contract or for failure by the applicant to fulfill the terms of his 8 9 contract in any way. Said contracts shall be signed by the Chairman 10 of the Commission Executive Director of the Department and by the 11 student for and by a representative of the community which selected 12 the student. The Commission Department shall have authority to 13 cancel the contract it makes between the Commission Department and any recipient of a scholarship upon cause deemed sufficient by the 14 15 Commission Department.

16 SECTION 13. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.11, is 17 amended to read as follows:

Section 625.11. There is hereby created and established the Oklahoma Community Physician Education Scholarship Program Fund which fund shall be administered by the Physician Manpower Training Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce for the purposes of providing the state matching funds assistance for scholarship programs with given communities. The Commission Department shall be empowered to contract for services with any state agencies,

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1 institutions or any public or private corporation involved in and 2 conducting programs in physician manpower placement in order that 3 the Commission Department may perform its functions in an efficient 4 and timely fashion.

5 SECTION 14. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.12, is 6 amended to read as follows:

Section 625.12. A. A student may be eligible to apply for and be granted a scholarship under the community and state matching program when the following conditions are met:

10 1. That the student desires a scholarship to cover the costs and expenses of pursuing the degree of Doctor of Medicine or the degree of Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine at any accredited school of medicine or school of osteopathic medicine in the United States of America;

15 2. That the student is a bona fide resident of the State of16 Oklahoma;

17 3. That the student desires and agrees to practice his 18 profession in the community in Oklahoma providing the initial funds 19 and subject to the terms and conditions of the contract between the 20 student and the community and the contract between the student and 21 the state;

4. That the student is a person of good moral character;
5. That the student has a capacity to profit by the course of
study for which he seeks aid;

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6. That the student has successfully completed the program of
 instruction prerequisite for admission to or continuation in the
 program of study provided for in this act and has applied and been
 accepted or is currently a student at an accredited school of
 medicine or school of osteopathic medicine;

7. That the personal financial resources of the student are
such that he can demonstrate need for assistance to pursue
successfully the course of study in which he is engaged; and

9 8. That the student submits proof that he has not accepted or
10 will not accept any other scholarship assistance which has a
11 conflicting service obligation requirement.

In determining an applicant student's capacity to profit by the course of study he desires to pursue, the <u>Commission Department</u> shall consider his previous scholastic record, the results of examinations conducted under the provisions of this act, and the results of interviews and such other tests or examinations which the <u>Commission</u> Department may deem advisable.

In establishing an applicant student's financial need, the Commission Department shall conduct a thorough and complete investigation of the financial resources of the applicant and his family.

B. The method of payment of funds to each student participatingin the scholarship program shall be in accordance with rules

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formulated by the Commission Department governing the grants for
 each type of scholarship involved.

3 C. Each scholarship shall be renegotiated annually by the 4 Commission Department to determine if a change has occurred in the 5 ability of the community to match funds at the agreed level or if a change has occurred in the student's financial need or desire to 6 7 practice in the community providing the initial funds. Each scholarship may be renewed annually for the number of years required 8 9 to complete the course of study in which the recipient is engaged. 10 The Commission Department shall grant such an annual renewal only 11 upon the recipient's application and upon the Commission's 12 Department's finding that the student has completed successfully the work of the preceding year and presented evidence that he is a 13 student in good standing, and that he remains a resident of 14 15 Oklahoma.

 distribution of physicians by geographic location and by type of
 practice, and, to accomplish this review, the Commission Department
 shall obtain information from and work in conjunction with the State
 Department of Health and all other agencies which gather data and
 evaluate health manpower needs;

The Commission Department is authorized, in cooperation with 16 Β. the Oklahoma Health Care Authority, to enter into contractual 17 arrangements with the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and 18 the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine for 19 the reimbursement of intern and resident professional liability 20 insurance cost which shall not be subject to the limits established 21 in Section 697.2 of this title. Any and all intern and resident 22 positions are eligible for reimbursement of intern and resident 23 professional liability insurance cost. 24

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1 C. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving 2 fund for the Physician Manpower Training Commission Department to be 3 designated the "Intern and Residents Professional Liability Insurance Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject 4 5 to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the Physician Manpower Training Commission Department for 6 reimbursement of intern and residency professional liability 7 insurance costs. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are 8 9 hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the 10 Physician Manpower Training Commission Department for such costs. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the 11 State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the 12 13 Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment. 14

15SECTION 24.AMENDATORY70 O.S. 2011, Section 697.11, as16amended by Section 618, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (70 O.S. Supp.)172015, Section 697.11), is amended to read as follows:

Section 697.11. A. In addition to internship and residency programs previously established and funded, it is the intent of the Legislature that the Physician Manpower Training Commission Oklahoma <u>Department of Commerce</u>, in cooperation with the Oklahoma Health Care Authority, establish a Critical Need Internship and Residency Program. The purpose of the Program is to fund internship and residency programs across the state in areas of critical need. The

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determination of areas of critical need shall be made through a
 cooperative effort between the University of Oklahoma College of
 Medicine and the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic
 Medicine. The findings shall be reported to the Commission
 <u>Department</u> by July 1, 2006, and every three (3) years thereafter.

B. The University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and the
Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine shall
annually provide to the Commission Department a report outlining the
areas of physician shortages in each specialty area. The report
shall be the basis for the cooperative funding of critical need
physician specialties for the current fiscal year.

12 C. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the Physician Manpower Training Commission Department to be 13 designated the "Critical Need Internship and Residency Fund". 14 The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year 15 limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the 16 17 Physician Manpower Training Commission Department for funding internship and residency programs in areas of critical need. 18 All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated 19 and may be budgeted and expended by the Physician Manpower Training 20 Commission Department for such costs. Expenditures from the fund 21 shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against 22 claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of 23 Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment. 24

3 Section 697.12. The Physician Manpower Training Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall establish and administer a 4 5 cost-sharing scholarship program for the provision of physician services at the various correctional facilities under the Department 6 7 of Corrections and the surrounding or nearby communities. Except as otherwise specified herein, the scholarship program shall be 8 9 administered pursuant to the requirements prescribed by law for and 10 as part of the Oklahoma Community Education Scholarship Program. 11 Each scholarship available hereunder shall be funded on a percentage cost-sharing basis as follows: One-half (1/2) of the costs to be 12 provided by the Commission Department, one-fourth (1/4) of the costs 13 to be provided by the Department of Corrections and one-fourth (1/4)14 of the costs to be provided by a community. Each physician, who has 15 participated in the scholarship program hereunder, shall devote one-16 half (1/2) of his or her professional time to medical care and 17 treatment of inmates at a state correctional facility and one-half 18 (1/2) of his or her professional time to medical services in the 19 community which shared the cost of a scholarship hereunder, for the 20 period of time as required under the Oklahoma Community Education 21 Scholarship Program. 22

23 SECTION 26. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 697.15, is 24 amended to read as follows:

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1 Section 697.15. In order for any hospital or clinic to be eligible to receive funds through the Physician Manpower Training 2 3 Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce for residency or internship positions, such hospital or clinic shall affirm that 4 5 students receiving their medical education in Oklahoma will be given special consideration for all residency and internship positions. 6 SECTION 27. 70 O.S. 2011, Section 697.17, as 7 AMENDATORY amended by Section 619, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (70 O.S. Supp. 8 9 2015, Section 697.17), is amended to read as follows: 10 Section 697.17. A. There is hereby established the Nursing Student Assistance Program which shall be administered by the 11 12 Physician Manpower Training Commission Oklahoma Department of 13 Commerce. The purpose of the program shall be to encourage persons to enter nursing education programs and to practice in areas of this 14 state in which there is an urgent need for nursing services or in 15 institutions or agencies of this state which provide funds on a 16 17 matching basis with the Physician Manpower Training Commission Department for the support of nursing students. The Nursing Student 18 Assistance Program shall be administered by rules adopted by the 19 Physician Manpower Training Commission Department. 20 Only students who are residents of this state shall be 21 в.

21 B. Only students who are residents of this state shall be

 23 C. If a person receiving Nursing Student Assistance Program
 24 funds fails to fully comply with the provisions of the contract for

The fund shall be 10 a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all nonappropriated monies, including community match 11 money of appropriated funds, grants, gifts, and repayment of 12 scholarships received by the Physician Manpower Training Commission 13 Department. All monies accruing to the credit of said fund are 14 hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the 15 Physician Manpower Training Commission Department for such 16 17 scholarships as may be provided for pursuant to the Nursing Student Assistance Program. Expenditures from said fund shall be made upon 18 warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as 19 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and 20 Enterprise Services for approval and payment. 21

Monies 7 received by the Commission Department under the provisions of this 8 9 section shall be deposited to and disbursed from, the "Community 10 Match Revolving Fund" hereby created in the State Treasury. The 11 fund shall be a continuing fund not subject to legislative 12 appropriation of fiscal year limitations. Expenditures from said 13 fund shall be made on warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed by the Commission Department with the Director of the 14 Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and 15 16 payment.

The purpose of the program shall be to encourage persons 24 to enter nursing education programs and to practice in nursing homes of this state in which there is an urgent need for nursing services
which provide funds on a matching basis with the Physician Manpower
Training Commission Department for the support of nursing students.
The OBRA Program shall be administered by rules under the Oklahoma

There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving 17 D. fund for the Physician Manpower Training Commission Department to be 18 designated the "OBRA Fund". person pursuant to the provisions of the contract plus interest at a rate that equals the prime interest rate plus one percent (1%) from the date of disbursement of the funds and shall be liable for any other liquidated damages as specified in the contract.

5 D. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the Physician Manpower Training Commission Department to be 6 7 designated the "Physician Assistant Scholarship Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, 8 9 and shall consist of all monies received by the Physician Manpower 10 Training Commission Department for implementation of the Physician 11 Assistant Scholarship Program. All monies accruing to the credit of 12 the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Physician Manpower Training Commission Department for such 13 scholarships as may be provided for pursuant to the Physician 14 Assistant Scholarship Program. Expenditures from the fund shall be 15 made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims 16 filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of 17 Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment. 18

19 SECTION 32. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5004.2 of Title 74, unless there 21 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Physician Manpower Training Commission is hereby
abolished. On July 1, 2016, all powers, duties, employees,
functions, and responsibilities of the Physician Manpower Training

Commission shall be transferred to the Oklahoma Department of
 Commerce. The transfer shall include all equipment, supplies,
 records, assets, current and future liabilities, fund balances,
 encumbrances, obligations and indebtedness associated with the
 Physician Manpower Training Commission.

B. Any monies accruing to or in the name of the Physician
Manpower Training Commission on and after the effective date of this
act, or any monies that accrue in any funds or accounts or are

D. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
Services is hereby directed to coordinate the transfer of funds,
allotments, purchase orders and outstanding financial obligations or
encumbrances as provided for in this section.

19 SECTION 33. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5004.3 of Title 74, unless there 21 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Effective July 1, 2016, all administrative rules promulgated by the Physician Manpower Training Commission shall be transferred to and become a part of the administrative rules of the Oklahoma

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1 Department of Commerce. The Office of Administrative Rules in the 2 Secretary of State's office shall provide adequate notice in the 3 Oklahoma Register of the transfer of such rules, and shall place the transferred rules under the Administrative Code section of the 4 Oklahoma Department of Commerce. Such rules shall continue in force 5 and effect as rules of the office of the Department from and after 6 July 1, 2016, and any amendment, repeal or addition to the 7 transferred rules shall be under the jurisdiction of the Department. 8 9 SECTION 34. REPEALER 70 O.S. 2011, Sections 625.7, 10 697.3, 697.4 and 697.16, are hereby repealed. 11 SECTION 35. This act shall become effective July 1, 2016. 12 SECTION 36.
