16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-2721, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	Section 1-2721. A. 1. The Physician Manpower Training
20	Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall administer the
21	Oklahoma Medical Loan Repayment Program.
22	2. For the purposes of this section, "primary care physicians"
23	shall mean physicians practicing in family medicine, geriatrics,
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general internal medicine, general pediatrics,
 obstetrics/gynecology, or emergency medicine.

3 3. The Program, depending upon and limited to available
4 funding, shall provide educational loan repayment assistance to
5 Oklahoma licensed primary care physicians who agree to establish a
6 practice in a community located in Oklahoma approved by the
7 Commission Department.

4. Each award shall be for a contracted period and shall be 8 9 distributed to the participant by drafts made payable to the 10 participant at the end of each contract year with disbursements not to exceed an amount to be established annually by the Commission 11 12 Department. Prior to any disbursement, the Commission Department shall certify and properly review reports submitted by the 13 participating physician detailing performance of activities in 14 15 accordance with the Program.

16 5. At the conclusion of an initial two-year period, the 17 Commission <u>Department</u> shall review the performance in the Program of 18 the participating physician and determine whether an award may be 19 granted for additional years pursuant to rules promulgated by the 20 Commission Department.

B. The physicians entering the Program each year shall agree to
 provide medical care and services in areas designated by the
 Commission Department to provide medical care and services to

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Medicaid recipients as authorized by the Oklahoma Health Care
 Authority.

3 C. A physician shall be eligible to participate in the loan4 repayment program if the physician:

5 1. Is licensed to practice medicine in Oklahoma;

6 2. Is a new primary care residency graduate. Preference will
7 be given to graduates of the primary care residency programs
8 affiliated with the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic
9 Medicine, the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine and the
10 teaching hospitals affiliated with both schools of medicine; or

Is a current practicing physician and has met criteria
 established by the Commission Department.

D. The physician shall agree to practice in the designated need areas identified by the <u>Commission Department</u> for no fewer than two (2) consecutive years as a condition of the loan repayment. If the physician does not fulfill the service obligation, the <u>Commission</u> <u>Department</u> may collect from the participant the entire amount of loan payments made under the Program plus interest.

E. The <u>Commission Department</u> shall present a report on the operation of the Program to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate within one (1) month of the beginning of each regular session of the Legislature, including but not limited to the progress made in accomplishing the goal of the Program.

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1SECTION 2.AMENDATORY63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-2722, is2amended to read as follows:

Section 1-2722. The amount of the award of educational loan
repayment assistance shall not exceed any maximum or minimum amount
as promulgated by rules of the Physician Manpower Training
Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce pursuant to the Oklahoma
Medical Loan Repayment Program. The actual amount of the award
shall be based upon a determination of:

9 1. Actual funds available to the Program for expenditure; and
10 2. The existing student loan indebtedness of the participating
11 physician.

12 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-2723, is 13 amended to read as follows:

Section 1-2723. A. The Physician Manpower Training Commission 14 15 Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall have the option of utilizing available funding in excess of the amount necessary to fund the 16 17 Oklahoma Medical Loan Repayment Program described in Section 1-2721 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title to fund new or 18 expanded primary care residency programs in rural and underserved 19 areas of the state. Such new or expanded primary care residency 20 program funding shall include but not be limited to: 21

Payments to hospitals desiring to establish new primary care
 residency programs. Such payments shall be made to cover the costs

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1 of salaries, benefits and educational costs of residents in training 2 at the facility;

2. Payments to hospitals with existing primary residency
programs desiring to expand the number of residents participating in
those programs. Such payments shall be made to cover the costs of
salaries, benefits and educational costs of residents in training at
the facility; or

8 3. Payments of stipends to residents of new or existing primary 9 care residency programs in exchange for a commitment to serve in a 10 rural or underserved area of the state as designated by the 11 Commission Department.

B. Provisions of this section shall be subject to the
promulgated rules of the Commission Department.

14SECTION 4.AMENDATORY70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.1, is15amended to read as follows:

Section 625.1. There is hereby established the Oklahoma Rural Medical Education Loan and Scholarship Fund. The fund shall be administered by the Physician Manpower Training Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce under the provisions of Section 625.9 of this title.

21 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.2, is 22 amended to read as follows:

23 Section 625.2. The Physician Manpower Training Commission
 24 Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall be authorized and empowered to

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grant scholarships to qualified students who are bona fide residents of the State of Oklahoma and who would not otherwise have funds necessary to finance the cost of a program of study leading to the Degree of Doctor of Medicine, or to the Degree of Doctor of Steopathic Medicine, to be granted by an accredited and recognized college of medicine or college of osteopathic medicine.

7 SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.3, is
8 amended to read as follows:

9 Section 625.3. A. The terms and conditions governing the scholarships shall be as prescribed and formulated by the Physician 10 11 Manpower Training Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce, but 12 shall include the condition that each recipient, upon completion of his course of study, shall repay his scholarship by practicing his 13 profession in a rural community in Oklahoma having a population of 14 seven thousand five hundred (7,500) persons or less according to the 15 last preceding United States Decennial Census and having a need 16 therefor, as determined by the Commission Department, for one (1) 17 year for each one (1) year the scholarship is financed; provided, 18 however, that the recipient will be given no credit for payment and 19 reduction of said obligation by serving in the defined rural 20 communities for a period less than two (2) years. 21

B. The terms of this subsection shall apply to recipients who accept assistance before July 1, 1993. The contract shall provide that in the event the recipient breaches the terms of the contract

1 by not serving the designated community for the specified period of 2 time he shall pay liquidated damages in an amount agreed upon by the 3 Commission Department and the recipient and representing a reasonable estimate of the damage or loss to the community or the 4 5 state. Said damages shall not exceed one hundred percent (100%) of the principal. After payment of the liquidated damages, repayment 6 7 of the principal may be made in cash with interest at the rate of twelve percent (12%) per annum, said interest to accrue from the 8 9 date each payment is made pursuant to the scholarship. No interest 10 however shall accrue during any one period of time that the recipient thereof is required to serve in the Armed Forces of the 11 12 United States or during any period of internship.

С. The terms of this subsection shall apply to recipients who 13 accept assistance on or after July 1, 1993. The contract shall 14 15 provide that in the event the recipient breaches the terms of the contract by not serving the designated community for the specified 16 period of time, the Commission Department shall be entitled to 17 recover an amount equal to three times the principal disbursed, 18 pursuant to the contract, plus interest. Interest on all amounts 19 paid to or on behalf of the participant shall be computed at the 20 current prime rate plus one percent (1%) with said interest to 21 accrue from the date each payment is made, pursuant to the contract. 22 The amount the Commission Department is entitled to recover shall be 23

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paid within ninety (90) days of the date the recipient becomes
 liable as determined by the Commission Department.

3 SECTION 7. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.4, is 4 amended to read as follows:

5 Section 625.4. The Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall promulgate and adopt such rules and regulations as may be 6 7 necessary to carry out the provisions of this act. The Commission Department shall prescribe the form and regulate the submission of 8 9 applications for scholarship; conduct conferences and interviews 10 with applicants; determine the eligibility of applicants; allow or 11 disallow all applications for scholarships or renewal of 12 scholarships; contract, increase, decrease, terminate and otherwise regulate all grants for scholarships and their repayment in cash or 13 services; and manage, operate and control all funds and property 14 15 appropriated or otherwise contributed for this purpose. The 16 Commission Department may acquire property or money by the acceptance of gifts, grants, bequests or devise, and may contract 17 with the federal government in order to secure the benefit of any 18 federal program consistent with the provisions of this act. Monies 19 received by the Commission Department in repayment of scholarships 20 granted from appropriated funds shall be deposited with the State 21 Treasurer who shall place the same to the credit of the Commission 22 Department in depository funds to be known as the "Rural Medical 23 Education Scholarship Fund" and the "Community Physician Education 24

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Scholarship Fund" depending on the program in which the recipient 1 participated, under and subject exclusively to the control of the 2 3 Commission Department for the purpose of fulfilling and accomplishing the conditions and purposes of the Physician Manpower 4 5 Training Commission Department. All monies so collected and deposited in the State Treasury as aforesaid shall constitute a 6 7 continuing fund, shall not be subject to fiscal limitations, and the unexpended balance shall at all times be available for expenditures 8 9 for the purposes and in the manner and form provided by this act. 10 All funds and property, and income therefrom, received by the 11 Commission Department through the acceptance of gifts, grants, 12 bequests or devise shall be held by the Commission Department in trust, and may be sold, transferred, invested and reinvested by the 13 Commission Department in accordance with the provisions of the 14 15 Oklahoma Trust Act, and all such funds and property, and income therefrom, shall be used by the Commission Department in fulfilling 16 and accomplishing the conditions and purposes of the Physician 17 Manpower Training Commission Department. 18 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.4a, as SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 19

20 amended by Section 614, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (70 O.S. Supp.

21 2015, Section 625.4a), is amended to read as follows:

22 Section 625.4a. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a 23 revolving fund for the <del>Physician Manpower Training Commission</del>

24 Oklahoma Department of Commerce to be designated the "Physician

Manpower Training Commission Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a 1 continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations and shall 2 3 consist of all payments received by the Commission Department pursuant to Sections 625.3 and 625.10a of this title and all 4 5 payments received by the Commission Department pursuant to the Allied Health Placement Program and the Nursing Home Demonstration 6 Program. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby 7 appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Physician 8 9 Manpower Training Commission Department for any expenses incurred in 10 the implementation of its duties. Expenditures from the fund shall 11 be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims 12 filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of 13 Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment. 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.5, is SECTION 9. AMENDATORY 14 15 amended to read as follows: Section 625.5. A. An applicant may be eligible for the award 16 of a scholarship upon demonstration that the applicant: 17 Desires a scholarship to any accredited school of medicine 18 1. or school of osteopathic medicine in the United States of America; 19 2. Is a bona fide resident of Oklahoma; 20 3. Has personal financial resources such that, in the absence 21 of scholarship aid, will be unable to pursue the program of study 22 desired; 23

Is a person of good moral character;

5. Has successfully completed the program of instruction
 prerequisite for admission to the program of study provided for in
 Section 625.1 et seq. of this title and has applied for admission to
 a medical school;

6. Has capacity to profit by the course of study for which theapplicant seeks aid;

7 7. Desires to practice medicine in a rural community in8 Oklahoma; and

9 8. Submits proof that the applicant has not accepted or will
10 not accept any other scholarship assistance which has a conflicting
11 service obligation requirement.

12 In determining an applicant's capacity to profit by the course of study desired, the Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce 13 shall consider the applicant's previous scholastic record, the 14 results of examinations conducted under the provisions of Section 15 625.1 et seq. of this title, and the results of interviews and such 16 other tests or examinations which the Commission Department may deem 17 In establishing an applicant's financial need, the 18 advisable. Commission Department shall conduct a thorough and complete 19 investigation of the financial resources of the applicant and 20 family. 21

B. The amount of each scholarship grant shall not exceed
Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) per academic year for students
engaged in their first, second, third or fourth year of study, or

1 equivalent number of terms completed in an education program in a
2 given period of months.

C. The method of payment of funds to each recipient of a scholarship grant shall be in accordance with rules formulated by the <u>Commission Department</u> governing the grants for each type of scholarship.

D. Each scholarship is renewable annually for the number of
years required to complete the course of study in which the
recipient is engaged. The Commission Department shall grant such an
annual renewal only upon the recipient's application and upon the
Commission's Department's finding that the recipient:

Has completed successfully the work of the preceding year
 and presented evidence that the recipient is a student in good
 standing;

15 2. Remains a resident of Oklahoma; and

3. Is in a financial situation that warrants the award of a
scholarship under the standards set forth in Section 625.1 et seq.
of this title.

E. The <u>Commission Department</u> shall make an annual report to the Governor and Legislature on the activities of the <u>Commission</u> <u>Department</u>. This report shall include the names of the recipients of the scholarships, the amount of the scholarship awards, an accounting of the funds expended on scholarships and on the administration of the program and a budget requesting the funds

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necessary for the operation of the Commission Department. The
 report shall also include an accounting of repayments of
 scholarships, whether by services or in cash including interest.
 SECTION 10. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.6, is
 amended to read as follows:

Section 625.6. Each applicant, before being granted a 6 7 scholarship, shall enter into a contract with the Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce agreeing to the terms and conditions 8 9 upon which the scholarship shall be granted to him the applicant. 10 Said contract shall include such terms and provisions as will carry 11 out the full purpose and intent of this act and the form thereof 12 shall be prepared and approved by the Attorney General. Said contracts The contract shall be signed by the Secretary of Commerce 13 and Tourism on behalf of the Commission Department and by the 14 15 applicant. The Commission Department is hereby vested with full and 16 complete authority and power to sue in its own name any applicant for any balance due the Commission Department on any contract. The 17 Commission Department shall have authority to cancel any contract 18 made between it and any recipient of a scholarship upon cause deemed 19 sufficient by the Commission Department. 20

21 SECTION 11. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.9, is 22 amended to read as follows:

Section 625.9. The administration of the Oklahoma Rural Medical
Education Loan and Scholarship Fund is hereby transferred to the

Physician Manpower Training Commission Oklahoma Department of
Commerce as established by law. All the powers, duties,
responsibilities, rules and regulations and functions of the Board
of Trustees of the Oklahoma Rural Medical Education Scholarship Fund
are hereby transferred to the Physician Manpower Training Commission
Department and The Board of Trustees of the Oklahoma Rural Medical
Education Scholarship Fund is hereby abolished and terminated.

8 SECTION 12. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.10a, is 9 amended to read as follows:

10 Section 625.10a. The Physician Manpower Training Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce is hereby authorized and empowered 11 12 to establish and administer cost-sharing scholarships and loan fund programs which shall provide for state assistance to and 13 participation with community physician education and scholarship 14 trust funds which are selected and approved by the Commission 15 Department. Said The state assistance and participation shall be on 16 a state and community matching formula basis for the funding of the 17 educational costs, fees and charges of a selected and qualified 18 student in good standing and who is duly enrolled in an accredited 19 college of medicine or college of osteopathic medicine and pursuing 20 a course of study leading to the degree of Doctor of Medicine or to 21 the degree of Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine. Said student shall be 22 a bona fide resident of the State of Oklahoma who desires and agrees 23 to practice his profession on completion of the course of study and 24

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1 training required for licensure and certification in the community 2 providing the initial funds to be matched by the state funds. 3 Communities shall deposit the initial trust funds with the Physician Manpower Training Commission Department to be administered and 4 5 matched by the Commission Department for the education of selected and qualified students to serve and to practice in the communities 6 7 with trust funds so established for that purpose with the Commission Department. The Commission Department shall aid and advise 8 9 communities in the selection of qualified students to participate in 10 a given community scholarship program and the Commission Department 11 shall approve the selection of a given student for a particular 12 community physician education scholarship trust fund matching program. The Commission Department shall determine the percentage 13 share for the state in the scholarship matching program with a given 14 15 community to educate a given and duly selected student on the basis of the extent of need of the community and its surrounding area for 16 the services of a practicing physician, the amount of the initial 17 trust funds the community has raised and deposited in the physician 18 education scholarship trust fund that is duly established and the 19 matching funds schedule developed by the Commission Department and 20 based upon both the population of the community determined by the 21 latest Federal Decennial Census and the estimated median family 22 annual income level as determined on the basis of the estimates of 23 24 the Oklahoma Department of Commerce. The state matching assistance

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1 and participation in a given scholarship trust fund program shall 2 not exceed seventy-five percent (75%) of the total amount calculated 3 to be necessary to fund the costs of a course of study for the degree of Doctor of Medicine or the degree of Doctor of Osteopathic 4 5 Medicine as determined annually by the Commission Department. Repayment of the total amount of the scholarship by the student on 6 7 completion of his course of study and on the establishment of his practice in the community shall be made to the state fund and to the 8 9 community trust fund in accordance with the percentage and total 10 amounts contributed by the state and by the community to the 11 matching scholarship trust fund program and in accordance with the provisions of Section 625.5 of this title and contract requirements 12 of Section 625.6 of this title which shall apply in all cases to 13 students participating in said community physician education 14 15 scholarship trust fund programs administered by the Commission Department with the exception of the maximum amount allowable in 16 payment to the student which shall be based on an annual review of 17 the costs, fees and charges of the school of medicine or school of 18 osteopathic medicine in which the student is enrolled and 19 participating which shall be made by the Commission Department. 20

The procedures, terms and conditions governing the scholarships and how they are administered shall be as prescribed and formulated by the Physician Manpower Training Commission Department but shall include the following:

Communities desiring to participate in a loan and
 scholarship program shall select a student who meets the
 requirements for participation and give notice to the Commission
 <u>Department</u>.

5 2. The <u>Commission Department</u> shall aid and advise communities 6 in the selection of qualified students to participate in a given 7 community loan and scholarship program.

3. The communities shall deposit with the <u>Commission Department</u> the initial year scholarship funds provided by the community which funds shall be a percentage of the total educational and associated costs of the student in the course of study in an accredited college of medicine or college of osteopathic medicine and which funds are to be used in the education of the selected student.

14 4. The <u>Commission Department</u> shall review and approve the 15 selection of a given student and shall then match the initial 16 community funds with state funds from the Oklahoma Community 17 Physician Education Loan and Scholarship Program Fund in the amount 18 needed to meet the total cost for educating the student for one (1) 19 year as agreed by the <u>Commission Department</u> and the community in 20 each particular case.

5. The Commission Department shall determine the percentage share for the state in the loan and scholarship program with a given community to educate a selected student on the basis of:

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a. the extent of need of the community and its
 surrounding area for the services of a practicing physician;

b. the amount of the initial trust funds the community has raised and deposited with the Commission Department for the education of a selected student;

c. the population of the community which shall be
determined on the basis of the current estimates made by the
<del>Oklahoma</del> Department <del>of Commerce</del>.

9 6. The state matching assistance and participation by the Commission Department in a given loan and scholarship program for a 10 particular student shall not exceed seventy-five percent (75%) of 11 12 the total amount calculated to be necessary to fund one (1) year of study for the degree of Doctor of Medicine or the degree of Doctor 13 of Osteopathic Medicine as determined annually by the Commission 14 Department at the school of medicine or osteopathic medicine in 15 which the selected student is enrolled. 16

7. Each scholarship recipient, upon completion of his course of 17 study, shall repay his loan and scholarship to the state and to the 18 community and receive forgiveness on repayment of the funds from the 19 state and from the community by practicing his profession in the 20 community in Oklahoma providing the initial funds at a minimum for 21 one (1) year for each Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) the 22 community and the state financed the scholarship program for the 23 student; provided, however, that the recipient will be given no 24

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credit for payment, repayment and reduction of said obligation to 1 2 the community and the state by serving the given community for a period less than two (2) years or, when approved by the Commission 3 Department in agreement with the community and terms of the 4 5 contracts involved, repayment may be made in cash with interest at the rate of twelve percent (12%) per annum, said interest to accrue 6 7 from the date each payment of funds pursuant to the loan and scholarship program is made. In addition, should a recipient who 8 9 accepts financial assistance after July 1, 1977, elect not to 10 perform his obligated service in the sponsoring community, the 11 agreed upon sum denoted as liquidated damages in the contract shall be assessed the recipient. No interest shall accrue on the 12 principal during any one period of time that the recipient thereof 13 is required to serve in the Armed Forces of the United States, or 14 during his internship or residency, if in a primary care area and 15 the required service, internship or residency does not exceed four 16 (4) years. Provided, that no interest shall accrue for six (6) 17 months following each of the above exceptions. 18

Each student who applies to participate in a community and state matching loan and scholarship program shall enter into a contract administered by the <u>Commission Department</u> on behalf of the state and a given community which has provided the initial scholarship funds to educate a selected student. The contract shall be between the State of Oklahoma and the selected student by which contract the

1 student agrees to return to the community which provided the initial 2 loan and scholarship funds and to practice his profession, on 3 completion of the course of study and training required for licensure and certification, for the number of years for which the 4 5 student received assistance from the community and the state and in accordance with the conditions specified in the contract agreed to 6 7 by the student and the given community which selected the student. Any repayment of the total amount of the scholarship or any portion 8 9 thereof as provided in this act and in the contract between the 10 state and the student shall be made to the state deposited into the 11 Community Matching Loan and Scholarship Repayment Revolving Fund 12 hereby created in the State Treasury. The community portion of any repayment monies deposited in said fund shall be withdrawn from the 13 revolving fund and returned to the community on request or, if the 14 15 community so chooses, said repayment monies shall be held available in said fund for reallocation by the community and the state to the 16 Community Physician Education Loan and Scholarship Program Fund to 17 educate another student selected by the community and approved by 18 the Commission Department. The form of the contracts shall be 19 20 prepared and approved by the Attorney General. The Commission Department is hereby vested with full and complete authority and 21 power to sue in its own name any applicant for any balance due the 22 Commission Department for repayment of the scholarship on any 23 contract or for failure by the applicant to fulfill the terms of his 24

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1 contract in any way. Said contracts shall be signed by the Chairman 2 of the Commission Executive Director of the Department and by the 3 student for and by a representative of the community which selected 4 the student. The Commission Department shall have authority to 5 cancel the contract it makes between the Commission Department and 6 any recipient of a scholarship upon cause deemed sufficient by the 7 Commission Department.

8 SECTION 13. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.11, is 9 amended to read as follows:

10 Section 625.11. There is hereby created and established the 11 Oklahoma Community Physician Education Scholarship Program Fund 12 which fund shall be administered by the Physician Manpower Training Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce for the purposes of 13 providing the state matching funds assistance for scholarship 14 programs with given communities. The Commission Department shall be 15 empowered to contract for services with any state agencies, 16 institutions or any public or private corporation involved in and 17 conducting programs in physician manpower placement in order that 18 the Commission Department may perform its functions in an efficient 19 and timely fashion. 20

21 SECTION 14. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.12, is 22 amended to read as follows:

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Section 625.12. A. A student may be eligible to apply for and
 be granted a scholarship under the community and state matching
 program when the following conditions are met:

That the student desires a scholarship to cover the costs
 and expenses of pursuing the degree of Doctor of Medicine or the
 degree of Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine at any accredited school of
 medicine or school of osteopathic medicine in the United States of
 America;

9 2. That the student is a bona fide resident of the State of10 Oklahoma;

3. That the student desires and agrees to practice his profession in the community in Oklahoma providing the initial funds and subject to the terms and conditions of the contract between the student and the community and the contract between the student and the state;

4. That the student is a person of good moral character;
5. That the student has a capacity to profit by the course of

18 study for which he seeks aid;

19 6. That the student has successfully completed the program of 20 instruction prerequisite for admission to or continuation in the 21 program of study provided for in this act and has applied and been 22 accepted or is currently a student at an accredited school of 23 medicine or school of osteopathic medicine;

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7. That the personal financial resources of the student are
 such that he can demonstrate need for assistance to pursue
 successfully the course of study in which he is engaged; and

8. That the student submits proof that he has not accepted or
will not accept any other scholarship assistance which has a
conflicting service obligation requirement.

7 In determining an applicant student's capacity to profit by the 8 course of study he desires to pursue, the <u>Commission Department</u> 9 shall consider his previous scholastic record, the results of 10 examinations conducted under the provisions of this act, and the 11 results of interviews and such other tests or examinations which the 12 <u>Commission</u> Department may deem advisable.

In establishing an applicant student's financial need, the Commission Department shall conduct a thorough and complete investigation of the financial resources of the applicant and his family.

B. The method of payment of funds to each student participating
in the scholarship program shall be in accordance with rules
formulated by the Commission Department governing the grants for
each type of scholarship involved.

C. Each scholarship shall be renegotiated annually by the <u>Commission Department</u> to determine if a change has occurred in the ability of the community to match funds at the agreed level or if a change has occurred in the student's financial need or desire to

1 practice in the community providing the initial funds. Each scholarship may be renewed annually for the number of years required 2 3 to complete the course of study in which the recipient is engaged. The Commission Department shall grant such an annual renewal only 4 5 upon the recipient's application and upon the Commission's Department's finding that the student has completed successfully the 6 7 work of the preceding year and presented evidence that he is a student in good standing, and that he remains a resident of 8 9 Oklahoma.

10SECTION 15.AMENDATORY70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.13, is11amended to read as follows:

12 Section 625.13. A. There is hereby created the "Community Match Rural Scholarship Incentive Program" which shall be conducted 13 and administered by the Physician Manpower Training Commission 14 15 Oklahoma Department of Commerce. The Physician Manpower Training Commission Department shall establish and administer a Family/General Practice Resident Rural 8 9 Scholarship Loan Program for the purpose of assisting Oklahoma's 10 rural communities by providing financial assistance through a 11 scholarship loan forgiveness program to residents enrolled in an 12 accredited Family Practice or General Practice residency program. The Commission Department shall establish the eligibility standards, 13 the amount of the loan not to exceed One Thousand Dollars 14 15 (\$1,000.00) per month, the service obligation of the recipient of the loan, and any penalties related to the breach of the service 16 contract or failure to repay such loan plus interest and penalty. 17

C. The Physician Manpower Training Commission Department shall establish and administer a Family/General Practice Residency Grant Program for the purpose of assisting Oklahoma's rural communities by providing financial assistance through a grant program to residents enrolled in an accredited Family Practice or General Practice residency program. The Commission Department shall establish the eligibility standards, the amount of the grant not to exceed Five

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1 Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) per year, up to three (3) years, the 2 program obligations of the recipient of the grant, and any penalties 3 related to the breach of the grant obligations or failure to repay 4 the grant plus interest.

5 SECTION 16. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 625.14, is 6 amended to read as follows:

7 Section 625.14. There is hereby re-created the Physician 12 Manpower Training Commission, hereafter referred to as the Commission, The Oklahoma Department of Commerce is authorized to 13 establish and administer cost-sharing programs for internship and 14 15 residency physician training, which Commission the Department shall provide for state assistance by sharing the cost on a percentage 16 basis, as may be prescribed by law or as determined by the 17 Commission Department, of the salary, fringe benefits, training and 18 program administration of the interns and residents as may be 19 arranged by contract for reimbursement with an accredited and 20 approved hospital and accredited clinical programs throughout the 21 state in cooperation with the Oklahoma State University College of 22 Osteopathic Medicine, which physician training institutions in the 23 state shall serve as the administrative agent for internship and 24

15 Section 697.5. The Physician Manpower Training Commission 16 Oklahoma Department of Commerce, in order to perform its official 17 function in establishing and administering physician training 18 programs, shall have the following specific powers, duties and 19 responsibilities:

To review all available data on physician manpower in
 Oklahoma in order to determine the current and projected
 distribution of physicians by geographic location and by type of
 practice, and, to accomplish this review, the Commission Department
 shall obtain information from and work in conjunction with the State

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Department of Health and all other agencies which gather data and
 evaluate health manpower needs;

3 2. To review data and information on accredited physician internship and residency programs currently operated by Oklahoma 4 5 hospitals and other approved clinical situations, in order to ascertain the number and distribution by physician specialty 6 7 training and by geographic location of available internship and residency positions and to evaluate the impact of internship and 8 9 residency placement on the establishment of practices by physicians 10 in that geographic area or similar areas within the state where 11 their services are urgently needed;

To serve as an agent to advise hospitals, clinics, and communities on setting up and planning internship and residency programs which emphasize the provision of additional primary care physicians to service the rural areas of Oklahoma with primary care specialties to be defined to include training in the area of internal medicine, obstetrics and gynecology, pediatrics, emergency trauma, and family practice;

19 4. To provide general counsel and advice in the development, 20 operation and evaluation of physician internship and residency 21 programs throughout the State of Oklahoma in cooperation with the 22 efforts of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and the 23 state's physician training institutions such as the Oklahoma 24 University College of Medicine, Oklahoma City and Tulsa campuses,

1 and the Oklahoma College of Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery, and 2 subject to accreditation by official and appropriate accrediting 3 agencies;

In order for any hospital or clinic to be eligible to receive funds through the Physician Manpower Training Commission Oklahoma Department of Commerce for residency or internship positions, such hospital or clinic shall affirm that students receiving their medical education in Oklahoma will be given special consideration for all residency and internship positions.

If a person receiving Nursing Student Assistance Program 17 funds fails to fully comply with the provisions of the contract for 18 said funds, the person shall refund to the Physician Manpower 19 Training Commission Department all monies received by the person 20 pursuant to the provisions of the contract plus interest at the rate 21 of twelve percent (12%) from the date of disbursement of said funds 22 and shall be liable for any other liquidated damages as specified in 23 the contract. 24

1 D. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving 2 fund for the Physician Manpower Training Commission Department to be 3 designated the "Nursing Student Assistance Fund". The Office of Administrative Rules in the Secretary of State's office shall provide adequate notice in the Oklahoma Register of the transfer of such rules, and shall place the
