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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 100 of Title 56, unless there is
18	created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	As used in this act:
20	1. "Health and Human Services agency" shall mean an agency
21	under the jurisdiction of the Secretary of Health and Human Services
22	pursuant to the provisions of an Executive Order issued by the
23	Governor;

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2. "Health and Human Services Ombudsman" shall mean the ombudsman position created pursuant to Section 2 of this act;

- 3. "Office" shall mean the Office of the Health and Human Services Ombudsman;
- 4. "Secretary" shall mean the Secretary of Health and Human Services.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 101 of Title 56, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. The Secretary of Health and Human Services shall establish a plan to create the Office of the Health and Human Services

  Ombudsman. Such plan shall include a phased transition of independent oversight and investigatory responsibilities from all agencies within the jurisdiction of the Secretary to the Office, as allowed by law, along with sufficient staffing and funding support.

  The Office shall be created on or before January 1, 2017.
  - B. The Office of the Health and Human Services Ombudsman shall have the power and duty to:
  - 1. Serve as the single entity for all duties relating to complaints against Health and Human Services agencies and the accountability of such agencies;
  - 2. Serve as a referral and information source for persons seeking to file a grievance or complaint with regards to a Health and Human Services agency;

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3. Advise and assist the Governor and the Legislature in developing policies to meet the needs of persons receiving services from a Health and Human Services agency;

- 4. Assist agencies in meeting the requirements of state or federal laws relating to compliance, appeals procedures and accountability functions;
- 5. Conduct independent investigations into claims of fraud, waste or abuse by a Health and Human Services agency or program; and
- 6. Deliver an annual, independent report of the Office's investigations and findings to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Governor.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 102 of Title 56, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. The Governor shall appoint, with the advice and consent of the Senate, a Health and Human Services Ombudsman. The Ombudsman shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor. Such appointment shall be subject to Senate confirmation within thirty (30) days after the appointment or the convening of the next legislative session if the Legislature is not in session on the date of the appointment.
- B. The Governor shall fix the compensation of the Ombudsman and delegate to him or her such other powers and duties deemed appropriate. The Ombudsman, subject to the approval of the

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Secretary, shall appoint and fix the compensation of employees and
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    direct the work of staff in performing the functions of the Office
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    and accomplishing the purposes of the Office.
        SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2016.
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
