7	An Act relating to weather tracking licensure;
8	creating the Oklahoma Emergency Weather Response and Tracking Regulatory Act of 2025; providing short
9	title; defining terms; establishing certain requirements for media outlets; establishing certain
10	requirements for certain institutions of higher education; requiring certain fees; establishing
11	certain violations; promulgating certain rules; creating the Severe Weather Tracker Licensure Fund;
12	providing requirements for certain vehicles; authorizing certain actions; providing certain
13	exceptions; establishing fines for certain violations; providing for codification; providing an
14	effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 19-300 of Title 47, unless there
19	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
21	Emergency Weather Response and Tracking Regulatory Act of 2025".
22	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 19-301 of Title 47, unless there
24 4	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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As used in this act:

1. "Professional severe weather tracker" means a licensed individual or company hired or contracted with by a qualified media outlet or affiliated with a research program at a qualified institution of higher education;

<sup>7</sup> by the Federal Communications Commission for the broadcast or
<sup>8</sup> transmission of television programming via broadcast, cable,
<sup>9</sup> streaming, or other platforms as recognized by the Federal
<sup>10</sup> Communications Commission;

11 3. "Qualified institution of higher education" means any 12 college or university regulated by the Oklahoma State Regents for 13 Higher Education that offers a course or program in meteorology; and 14 4. "Significant weather event" means:

15 a day of enhanced, moderate, or high risk conditions a. 16 in one or more counties located in this state by the 17 National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's 18 National Weather Service Storm Prediction Center, 19 b. any tornado or severe thunderstorm watch issued by the 20 National Weather Service or the chief meteorologist 21 employed by a qualified media outlet, 22 any storm in one or more counties located in this с. 23 state, or anticipated to enter this state, for which a 24 tornado or thunderstorm warning has been issued by the \_ \_

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National Weather Service or the chief meteorologist employed by a qualified media outlet,

- 3 d. a blizzard warning, ice storm warning, winter weather 4 advisory, winter storm warning, or winter storm watch 5 as declared by the National Weather Service or the 6 chief meteorologist employed by a qualified media 7 outlet,
- 8 e. a red flag fire warning declared by the National
   9 Weather Service or the Forestry Services Division of
   10 the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and
   11 Forestry, or
- 12 f. a flash flood warning or flood warning issued by the 13 National Weather Service or the chief meteorologist 14 employed by a qualified media outlet.

SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 19-302 of Title 47, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Service Oklahoma shall be authorized to create a
 professional severe weather tracker license.

B. Any professional severe weather tracker employed or
 contracted with by any qualified media outlet shall:

22 1. Cause a copy of his or her license issued by Service
23 Oklahoma to be kept on file with the outlet;

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Cause to be displayed on both sides of every primary vehicle
 utilized by the professional severe weather tracker, the license
 number issued by Service Oklahoma, and the Federal Communications
 Commission license number of the qualified media outlet with whom
 the tracker maintains the employment or contractual relationship;
 Bass a criminal background check;

<sup>8</sup> meteorologist of the qualified media outlet stating the belief of
<sup>9</sup> such meteorologist that the prospective professional severe weather
<sup>10</sup> tracker possesses the knowledge, experience, and training to
<sup>11</sup> exercise the powers and duties of the license responsibly; and

12 5. Provide to Service Oklahoma a copy of valid and continuing 13 insurance coverage for every primary vehicle utilized by the 14 professional severe weather tracker.

C. Any professional severe weather tracker employed, contracted with, or otherwise affiliated with any qualified institution of higher education shall:

18 1. Cause a copy of his or her license issued by Service 19 Oklahoma to be kept on file with the dean, director, or other 20 designated individual of the institution who shall be responsible 21 for the maintenance of records associated with the institution's 22 meteorology program;

23 2. Cause to be displayed on both sides of every primary vehicle
24 utilized by the professional severe weather tracker, the license

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<sup>1</sup> number issued by Service Oklahoma, as well as an identifying number <sup>2</sup> developed by Service Oklahoma for the qualified institution of <sup>3</sup> higher education;

3. Pass a criminal background check;

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4. Supply Service Oklahoma with a letter from the dean,
director, or other designated individual of the institution who
shall be responsible for the maintenance of records associated with
the institution's meteorology program stating the belief of such
person that the prospective professional severe weather tracker
possesses the knowledge, experience, and training to exercise the
powers and duties of the license responsibly; and

12 5. Provide to Service Oklahoma a copy of valid and continuing 13 insurance coverage for every primary vehicle utilized by the 14 professional severe weather tracker.

15 The fees for a license issued pursuant to this section shall D. 16 not exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per year for the initial 17 application, shall expire at the end of the calendar year, and may 18 be renewed annually for Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00). Such 19 fees shall be deposited into the Severe Weather Tracker Licensure 20 Fund created pursuant to Section 4 of this act and shall be utilized 21 by Service Oklahoma for the administration of the provisions of this 22 act.

E. Service Oklahoma may issue a letter of reprimand, cancel, suspend, revoke, refuse to issue, or refuse to renew the license of

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1 an operator when it finds the licensee or applicant has violated any 2 of the provisions of this act or any rules adopted by Service 3 Oklahoma. A suspension shall be for a period of time deemed 4 appropriate by Service Oklahoma for the violation. Any canceled, 5 suspended, or revoked license shall be returned to Service Oklahoma 6 by the licensee, and the licensee shall not be eligible to apply for 7 another license until the period of suspension or revocation has 8 elapsed.

9 F. Service Oklahoma shall promulgate rules for the
10 implementation of this act.

SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 19-303 of Title 47, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

14 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund 15 for Service Oklahoma to be designated the "Severe Weather Tracker 16 Licensure Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject 17 to fiscal year limitations. All monies accruing to the credit of 18 the fund are hereby appropriated and shall be budgeted and expended 19 by Service Oklahoma for the restricted purposes of the monies as 20 prescribed by law. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon 21 warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as 22 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and 23 Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

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SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 19-304 of Title 47, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Primary vehicles utilized by a professional severe weather
 tracker shall:

6 1. Display markings clearly identifying such vehicle as being 7 utilized for severe weather tracking and identifying the qualified 8 media outlet or institution of higher education with which the 9 tracker is affiliated; and

Be authorized to be equipped and to use the visual signals
 described in Section 12-218 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

B. Once the conditions of a significant weather event have been met, a professional severe weather tracker may:

Activate the visual signals authorized for use in this act;
 Be considered an emergency vehicle for the purposes of this
 act; and

17 3. Travel upon roads, highways, and country roads closed by the 18 Department of Transportation, the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority, any 19 city or county, or any law enforcement agency by reason of 20 conditions triggered by the significant weather event.

C. Upon instruction by any law enforcement officer, a
professional severe weather tracker shall provide a copy of his or
her license issued by Service Oklahoma. Failure to comply shall be

D. The provisions of this section shall not limit the liability
 of a professional severe weather tracker.

5 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 6 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 19-305 of Title 47, unless there 7 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any professional severe weather tracker found to be in violation of the provisions of this act may be subject to a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or revocation of his or her license by Service Oklahoma. Such fine or revocation shall be in addition to any criminal or civil penalties the tracker may be subject to for the violation of the laws of this state.

SECTION 7. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.

SECTION 8. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
