AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 281, O.S.L. 14 2023 (70 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 5-148.1), is amended to read as 15 follows: 16 Section 5-148.1. A. The State Department of Education shall 17 establish and maintain a three-year pilot program known as the 18 School Resource Officer Program. 19 School resource officers employed or contracted by school В. 20 districts participating in the School Resource Officer Program shall 21 successfully complete law enforcement active shooter emergency 22 response training given by the Council on Law Enforcement Education 23 and Training (CLEET) and approved by the Oklahoma Department of

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Public Safety.

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- C. For purposes of this section, "school resource officer" means $\frac{1}{2}$:
- 1. A law enforcement officer with sworn authority and training in school-based law enforcement and crisis response;
- 2. An individual who has completed the basic peace officer academy and has been trained in school-based law enforcement and crisis response; or
- 3. An individual who has a valid firearm license pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act, completes a program established by the local sheriff that includes one hundred thirty-six (136) total hours of comprehensive firearm safety and proficiency training which shall include:
 - eighty (80) hours of firearms instruction based on the program established by the Council on Law Enforcement

 Education and Training (CLEET) which must include at least ten percent (10%) but no more than twenty

 percent (20%) more rounds fired than what is associated with CLEET training, and the program participant must achieve an eighty-five percent (85%) pass rate on the firearms training,
 - <u>b.</u> <u>sixteen (16) hours of instruction in National Rifle</u>

 Association Precision Pistol or equivalent training,
 - eight (8) hours of discretionary shooting instruction
 using state-of-the-art simulator exercises,

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d. sixteen (16) hours of instruction in active shooter or
assailant scenarios,
<u>e.</u> <u>eight (8) hours of instruction in defensive tactics,</u>
$\underline{\text{f.}}$ four (4) hours of instruction in legal issues, and
g. four (4) hours of mental health awareness training
related to working with children and students,
who has been trained in school-based law enforcement and crisis
response and completes ongoing training on an annual basis through
the local sheriff's office, and who is assigned by an employing law
enforcement agency or school district to work collaboratively with
one or more schools using community-oriented policing concepts.
SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
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
