1 O.S. 2021, Section 4104, which relates to powers and responsibilities of the Commission; modifying and adding certain powers and responsibilities; 2 transferring certain oversight responsibilities; creating the position and providing duties of the 3 Capitol Architect and curator; establishing the State Capitol Preservation Office; providing powers and 4 duties of the Executive Director and of the Office; 5 amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4108, which relates to application of act; expanding applicability of certain law; directing the Oklahoma Arts Council to 6 be responsible for certain art; authorizing certain events; providing procedures for receiving funds; 7 amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4109, which relates to exemptions from the Public Competitive Bidding Act of 8 1974; adding certain project exemptions; repealing 74 9 O.S. 2021, Sections 4106 and 4107, which relate to cooperation between commission and branches of state government and compliance with certain administrative 10 requirements; making language gender neutral; providing for codification; and declaring an 11 emergency. 12 13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 14 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1104.18, is 15 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY amended to read as follows: 16 Section 1104.18. A. Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) of the fee 17 authorized by Section 1135.5 of this title for the Oklahoma State 18 Capitol Restoration License Plate shall be deposited in the Oklahoma 19 Friends of the Capitol License Plate Revolving Fund created in 20 subsection B of this section. 21 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving 22 в. fund for the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to be 23 designated the "Oklahoma Friends of the Capitol License Plate 24

1 Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received 2 by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services pursuant to the 3 provisions of subsection A of this section. All monies accruing to 4 5 the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and shall be budgeted and expended by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for 6 restoration and modification of the Oklahoma State Capitol. Before 7 the Office makes any expenditure from the fund, the expenditure 8 9 shall be approved by the State Capitol Preservation Commission created pursuant to Section 4102 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma 10 Statutes. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants 11 12 issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise 13 Services for approval and payment. 14

15 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 73 O.S. 2021, Section 15.4, is 16 amended to read as follows:

Section 15.4. A. There is hereby authorized the creation of a not-for-profit corporation to be known as "Friends of the Capitol" to raise funds and to assist in the preservation and enhancement of the Oklahoma Capitol and surrounding areas as defined in Section <del>1</del> of this title <u>4101 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes</u>.

B. The board of directors of the corporation authorized insubsection A of this section shall choose its own chairperson.

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C. After proper incorporation, the not-for-profit corporation
 is authorized and directed to apply for tax-exempt status under
 Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (26 U.S.C., Section
 501(c)(3)).

5 D. In addition to funds received from the general public or 6 other public and private sources, the not-for-profit corporation may 7 receive funds from state agencies at such times and in such amounts 8 as may be appropriated by the Legislature for the Oklahoma Capitol 9 or made available to the corporation from state agencies from their 10 sources of revenue.

E. Costs to underwrite activities related to the preservation and enhancement of the Oklahoma Capitol may be borne from revenues of the not-for-profit corporation.

F. Upon the incorporation, the not-for-profit corporation shall be authorized to hire staff and name advisory groups or steering committees as necessary to assist in the preservation and enhancement of the Oklahoma Capitol.

G. The corporation shall coordinate preservation and,
<u>restoration</u>, enhancement, <u>maintenance</u>, and <u>modification</u> projects in
conjunction with and the <u>consent approval</u> of the <u>State</u> Capitol
Preservation Commission and the Office of Management and Enterprise
Services.

23 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 73 O.S. 2021, Section 83.1, is 24 amended to read as follows:

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1 Section 83.1. A. There is hereby re-created to continue until July 1, 2022 2026, in accordance with the Oklahoma Sunset Law, a 2 Capitol-Medical Center Improvement and Zoning Commission to exercise 3 the functions and perform the duties hereinafter prescribed. 4 5 в. The Commission shall be composed of eleven (11) members as follows: 6 1. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise 7 Services or his or her designee, who shall be ex officio chair of 8 9 the Capitol-Medical Center Improvement and Zoning Commission; 2. The Director of the Transportation Commission or his or her 10 designee; 11 3. The President of the University of Oklahoma or his or her 12 designee; 13 4. Two members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the 14 15 Senate; Two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of 5. 16 Representatives; 17 The Chair of the Planning Commission of Oklahoma City or his 6. 18 or her designee; 19 7. The Chair of the Long-Range Capital Planning Commission 20 Capitol Liaison or his or her designee; and 21 Two members of the Commission appointed by the Governor, 8. 22 with the advice and consent of the State Senate, for four-year 23 24

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1 staggered terms with one term expiring on January 31 of each even-2 numbered year.

## C. One of the two members shall be appointed upon the

4 recommendation of the Citizens' Advisory Committee. The Commission 5 is authorized to appoint and hire a Director, who shall serve as the 6 chief administrative officer of the Commission, and other necessary 7 personnel.

8 The Attorney General of the State of Oklahoma this state shall 9 be the legal advisor to the Commission in the same capacity as he or 10 she is to other boards and commissions.

D. At least one of the members <u>One member</u> appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and <u>one member appointed by</u> the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall be a resident within the boundaries of the Capitol-Medical Center Improvement and Zoning District as set forth in Section 83 of this title.

16 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 93 of Title 73, unless there is 18 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

19 The Department of Public Safety shall create a security plan for 20 the Capitol and Capitol grounds and the Governor's Mansion. The 21 plan shall be submitted to the Capitol Preservation Commission for 22 review and approval. A new plan shall be submitted every three (3) 23 years.

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The department shall coordinate with the Office of Management
 and Enterprise Services to implement and staff the approved security
 plan.

4 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 73 O.S. 2021, Section 176, is 5 amended to read as follows:

Section 176. A. There shall be established created within the 6 Legislative Service Bureau the position of a permanent legislative 7 liaison Capitol Liaison committee, composed of three (3) members 8 9 from each house, appointed by the President Pro Tempore and Speaker, 10 respectively to the Capitol Preservation Commission. The legislative liaison Capitol Liaison committee will shall keep the 11 12 Legislature properly advised as to the activities of the Oklahoma 13 Capitol Improvement Authority and the Office of Management and Enterprise Services by making such reports as they deem the Capitol 14 Liaison deems necessary to the appropriate committees and leadership 15 of both houses. All legislative studies concerning the 16 responsibilities or activities of the Oklahoma Capitol Improvement 17 Authority or the Office of Management and Enterprise Services and 18 all studies of activities or projects relating to the Oklahoma State 19 Capitol Complex shall be considered by presented to the liaison 20 committee created Capitol Liaison authorized by this section. The 21 Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority and the Office of Management 22 and Enterprise Services shall notify the membership of the 23 legislative liaison Capitol Liaison committee in advance of any 24

1 meeting in which official or formal action is to be taken by 2 furnishing the proposed agenda in writing at least twenty-four (24) 3 hours in advance of such meeting.

B. The Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority and the Office of
Management and Enterprise Services shall provide such information,
records, testimony, or recommendations as the committee Capitol
Liaison may require.

8 <u>C. The Capitol Liaison responsibilities shall include serving</u> 9 <u>as the primary contact for Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)</u> 10 <u>compliance for the Capitol.</u>

D. All proposals for enhancement, modification, preservation,
 or restoration of the Capitol and Capitol grounds, and the
 Governor's Mansion and grounds, shall be submitted to the Liaison.
 The Liaison shall submit all proposals to the Capitol Preservation
 <u>Commission for approval.</u>
 <u>E. All proposals for space allocation in the Capitol and</u>

17 parking allocation shall be submitted to the Liaison. The Liaison

18 shall submit all proposals to the Capitol Preservation Commission

19 for approval.

F. All proposals for security modifications and enhancements by agencies, the Senate, or House of Representatives shall be submitted to the Liaison. The Liaison shall submit all proposals to the

- 23 <u>Capitol Preservation Commission for approval.</u>
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1G. The Capitol Liaison shall be the primary liaison for all2tenants that occupy space in the Capitol.

3 SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 73 O.S. 2021, Section 345, is 4 amended to read as follows:

5 Section 345. A. In addition to any other authorization provided by law, the Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority is 6 authorized to issue obligations to acquire real property, together 7 with improvements located thereon, and personal property to 8 9 construct improvements to real property and to provide funding for 10 repairs, refurbishments and improvements to real and personal property of the State Capitol Building in a total amount not to 11 12 exceed One Hundred Twenty Million Dollars (\$120,000,000.00). The funds shall be used for the renovation, repair and remodeling of the 13 State Capitol Building. 14

The Authority may hold title to the property and 15 Β. improvements until such time as any obligations issued for this 16 purpose are retired or defeased and may lease the property and 17 improvements to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services. 18 Upon final redemption or defeasance of the obligations created 19 pursuant to this section, title to the property and improvements 20 shall be transferred from the Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority 21 to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services. 22

C. For the purposes of paying the costs for construction of thereal property and improvements, and providing funding for the

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1 project authorized in subsection A of this section, and for the purpose authorized in subsection D of this section, the Authority is 2 hereby authorized to borrow monies on the credit of the income and 3 revenues to be derived from the leasing of such property and 4 5 improvements and, in anticipation of the collection of such income 6 and revenues, to issue negotiable obligations in a total amount not to exceed One Hundred Twenty Million Dollars (\$120,000,000.00) 7 whether issued in one or more series. The Authority is authorized 8 9 to capitalize interest on the obligations issued pursuant to this 10 section for a period of not to exceed one (1) year from the date of issuance. For subsequent fiscal years, it is the intent of the 11 12 Legislature to appropriate to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services sufficient monies to make rental payments for 13 the purpose of retiring the obligations created pursuant to this 14 To the extent funds are available from the proceeds of the 15 section. borrowing authorized by this subsection, the Oklahoma Capitol 16 Improvement Authority shall provide for the payment of professional 17 fees and associated costs related to the project authorized in 18 subsection A of this section. 19

D. The Authority may issue obligations in one or more series and in conjunction with other issues of the Authority. The Authority is authorized to hire bond counsel, financial consultants, and such other professionals as it may deem necessary to provide for the efficient sale of the obligations and may utilize a portion of

1 the proceeds of any borrowing to create such reserves as may be 2 deemed necessary and to pay costs associated with the issuance and 3 administration of such obligations.

The obligations authorized under this section may be sold at 4 Ε. 5 either competitive or negotiated sale, as determined by the Authority, and in such form and at such prices as may be authorized 6 by the Authority. The Authority may enter into agreements with such 7 credit enhancers and liquidity providers as may be determined 8 9 necessary to efficiently market the obligations. The obligations 10 may mature and have such provisions for redemption as shall be determined by the Authority, but in no event shall the final 11 12 maturity of such obligations occur later than ten (10) years from the first principal maturity date. 13

F. Any interest earnings on funds or accounts created for the purposes of this section may be utilized as partial payment of the annual debt service or for the purposes directed by the Authority.

G. The obligations issued under this section, the transfer thereof and the interest earned on such obligations, including any profit derived from the sale thereof, shall not be subject to taxation of any kind by the State of Oklahoma this state, or by any county, municipality or political subdivision therein.

H. The Authority may direct the investment of all monies in any
funds or accounts created in connection with the offering of the
obligations authorized under this section. Such investments shall

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be made in a manner consistent with the investment guidelines of the State Treasurer. The Authority may place additional restrictions on the investment of such monies if necessary to enhance the marketability of the obligations.

5	I. There is hereby created a State Capitol Repair Expenditure
6	Oversight Committee. The proceeds from the sale of obligations
7	issued pursuant to the provisions of this section and Section 1 of
8	Enrolled House Bill No. 3168 of the 2nd Session of the 55th Oklahoma
9	Legislature that are needed for repairs to the interior and exterior
10	of the State Capitol shall be subject to the approval of the State
11	Capitol Repair Expenditure Oversight Committee; provided, however,
12	the expenditure of those proceeds shall be subject to a request for
13	proposal process.
14	The Committee shall be composed of nine (9) members as follows:
15	1. Three persons to be appointed by the Governor, one of whom
16	shall serve as chair of the Committee;
17	2. Three legislators to be appointed by the Speaker of the
18	House of Representatives, two of whom shall be members of the
19	majority political party and one of whom shall be a member of the

20 minority political party; and

3. Three legislators to be appointed by the President Pro
Tempore of the Senate, two of whom shall be members of the majority
political party and one of whom shall be a member of the minority
political party. Five members of the Committee shall constitute a

1	quorum and the vote of five members shall be necessary for any
2	action taken by the Committee. The Committee shall be staffed by
3	employees of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services. The
4	Committee shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.
5	J. The Committee shall deliver a preliminary plan for the
6	renovation, repair and remodeling of the State Capitol to the
7	Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services no
8	later than December 31, 2014. The preliminary plan shall include
9	the following components:
10	1. Establishment of the Office of Management and Enterprise
11	Services' goal and criteria for use by the vendor; and
12	2. Selection criteria for the design-build team vendor to be
13	selected through a Request For Proposal process.
14	K. Following receipt of the preliminary plan as approved by the
15	Committee, the Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall
16	solicit Requests For Proposals to select the vendor for the project.
17	L. The Committee shall deliver a final plan to the Director of
18	the Office of Management and Enterprise Services no later than June
19	30, 2015. The final plan shall include the following components:
20	1. Approval of the final scope of work developed by the vendor;
21	and
22	2. Approval of the project phasing developed by the vendor.
23	M. Following delivery of the final plan, the Committee shall
24	continue to oversee the expenditure of proceeds from the sale of

obligations issued pursuant to the provisions of this section and
Section 1 of Enrolled House Bill No. 3168 of the 2nd Session of the
55th Legislature, until completion of the renovation, repair and
remodeling of the State Capitol. The Committee may also propose and
approve amendments to the plan as it deems appropriate.

N. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise 6 Services shall have responsibility to substantially implement the 7 plan as presented by the Committee; provided, the President Pro 8 9 Tempore of the Senate or the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall approve all proposed designs related to renovation, repair and 10 remodeling of space within the State Capitol Building under the 11 management and control of the Legislature and allocated to that 12 13 officer's house of the Legislature pursuant to the provisions of Section 15.1 of this title, and any subsequent changes to such 14 plans. Joint approval of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate 15 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall be required 16 17 for such plans for space under the management and control of the Legislature and not allocated to a specific house of the 18 Legislature. Such approval shall be in writing. 19 O. Insofar as they are not in conflict with the provisions of 20 this section, the provisions of Section 151 et seq. of this title 21 shall apply to this section. 22 SECTION 7. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4101, is 23 amended to read as follows: 24

Section 4101. As used in Sections 4101 through 4108 4110.1 of
 this title:

3 1. "Public areas" means those areas in the Capitol open to the4 general public for general visitation; and

2. "Art" means fine art of museum quality representing the
highest quality of art objects available to include paintings,
<u>murals</u>, graphic arts, art photography and sculpture, aesthetically
aligned with recognized values, created by the conscious use of
skill and creative imagination-;

10 <u>3. "Design standards" means a document that is produced for the</u> 11 <u>purpose of guiding review of proposed alterations to the Capitol,</u> 12 Governor's Mansion, and respective grounds.

13 Design standards set the acceptable level of finishes for the

14 historic fabric, features, and materials in use in the Capitol.

15 This document establishes specifications for alterations which,

16 if followed, will provide compatible design;

17 <u>4. "Enhancement" means an increase or improvement upon the</u>
18 quality, value, or extent of the original design intent of the

19 Capitol, Governor's Mansion, or the respective grounds;

20 <u>5. "Grounds" means all land surrounding the State Capitol and</u> 21 <u>bordered by Lincoln Boulevard, and the land contained within the</u> 22 <u>fence line surrounding the Governor's Mansion;</u>

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1	6. "Maintenance" means keeping spaces, structures, and
2	infrastructure in proper operating condition in a routine,
3	scheduled, or anticipated fashion to prevent failure or degradation;
4	7. "Modification" means any change to an existing physical
5	attribute of the Capitol, Governor's Mansion, or the respective
6	grounds;
7	8. "Preservation" means the act or process of applying measures
8	necessary to sustain the existing form, integrity, and materials of
9	a historic property. Work including preliminary measures to protect
10	and stabilize the property, generally focusing upon the ongoing
11	maintenance and repair of historic materials and features, rather
12	than extensive replacement and new construction; and
13	9. "Restoration" means the act or process of accurately
14	depicting the form, features, and character of the Capitol as the
15	building appeared in 1917, and dome in 2002, by means of the removal
16	of features from later periods in its history and reconstruction of
17	missing features from the restoration period.
18	SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4102, is
19	amended to read as follows:
20	Section 4102. There is hereby re-created, to continue until
21	July 1, 2024 July 1, 2026, in accordance with the provisions of the
22	Oklahoma Sunset Law, the State Capitol Preservation Commission which
23	shall be responsible for planning and supervising the preservation
24	and restoration of the interior and exterior of the State Capitol

1	Building, hereinafter referred to as the Capitol, and the Governor's
2	Mansion. The Commission shall <del>control</del> <u>approve</u> the display of art
3	objects in public areas of the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion.
4	The State Capitol Preservation Commission shall provide the highest
5	quality maintenance, restoration, preservation, enhancement, and
6	modification of and long-term planning for the interior and exterior
7	of the State Capitol, hereinafter referred to as the Capitol,
8	Governor's Mansion, and the respective grounds for the perpetual use
9	by the state government and the enjoyment of all persons.
10	SECTION 9. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4103, is
11	amended to read as follows:
12	Section 4103. A. The State Capitol Preservation Commission
13	shall be composed of <del>fifteen (15)</del> <u>fourteen (14)</u> members as follows:
14	1. Three members shall be appointed by the The Governor, or
15	designee;
16	2. <del>Three members shall be appointed by the</del> <u>The</u> President Pro
17	Tempore of the Senate, or designee;
18	3. <del>Three members shall be appointed by the</del> <u>The</u> Speaker of the
19	House of Representatives, or designee;
20	4. <del>One member shall be appointed by the</del> <u>The</u> Chief Justice of
21	the <del>Oklahoma</del> Supreme Court, or designee; and
22	5. One member of the Senate appointed by the President Pro
23	Tempore of the Senate;
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1	6. One former senator appointed by the President Pro Tempore of
2	the Senate;
3	7. One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the
4	Speaker of the House of Representatives;
5	8. One former member of the House of Representatives appointed
6	by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
7	9. The Secretary of State; and
8	<u>10.</u> The following shall be ex officio <u>nonvoting</u> members:
9	a. <del>Chairman</del> <u>Executive Director</u> of the Oklahoma Arts
10	Council <u>, or designee</u> ,
11	b. <del>President</del> <u>Executive Director</u> of the Oklahoma
12	Historical Society, or designee,
13	c. Capitol Architect and Curator,
14	d. <del>Superintendent of the Capitol</del> Capitol Liaison, and
15	e. Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
16	Services or a designee.
17	B. The initial term of office of the appointed members shall be
18	as follows:
19	1. One of the members appointed by the Governor, the President
20	Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
21	Representatives, and the member appointed by the Chief Justice of
22	the Oklahoma Supreme Court shall serve a one-year term;
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1	2. One of the members appointed by the Governor, the President
2	Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of
3	Representatives shall serve a three-year term; and
4	3. One of the members appointed by the Governor, the President
5	Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of
6	Representatives shall serve a five-year term.
7	The term of office for each successor shall be for five (5)
8	years. Any member of the Legislature who is appointed to the
9	Commission shall serve only as long as the member is a member of the
10	respective house from which the member was appointed. All appointed
11	voting and ex officio non-voting members of the State Capitol
12	Preservation Commission shall serve at the pleasure of their
13	appointing authority.
14	C. The Commission shall elect a chair and a vice-chair from its
15	membership to serve for a period of two (2) years. The first chair
16	of the Commission shall be the Governor, or designee, who shall
17	serve a term of two (2) years. Thereafter, the chair of the
18	Commission shall rotate between the President Pro Tempore of the
19	Senate, or designee, Speaker of the House of Representatives, or
20	designee, and the Governor, or designee, for two-year increments in
21	perpetuity. Members of the Commission shall not be compensated
22	except for reimbursement as provided in the State Travel
23	Reimbursement Act.

1	D. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall make
2	the necessary arrangements for support services for the State
3	Capitol Preservation Commission. The State Capitol Preservation
4	Commission shall meet at least once per quarter and at the call of
5	the chair as needed. A quorum of the voting members shall be
6	present for any action taken. A quorum is the majority of the
7	appointed voting members. The Commission shall be subject to the
8	Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.
9	E. The Commission functions performed by the Governor,
10	President Pro Tempore of the Senate, Speaker of the House of
11	Representatives, Secretary of State, and appointed senators and
12	representatives are additional functions of their other public
13	offices and duties.
14	SECTION 10. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4104, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	Section 4104. A. The State Capitol Preservation Commission
17	shall provide oversight to the Capitol Liaison and the Office of
18	Management and Enterprise Services on duties for management and
19	maintenance of the State Capitol and shall:
20	1. Research, plan, and have control of modifications and decor
21	of the interior and exterior of the Capitol and the Governor's
22	Mansion Approve the maintenance, restoration, preservation,

Make recommendations to the State Capitol Preservation
 Commission for preservation zones and design standards.

18 The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services 19 may contract for the services of a Capitol Architect and Curator or 20 employ such an individual on either a full- or part-time basis. 21 Compensation for the position shall be in accord with similar 22 professional positions in state government.

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1 SECTION 12. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4105.1 of Title 74, unless there 3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES) 4 Α. 5 shall be the custodian of the Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and the respective grounds. To aid in these duties, the State Capitol 6 Preservation Office is established under the State Capitol 7 Preservation Commission. All administration and budgetary decisions 8 9 for the State Capitol Preservation Office shall be made by the 10 Office of Management and Enterprise Services with authorization by the State Capitol Preservation Commission. 11

B. The State Capitol duties of the Office of Management andEnterprise Services are as follows:

OMES shall have the responsibility for maintenance,
 restoration, preservation, enhancement, and modification of the
 Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and respective grounds including
 facilities planning, facilities construction, and facilities
 administration;

OMES shall be responsible for all maintenance duties
 necessary to properly preserve and maintain the Capitol, Governor's

3. OMES shall be responsible for devising and developingprocesses for tenants in the Capitol and Governor's Mansion to

submit requests for maintenance, restoration, preservation,
 enhancement, and modification and evaluating such requests;

5 contract performance;

6 5. OMES shall be responsible for producing an annual budget and
7 submitting it to the State Capitol Preservation Commission;

6. OMES shall be responsible for creating a long-range master
plan for the maintenance and upkeep of the Capitol, Governor's
Mansion, and the respective grounds which shall be submitted to the
State Capitol Preservation Commission every three (3) years;

12 7. OMES shall be responsible for operation or coordinating 13 operation of the visitor center, visitor relations activities, and 14 tours in the Capitol;

8. OMES shall be responsible for operation of all dining and
vending services in the Capitol and shall approve food trucks and
other mobile food preparation vehicles on the grounds;

9. OMES shall be responsible for taking and approving
 reservations in all meeting rooms and areas of the Capitol and
 grounds not allocated to the Legislature by Section 15.1 of Title 73
 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

22 10. OMES shall be responsible for approving all events and 23 gatherings in the Capitol and on the respective grounds except for

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space designated in Section 15.1 of Title 73 of the Oklahoma
 Statutes;

3 11. OMES shall coordinate with the Oklahoma Arts Council for 4 curation of and care for all exhibits, art, monuments, and memorials 5 in public areas at the Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and the 6 respective grounds;

7 12. OMES shall coordinate with the Department of Public Safety
8 to ensure the safety of all visitors, employees, and elected
9 officials who are in the Capitol, Governor's Mansion, or on the
10 respective grounds. In cooperation with the Department of Public
11 Safety, a security plan shall be submitted to the State Capitol
12 Preservation Commission every three (3) years;

13 13. OMES shall be responsible for all maintenance, upkeep, and 14 access to all parking lots on the grounds of the Capitol and 15 Governor's Mansion;

16 14. OMES shall be responsible for submitting proposed 17 administrative rules to the State Capitol Preservation Commission to 18 govern the execution of the duties of the Office; and

19 15. OMES may collect rent from third-party vendors in the 20 Capitol and proceeds from the sale of merchandise or services 21 rendered.

C. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall
employ all staff and consultants necessary to perform the duties of
the Office including, but not limited to, a licensed architect.

needed to prevent loss or damage to property or to protect the
<u>health and safety of the</u> public during use of the building <u>and any</u>

The Oklahoma Arts Council shall be given the responsibility to acquire, maintain, preserve, or restore any state-owned art that is in storage or on display in the Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and the respective grounds. The council is authorized to hold exhibitions and commissions to display art to the general public. The Oklahoma Arts Council may request direct appropriations or submit requests to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.

20 SECTION 15. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4109, is 21 amended to read as follows:

Section 4109. By the order of the Director of the Office of
 Management and Enterprise Services, restoration and preservation
