## STATE OF OKLAHOMA

SENATE BILL 1676 By: Dahm

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AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Sections 11-103.12 and 11-103.13, which relate to the Health Education Act; modifying purpose of act; defining terms; modifying health education topics to be taught; removing language requiring development of certain micro-credential; requiring development of standards and benchmarks on certain topics; removing language regarding certification of teachers assigned to certain stand-alone course; directing the State Department of Education to review and the State Board of Education to approve certain curricula and materials; requiring school districts to use certain Board-approved curricula and materials; removing language requiring the State Textbook Committee to review certain materials; allowing each school district to post on its website certain notification allowing written consent for instruction on certain topics; requiring certain instruction to be provided in a separate classroom; requiring notification to include certain link; requiring submission of certain annual report by certain date; directing the State Board of Education to establish certain complaint process; authorizing the Board to report a school as deficient for certain noncompliance; updating statutory language and references; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

1	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 11-103.12,
2	is amended to read as follows:
3	Section 11-103.12. A. <del>Sections 1 through 3</del> This section and
4	Sections 11-103.13 and 11-103.14 of this act title shall be known
5	and may be cited as the "Health Education Act".
6	B. The purpose of <del>this act</del> the Health Education Act is to:
7	1. Ensure students receive instruction in health, particularly
8	at an early age when habits are formed;
9	2. Support the health and well-being of children that have been
10	affected by traumatic experiences;
11	3. Improve academic outcomes for students; and
12	4. Improve the overall health outcomes of Oklahoma's population
13	provide students with the knowledge and skills they need to be
14	healthy throughout their lives.
15	C. The State Board of Education may promulgate rules to
16	implement the provisions of <del>this act</del> the Health Education Act.
17	SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 11-103.13,
18	is amended to read as follows:
19	Section 11-103.13. A. As used in the Health Education Act:
20	1. "Benchmark" means identifying what the student will know and
21	be able to do by the end of each grade level;
22	2. "Health education" means providing students with knowledge
23	and skills they need to be healthy throughout their lives including
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motivating students to maintain and improve their health by way of nutrition, physical exercise, and physical activities;

- 3. "Nutrition" means the total processes involved in the taking in and utilization of food substances by which growth, repair, and maintenance of the body are accomplished; and
- 4. "Standard" means a general statement that identifies what the student is expected to achieve.
- B. Health education shall be taught in the public schools of this state. Health education shall include but is not be limited to physical health, mental health, social and emotional health and intellectual health physical exercise, physical activities, and nutrition.
- B. C. By the 2022-2023 school year, the State Department of Education shall:
- 1. Develop a micro-credential for teachers who are assigned the responsibility of teaching health education standards and benchmarks for nutrition and physical education; and
- 2. Develop professional development programs that are designed to help teachers provide instruction in health education and incorporate the curriculum into existing coursework and instruction where appropriate. The professional development provided as part of this act the Health Education Act shall not be construed to be in addition to existing professional development requirements.

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C. D. By the 2023-2024 school year, school districts shall provide instruction addressing all health education subject matter standards, as adopted by the State Board of Education pursuant to Section 11-103.6 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title. Health education may be integrated into one or more existing subjects or provided as an addition to existing coursework.

D. Teachers assigned to teach health education as a stand-alone course shall be certified in physical and health education. The State Department of Education is authorized to issue a provisional certificate, valid for not more than two (2) years, to individuals assigned to teach a stand-alone health education course in order to afford the individual the opportunity to obtain certification in physical and health education

E. The State Department of Education shall review and the State Board of Education shall approve all digital and hard copies of curricula, materials, supplementary materials, tests, surveys, and questionnaires related to implementation of the Health Education Act. For statewide consistency, transparency, and accountability, all public school districts in this state shall use the Board-approved curricula, materials, supplementary materials, tests, surveys, and questionnaires.

E. The State Textbook Committee shall include a review of
health and physical education instructional materials as part of its
textbook review and adoption cycle

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F. 1. Each school district may post on its website a

notification that the parent or legal guardian of an enrolled

student may provide written consent for the school district to

provide the student instruction on biological reproductive health,

sexual consent, sexual behavior and attitudes, and mental health

topics. Such instruction shall be provided in a classroom separate

from the classroom where health education is being provided.

2. The notification on the school district's website shall include a link for the student's parent or legal guardian to access and review all curricula, materials, supplementary materials, tests, surveys, and questionnaires to be used in the instruction provided for in this subsection.

- G. By July 1 each year, each school district shall electronically submit an annual report to the State Department of Education describing how instruction required by subsection B of this section was provided during the previous school year.
- H. The State Board of Education shall establish a process by which individuals who believe a violation of the Health Education

  Act has occurred may submit a written complaint. Upon a finding by the State Board of Education that a school district violated the Health Education Act, the Board is authorized to report a school as deficient on the accreditation report for noncompliance.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.

1	SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
2	of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
3	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
4	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
