7	2021, Section 1-103a.1, which relates to Public Health Advisory Councils; creating exception;
8	increasing membership of the Advancement of Wellness Advisory Council; directing appointment of certain
9	members; broadening jurisdictional areas of the Advancement of Wellness Advisory Council; updating
	statutory reference; and providing an effective date.
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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-103a.1, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 1-103a.1. A. To assist and advise the State
16	Commissioner of Health and the State Department of Health, there are
17	hereby created:
18	1. The Consumer Protection Licensing Advisory Council;
19	2. The Trauma and Emergency Response Advisory Council;
20	3. The Infant and Children's Health Advisory Council;
21	4. The Advancement of Wellness Advisory Council; and
22	5. The Home Care, Hospice and Palliative Care Advisory Council.
23	B. 1. Except for the Home Care, Hospice and Palliative Care
24	Advisory Council and the Advancement of Wellness Advisory Council,

1 each Public Health Advisory Council (Advisory Council) created pursuant to subsection A of this section shall consist of seven (7) 2 Two members shall be appointed by the Governor, two 3 members. members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of 5 Representatives, two members shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and one member shall be appointed by the 6 Commissioner. Appointments shall be for three-year terms. Members 7 of the Advisory Councils shall serve at the pleasure of and may be 9 removed from office by the appointing authority. Members shall 10 continue to serve until their successors are appointed. Any vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments. 11 12 Four members shall constitute a quorum.

- 2. The Home Care, Hospice and Palliative Care Advisory Council shall consist of nine (9) members. Two members shall be appointed by the Governor, three members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, three members shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and one member shall be appointed by the Commissioner. Five members shall constitute a quorum.
- 3. The Advancement of Wellness Advisory Council shall consist of ten (10) members. Three members shall be appointed by the Governor, three members shall be appointed by the President Pro

  Tempore of the Senate, three members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and one member shall be

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1	appointed by the Commissioner. Six members shall constitute a
2	quorum.
3	4. Each Advisory Council shall meet at least twice a year, but
4	no more than four times a year and shall elect a chair, a <del>vice-chair</del>
5	vice chair, and a secretary from among its members. Each Advisory
6	Council shall only meet as required for election of officers,
7	establishment of meeting dates and times; rule development, review,
8	and recommendation; and adoption of nonbinding resolutions to the
9	Department or the Commissioner concerning matters brought before the
10	Advisory Council. Special meetings may be called by the chair or by
11	the concurrence of any three members.
12	C. 1. All members of the Consumer Protection Licensing
13	Advisory Council shall be knowledgeable of certain consumer issues
14	as specified below. The Consumer Protection Licensing Advisory
15	Council shall be composed as follows:
16	a. the Governor shall appoint:
17	(1) one member who is a licensed radiologist
18	assistant, and
19	(2) one member who is a licensed audiologist,
20	b. the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:
21	(1) one member who is a licensed radiologist, and
22	(2) one member representing the hearing-aid-fitting
23	industry,

1	c. the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
2	appoint:
3	(1) one member representing the medical
4	micropigmentation industry, and
5	(2) one member representing the hearing-impaired
6	public, and
7	d. the Commissioner shall appoint one member representing
8	a diagnostic x-ray facility.
9	2. The jurisdiction areas of the Consumer Protection Licensing
10	Advisory Council shall include the hearing-aid-fitting industry, the
11	medical micropigmentation industry, the radiation industry, and such
12	other areas as designated by the Commissioner.
13	D. 1. All members of the Trauma and Emergency Response
14	Advisory Council shall be knowledgeable of issues that arise in a
15	hospital setting and issues that arise concerning emergency
16	response. The Trauma and Emergency Response Advisory Council shall
17	be composed as follows:
18	a. the Governor shall appoint:
19	(1) one member who is an administrative director of a
20	licensed ambulance service, and
21	(2) one member who is a <del>Board Certified Emergency</del>
22	Physician board-certified emergency physician,
23	b. the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:
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1	(1) one member who is a representative from a
2	hospital with trauma and emergency services, and
3	(2) one member who is a trauma surgeon with
4	privileges at a hospital with trauma and
5	emergency operative services,
6	c. the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
7	appoint:
8	(1) one member representing the trauma registrar of a
9	licensed hospital that is classified as providing
10	trauma and emergency operative services, and
11	(2) one member who is an <del>Emergency Medical Technician</del>
12	emergency medical technician, and
13	d. the Commissioner shall appoint one member who is a
14	critical care nurse.
15	2. The jurisdictional areas of the Trauma and Emergency
16	Response Advisory Council shall include emergency response systems
17	development, injury prevention, catastrophic health emergency,
18	trauma systems improvement and development and such other areas
19	designated by the Commissioner.
20	E. 1. All members of the Infant and Children's Health Advisory
21	Council shall be knowledgeable of issues that arise in the area of
22	infant and children's health care. The Infant and Children's Health
23	Advisory Council shall be composed as follows:
24	a. the Governor shall appoint:

1		(1) one member who works for the state or for a
2		political subdivision on child abuse issues, and
3		(2) one member who is knowledgeable about childhood
4		immunizations,
5	b.	the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:
6		(1) one member who is knowledgeable about newborn
7		screening issues,
8		(2) one member licensed by the state as an
9		optometrist who has knowledge of vision screening
10		for children, and
11		(3) one member who is a licensed ophthalmologist in
12		this state with the knowledge of treating visual
13		deficiencies in children,
14	С.	the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
15		appoint:
16		(1) one member who is licensed by the state as a
17		physician and works as a pediatrician, and
18		(2) one member who is licensed by the state as a
19		genetic counselor, and
20	d.	the Commissioner shall appoint one member who is a
21		physician licensed by the state who specializes in the
22		diagnosis and treatment of childhood injuries in a
23		trauma setting.
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1	2. The jurisdictional areas of the Infant and Children's Health
2	Advisory Council shall include all issues that arise in the area of
3	health care for infants and children and such other areas as
4	designated by the Commissioner.
5	F. 1. All members of the Advancement of Wellness Advisory
6	Council shall be knowledgeable of issues that arise in the area of
7	advancing the health of all Oklahomans. The Advancement of Wellness
8	Advisory Council shall be composed as follows:
9	a. the Governor shall appoint:
10	(1) one member who is knowledgeable about breast and
11	cervical cancer issues, <del>and</del>
12	(2) one member who is knowledgeable about organ donor
13	issues <u>, and</u>
14	(3) one member who is knowledgeable about
15	cardiometabolic disease including obesity,
16	dyslipidemia, hypertension, and diabetes,
17	b. the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:
18	(1) one member who is mayor of a city or town that
19	has been designated a certified healthy community
20	in an urban setting, <del>and</del>
21	(2) one member who is the president or chief
22	operating officer of a business that has been
23	designated a certified healthy business, and

1	(3)	one member who represents an Urban Indian Health
2		Center in this state or a nonprofit organization
3		with a major focus on improving public health for
4		citizens of federally recognized tribes in this
5		<u>state</u> ,
6	c. the	Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
7	appo	pint:
8	(1)	one member who is the mayor of a city or town
9		that has been designated a certified healthy
10		community in a rural setting, and
11	(2)	one member who is the president or chief
12		operating officer of a business that has been
13		designated a certified healthy business in an
14		urban setting, and
15	(3)	one member who represents a federally recognized
16		tribe based in this state which maintains a
17		tribally operated health system, and
18	d. the	Commissioner shall appoint one member who is the
19	Exec	cutive Director of the Tobacco Settlement Endowment
20	Trus	st.
21	2. The juriso	dictional areas of the Advancement of Wellness
22	Advisory Council s	shall include all issues that arise in the areas of
23	tobacco usage and	cessation, organ and tissue donation,
24	cardiometabolic di	isease. American Indian health, the requirements

1	for a city or town in the state to be designated as a certified
2	healthy community, the requirements for a business to be designated
3	as a certified healthy business and such other areas as designated
4	by the Commissioner.
5	G. 1. All members of the Home Care, Hospice and Palliative

- G. 1. All members of the Home Care, Hospice and Palliative
  Care Advisory Council shall be knowledgeable of issues that arise in
  the administration and practice of home care, hospice and palliative
  care services. The Home Care, Hospice and Palliative Care Advisory
  Council shall be composed as follows:
  - a. the Governor shall appoint:
    - (1) one member who is the owner or administrator of an entity licensed in accordance with the Oklahoma Hospice Licensing Act, and
    - (2) one member who is an owner or administrator of an entity licensed in accordance with the Oklahoma

      Home Care Act,
  - b. the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:
    - (1) one member who is an owner or administrator of an entity licensed in accordance with the Oklahoma Hospice Licensing Act,
    - (2) one member who is an owner or administrator of an entity licensed in accordance with the Oklahoma

      Home Care Act, and

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1	(3) one member who is a member of the palliative care
2	patient advocacy community,
3	c. the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
4	appoint:
5	(1) one member representing the public who is or was
6	a legal guardian of a recipient of hospice
7	services,
8	(2) one member representing the public who is a
9	recipient or legal guardian of a recipient of
10	services from a home health agency, and
11	(3) one member who is an allopathic or osteopathic
12	physician or nurse certified in palliative care
13	delivery in this state, and
14	d. the Commissioner shall appoint one member representing
15	an association which advocates on behalf of home care
16	or hospice issues.
17	2. The jurisdictional areas of the Home Care, Hospice and
18	Palliative Care Advisory Council shall include all issues that arise
19	in the areas of home care, hospice services and palliative care,
20	including, but not limited to:
21	a. identifying methods that improve the quality and
22	delivery of home care, hospice and palliative care,
23	b. reviewing best practices from home care, hospice and
24	palliative care programs in the state,

- c. developing information on home care, hospice and palliative care issues for the general public, and
  - d. such other areas as designated by the Commissioner.
  - H. In addition to other powers and duties assigned to each Advisory Council pursuant to this section, each Advisory Council, within its jurisdictional area, shall:
  - 1. Have authority to recommend to the Commissioner rules on behalf of the Department. The Department shall not have standing to recommend to the Commissioner permanent rules or changes to such rules within the jurisdiction of an Advisory Council which have not been submitted previously to the appropriate Advisory Council for action;
  - 2. Before recommending any permanent rules to the Commissioner, give public notice, offer an opportunity for public comment and conduct a public rulemaking hearing when required by the Administrative Procedures Act;
  - 3. Have the authority to make nonbinding written recommendations to the Commissioner or to the Department which have been concurred upon by at least a majority of the membership of the Advisory Council;
- 4. Have the authority to provide a public forum for the discussion of issues it considers relevant to its area of jurisdiction, and to:

- 1 a. pass nonbinding resolutions expressing the sense of the Advisory Council, and
  - b. make recommendations to the Commissioner or the Department concerning the need and the desirability of conducting meetings, workshops, and seminars; and
  - 5. Cooperate with each other Advisory Council, the public, the Commissioner, and the Commissioner of Health in order to coordinate the rules within their respective jurisdictional areas and to achieve maximum efficiency and effectiveness in furthering the objectives of the Department.
  - I. The Advisory Councils shall not recommend rules for promulgation by the Commissioner unless all applicable requirements of the Administrative Procedures Act have been followed, including but not limited to notice, rule-impact statement, and rulemaking hearings.
  - J. Members of the Advisory Councils shall serve without compensation. The Advisory Councils are authorized to utilize the conference rooms of the Department and obtain administrative assistance from the Department, as required.
