SENATE BILL 1710 By: Smalley

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to health insurance; requiring health benefit plans to provide coverage for functional repair or restoration of craniofacial disorders; specifying that coverage shall not include cosmetic surgery or other certain treatment; defining health benefit plan; providing that benefit shall be subject to certain plan terms; requiring Insurance Department to promulgate rules; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

- SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6060.25 of Title 36, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. Any health benefit plan that is offered, issued or renewed in this state on or after January 1, 2021, shall provide coverage for medically necessary functional repair or restoration of craniofacial disorders to improve the function of, or to approximate the normal appearance of, any abnormal structures caused by congenital defects, developmental deformities, trauma, tumors, infections or disease.

- 1. Coverage under this section shall include the necessary care and treatment of medically diagnosed congenital defects and birth abnormalities including, but not limited to, cleft lip, cleft palate, ectodermal dysplasia, dentinogenesis imperfect, oligodontia, amelogenesis imperfectal, and other maxillofacial abnormalities.
- 2. Coverage shall not include cosmetic surgery or coverage for dental or orthodontic treatment unrelated to congenital defects, developmental deformities, trauma, tumors, infections or disease.
- B. As used in this section, "health benefit plan" means any plan or arrangement as defined in subsection C of Section 6060.4 of Title 36 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- C. Benefits provided pursuant to subsection A of this section shall be subject to any deductible, co-payment or coinsurance requirement of the health benefit plan.
- D. The Insurance Commissioner shall promulgate any rules necessary to implement the provisions of this section.
 - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
