NEW LAW 14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 649.1 of Title 59, unless there 15 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 16 As used in this act: 17 "Naturopathic medicine" means a system of primary health 18 care for the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of human health 19 conditions, injury and disease; the promotion or restoration of 20 health; and the support and stimulation of a patient's inherent 21 self-healing processes through patient education and the use of 22 naturopathic therapies and therapeutic substances; 23

- "Naturopathic physician" and all designations, means a practitioner of naturopathic medicine who has been properly licensed for that purpose;
  - "Department" means the State Department of Health;
  - 4. "Committee" means the Naturopathic Medicine Committee;
- 5. "License" means the document of authorization issued by the Department for a person to engage in the practice of Naturopathic Medicine;
- "Approved naturopathic medical program" means a naturopathic medical education program in the United States or Canada that meets the requirements for accreditation by the Council on Naturopathic Medical Education (CNME) or an equivalent federally recognized accrediting body for the naturopathic medical profession recognized by the Department. This program must offer doctoral-level, fulltime didactic and supervised clinical training leading to the degree of Doctor of Naturopathy or Doctor of Naturopathic Medicine. program must be an institution, or part of an institution, of higher education that at the time the student completes the program is:
  - either accredited or is a candidate for accreditation a. by a regional institution accrediting agency recognized by the United States Secretary of Education, or
  - b. a degree-granting college or university that prior to the existence of CNME offered a full-time structured

curriculum in basic sciences and supervised patient care comprising a doctoral naturopathic medical education that is at least one hundred thirty-two (132) weeks in duration, must be completed in at least thirty-five (35) months and is reputable and in good standing in the judgment of the Department;

- 7. "Approved substances" means over-the-counter substances, food extracts, vitamins, minerals other dietary supplements, botanical, homeopathic preparations and a limited formulary of legend drugs;
- 8. "Minor office procedures" means the methods for the repair and care incidental to superficial lacerations and abrasions, superficial lesions and the removal of foreign bodies located in the superficial tissues;
- 9. "Naturopathic formulary" means the list of medicines, nonprescription and prescription, which naturopathic physicians use in the practice of their profession, as determined by the formulary council and reviewed by the Department;
- 10. "Naturopathic formulary council" means that council comprised of members appointed pursuant to this chapter to determine and authorize the formulary list; and
- 11. "Naturopathic physical applications" means the therapeutic use by naturopathic doctors of the actions or devices of electrical muscle stimulation, galvanic, diathermy, ultrasound, ultraviolet

light, sauna, infrared light therapy, biofeedback, hydrotherapy, naturopathic musculoskeletal technique and therapeutic exercise.

- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 649.2 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. There is hereby established the Naturopathic Medicine

  Committee to assist the State Department of Health in conducting

  examinations for applicants and to advise the Department on all

  matters pertaining to the licensure, education and continuing

  education of naturopathic physicians and the practice of

  naturopathic medicine.
- B. The Naturopathic Medicine Committee shall consist of five (5) members who shall be appointed by the State Commissioner of Health as follows:
- Two members who are licensed to practice naturopathic medicine;
- 2. One member who is a layperson who is not and who has never been licensed to practice naturopathic medicine or members of any closely related profession;
- 3. One member who is licensed by the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners; and
- 4. One member who is licensed by the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision.

- C. Members of the Committee shall be appointed for terms of four (4) years or for the remainder of an unexpired term of a vacancy. Members shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. Vacancies on the Committee shall be filled by the Commissioner in the same manner as the original appointment.
- D. Members of the Committee shall not be compensated but may be reimbursed for all actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of duties required by this act in accordance with the provisions of the State Travel Reimbursement Act.
  - E. The Committee shall have the power and duty to:
  - 1. Assist the Commissioner in promulgating rules;
- 2. Assist in selecting and conducting examinations for licensure, and in determining which applicants successfully pass such examination:
- 3. Advise the Department on all matters pertaining to the licensure, education, and continuing education requirements for and practice of Naturopathic Medicine in this state; and
- 4. Assist and advise in all hearings involving naturopathic physicians who are deemed to be in violation of this act.
- SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
