7	An Act relating to public health; establishing the
8	Oklahoma Rare Disease Advisory Council; stating purpose and activities of the Council; providing
9	appointment procedures and membership requirements; requiring submission of certain annual report;
10	<pre>specifying duration of membership terms; providing for filling of vacancies; defining term; providing</pre>
11	for codification; and providing an effective date.
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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-451 of Title 63, unless there
16	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
17	A. The Oklahoma Rare Disease Advisory Council shall be
18	established within the State Department of Health in accordance with
19	this section.
20	B. The purpose of the Council shall be to provide guidance and
21	recommendations to educate the public, the Legislature, and other
22	state agencies, as appropriate, on the needs of individuals with
23	rare diseases living in this state.
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C. The Council shall conduct the following activities to benefit those impacted by rare diseases in this state:

<sup>3</sup> 1. Convene public hearings, make inquiries, and solicit <sup>4</sup> comments from the general public in Oklahoma to assist the Council <sup>5</sup> with a first-year landscape or survey of the needs of rare disease <sup>6</sup> patients, caregivers, and providers in the state;

Provide testimony and comments on pending legislation and
regulations before the Legislature, if called, and other state
agencies that impact Oklahoma's rare disease community;

10 3. Consult with experts on rare diseases to develop policy 11 recommendations to improve patient access to, and quality of, rare 12 disease specialists, affordable and comprehensive health care 13 coverage, relevant diagnostics, timely treatment, and other needed 14 services;

4. Establish best practices and protocols to include in state planning related to natural disasters, public health emergencies, or other emergency declarations to enable continuity of care for rare disease patients and ensure safeguards against discrimination for rare disease patients are in place;

20 5. Identify areas of unmet need for research and opportunities 21 for collaboration across stakeholders and other state rare disease 22 advisory councils that can inform future studies and work done by 23 the Council; and

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Research and identify best practices to reduce health
 disparities and achieve health equity in the research, diagnosis,
 and treatment of rare disease in this state.

D. 1. The Council's appointment process shall be conducted in
a transparent manner to provide interested individuals an
opportunity to apply for membership on the Council. All members of
the Council shall be full-time residents of this state as
practicable. Membership shall include a diverse set of stakeholders
representative of the geographic and population diversity of the
state.

11 2. The Governor shall appoint the chair of the Council not 12 later than December 1, 2024. The chair shall not hold any position 13 within the government of this state.

14 3. The Chair shall appoint no fewer than seventeen (17) 15 members, including the following:

- a. one representative of an academic research institution
  in the state that receives any grant funding for rare
  disease research,
- b. one representative of the State Department of Health's
   Office of Minority Health and Health Equity or
   successor division,
- c. one representative of the Oklahoma Health Care
   Authority,
- d. one representative of the Insurance Department,

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1 one Registered Nurse or Advanced Practice Registered e. 2 Nurse licensed and practicing in this state with 3 experience treating rare diseases, 4 f. one physician practicing in this state with experience 5 treating rare diseases, 6 g. one geneticist or genetic counselor, 7 h. one hospital administrator, or his or her designee, 8 from a hospital in this state that provides care to 9 persons diagnosed with a rare disease, 10 i. at least two patients who have a rare disease, 11 at least one caregiver of a person with a rare j. 12 disease, 13 one representative of a rare disease patient k. 14 organization that operates in this state, 15 1. one pharmacist with experience dispensing drugs used 16 to treat rare diseases, 17 one representative of the biopharmaceutical industry, m. 18 one representative of a health plan company, n. 19 one member of the scientific community who is engaged ο. 20 in rare disease research including, but not limited 21 to, a medical researcher with experience conducting 22 research on rare diseases, and 23 one mental health provider with experience treating p. 24 rare disease patients in this state. \_ \_

1 The Council shall electronically submit a report to the Ε. 1. 2 President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of 3 Representatives, and the Governor within one year of establishment 4 of the Oklahoma Rare Disease Advisory Council and annually 5 thereafter. Prior to submission, a draft of the annual report shall 6 be made available for public comment and discussed at an open public 7 meeting. 8 2. Annual reports shall: 9 describe the activities and progress of the Council a. 10 under this section, and 11 provide recommendations to the Legislature and b. 12 Governor on ways to address the needs of people living 13 with rare diseases in this state. 14 The initial meeting of the Council shall occur no later F. 1. 15 than February 1, 2025. Thereafter, the Council shall meet no less 16 than quarterly. 17 2. The Council shall: 18 provide opportunities for the public to hear updates a. 19 and provide input into its work, and 20 b. create and maintain a public website where meeting 21 minutes, notices of upcoming meetings, and public 22 comments may be submitted. 23 The Governor shall appoint the chair for an initial term G. 1. 24 of three (3) years. At the end of the chair's initial three-year \_ \_

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<sup>1</sup> term, and every two (2) years thereafter, members of the Council <sup>2</sup> shall elect, by a majority vote, a new chair.

2. Council members shall serve no longer than three (3) years, except that, to facilitate a staggered rotation of members to retain continuity and knowledge transfer, during the initial five (5) years after the establishment of the Council, members may serve up to a four-year term.

8 3. If a vacancy occurs, the Council, by a majority vote, shall
 9 fill such vacancy in a timely manner and in compliance with
 10 requirements set forth in subsection D of this section.

H. As used in this section, "rare disease", sometimes called an orphan disease, means a disease that affects fewer than two hundred thousand (200,000) people in the United States.

14 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.

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
