10	O.S. 2011, Section 1928, which relates to licensing; modifying and adding definitions; deleting requirement for certain finding; removing certain application criteria; updating certain standards; removing limitation on certain fees; removing certain exemption; providing for limited practice of supervisees; prohibiting provision of services under certain condition; updating terms; updating statutory

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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1928, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	Section 1928. A. As used in this <del>act</del> section and Sections 1-
20	280.1 through 1-280.3 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes:
21	1. a. "Applied behavior analysis" means the design,
22	implementation, and evaluation of instructional and
23	environmental modifications to produce socially
24	significant improvements in human behavior through

1 skill, acquisition, and the reduction of problematic 2 behavior. An applied behavior analysis program shall: 3 be based on empirical research including the (1)direct observation and measurement of behavior as 4 5 well as a functional behavior assessment, and (2) utilize antecedent stimuli, positive 6 7 reinforcement, and other consequences to produce behavior change. 8 9 b. Applied behavior analysis does not include cognitive 10 therapies or psychological testing, neuropsychology, 11 psychotherapy, sex therapy, psychoanalysis, 12 hypnotherapy, and long-term counseling as treatment modalities; 13 2. "Board" means the nationally accredited Behavior Analyst 14 Certification Board: 15 "Human services professional" means an individual licensed 16 3. or certified by the state as one of the following: 17 a licensed physical therapist or physical therapist 18 a. assistant pursuant to Sections 887.1 through 887.18 of 19 Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title, 20 b. an occupational therapist, occupational therapy 21 assistant, or occupational therapy aide pursuant to 22 Sections 888.1 through 888.15 of Title 59 of the 23 24 Oklahoma Statutes this title,

- c. a licensed clinical social worker, licensed masters
   social worker, or social work associate pursuant to
   Sections 1250 through 1273 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma
   Statutes this title,
- d. a psychologist or health service psychologist pursuant
  to Sections 1351 through 1376 of <del>Title 59 of the</del>
  <del>Oklahoma Statutes</del> <u>this title</u>,
- e. a licensed speech pathologist, licensed audiologist,
   speech-language pathologist or audiologist pursuant to
   Sections 1601 through 1622 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma
   Statutes this title,
- 12 f. a licensed professional counselor or licensed 13 professional counselor candidate pursuant to Sections 14 1901 through 1920 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes 15 this title,
- 16 g. a licensed marital and family therapist or licensed 17 marital and family therapist candidate pursuant to 18 Sections 1925.1 through 1925.18 of <del>Title 59 of the</del> 19 Oklahoma Statutes this title, or
- h. a licensed behavioral practitioner or licensed
  behavioral practitioner candidate pursuant to Sections
  1930 through 1949.1 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma
  Statutes this title;
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1 4. "Certified assistant behavior analyst" "Board Certified 2 Assistant Behavior Analyst" or "BCaBA" means an individual who is 3 certified by the nationally accredited Behavior Analyst Certification Board as a Board-Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst 4 5 and certified Board and certified by the Developmental Disabilities Services Division of the Department of Human Services; 6 5. "Licensed behavior analyst" "Board Certified Behavior 7 Analyst" or "BCBA" means an individual who is certified by the 8 9 nationally accredited Behavior Analyst Certification Board as a 10 Board-Certified Behavior Analyst Board and licensed by the 11 Developmental Disabilities Services Division of the Department; and "Registered Behavior Technician" or "RBT" means a 12 6. paraprofessional who is certified by the Board and practices under 13 the close, ongoing supervision of a Board Certified Behavior 14 15 Analyst. The Registered Behavior Technician is primarily responsible for the direct implementation of behavior-analytic 16 services designed and prescribed by a Board Certified Behavior 17 18 Analyst; and 7. "Supervisee" means a person who acts under the extended 19 20 authority of a licensed behavior analyst to provide applied behavior analysis services or a person who is in training to provide such 21 services Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst or Registered 22 Behavior Technician who acts under the authority and supervision of 23 a Board Certified Behavior Analyst to provide applied behavior 24

1 <u>analysis services, or a Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst</u>
2 <u>or Registered Behavior Technician applicant to provide such services</u>
3 as defined by the Board.

Each person wishing to practice as a licensed behavior 4 в. 5 analyst or a certified assistant behavior analyst Board Certified 6 Behavior Analyst or a Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst 7 shall apply to the Developmental Disabilities Services Division of the Department of Human Services using a form and in a manner 8 9 prescribed by the Division Developmental Disabilities Services and 10 shall furnish evidence satisfactory to the **Division** Developmental 11 Disabilities Services that such person:

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## 1. Is of good moral character;

## 13 2. Is at least twenty-one (21) years of age;

Has passed the Board examination and is certified by the Board as a Board-Certified Board Certified Behavior Analyst or a Board-Certified Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst, as applicable; and

Has not had a professional license or certification refused, revoked, suspended, or restricted and does not have a complaint, allegation, or investigation pending in any regulatory jurisdiction in the United States or in another country for reasons that relate to unprofessional conduct unless the <del>Division finds, to</del> its satisfaction, that the conduct has been corrected or that mitigating circumstances exist that prevent its resolution<del>; and</del> 5. Has at least the minimum graduate or undergraduate degree,
 appropriate for the level of certification, from an accredited
 institution of higher learning in a qualifying field of study, as
 determined by the Board.

C. A person holding a state license or state certification
shall apply for renewal of the state license or state certification
on or before April 30 of each odd-numbered year. The application
shall be accompanied by a renewal fee to be set by the <del>Division</del>
<u>Developmental Disabilities Services</u> in accordance with paragraph 3
of subsection F of this section.

D. A person licensed or certified by the Developmental Disabilities Services <del>Division</del> of the Department under this section shall:

Maintain active status and fulfill all requirements for
 renewal of national certification or recertification with the Board;
 and

2. Conduct professional activities in accordance with accepted 17 standards such as the Guidelines for Responsible Conduct and 18 Professional Disciplinary Standards of the Board Board's 19 20 Professional and Ethical Compliance Code for Behavior Analysts. No person shall claim the title of <del>licensed behavior</del> 21 Ε. 1. analyst or certified assistant behavior analyst Board Certified 22 23 Behavior Analyst or Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst unless that person meets the applicable requirements in this 24

1 section. No person shall practice applied behavior analysis without obtaining a license or certification in accordance with this 2 3 section. Supervisees may only provide applied behavior analysis under the supervision of a licensed behavior analyst Board Certified 4 5 Behavior Analyst. This section shall not restrict the practice of applied behavior analysis by human services professionals, provided 6 7 such individuals are working within the scope of their professions and the practice of applied behavior analysis is commensurate with 8 9 their level of training and experience.

A violation of this subsection shall be punishable by a fine
 of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), the suspension or
 revocation of a license or certification issued pursuant to this
 section, or both such fine and loss of licensure or certification.

F. The Division state licensure board operated by the
 Developmental Disabilities Services shall:

Investigate all complaints relating to: 16 1. the practice or supervision of applied behavior 17 a. analysis by any person licensed by the Developmental 18 Disabilities Services <del>Division</del> of the Department as a 19 20 behavior analyst or certified by the Division as an assistant behavior analyst Board Certified Behavior 21 Analyst or certified as a Board Certified Assistant 22 23 Behavior Analyst, or

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1 any person alleged to be practicing or providing b. 2 supervision without a state license or state 3 certification; 2. Refer any substantiated complaints to the Board; and 4 5 3. Charge reasonable fees for a license or for certification  $\tau$ not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). 6 7 G. 1. A person having a qualifying degree, as provided for in paragraph 5 of subsection B of this section, and participating in 8 9 the applied behavior analysis treatment pilot project established in 10 Section 3 of this act shall be exempt from the requirements of this 11 section while such person is actively participating in the project. 12 2. Persons employed by a school district in this state who provide services solely to the school district under the Individuals 13 with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), 20 U.S.C., Section 1400 et 14 15 seq., shall be exempt from the requirements of this section. 16 Η. The supervisee shall not design intervention or assessment It shall be the responsibility of the supervising Board 17 plans. Certified Behavior Analyst to determine which other tasks the 18 supervisee may perform as a function of the supervisee's training, 19 experience and competence. The Board Certified Behavior Analyst 20 shall be responsible for the work performed by the supervisee on the 21 cases overseen by the Board Certified Behavior Analyst. 22 I. A Board Certified Behavior Analyst, Board Certified 23 Assistant Behavior Analyst or Registered Behavior Technician who is 24

1	a guardian or parent shall not provide services to his or her own
2	child or ward.
3	J. The <del>Department</del> <u>Director of Human Services</u> shall promulgate
4	rules to implement the provisions of this section.
5	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
