15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:				
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified				
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 18-114.15 of Title 70, unless				
18	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:				
19	A. Beginning with the 2015-2016 school year, teachers in the				
20	public schools of Oklahoma shall receive in salary and/or fringe				
21	benefits not less than the amounts specified in the following

10 Β. When determining the Minimum Salary Schedule, "fringe 11 benefits" shall mean all or part of retirement benefits, excluding the contributions made pursuant to subsection A of Section 17-108.1 12 13 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes and the flexible benefit allowance pursuant to Section 26-105 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma 14 Statutes from the flexible benefit allowance funds disbursed by the 15 State Board of Education and the State Board of Career and 16 17 Technology Education pursuant to Section 26-104 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 18

C. Any of the degrees referred to in this section shall be from a college recognized by the State Board of Education. The State Board of Education shall accept teaching experience from out-ofstate school districts that are accredited by the state board of education or appropriate state accrediting agency for the districts.

D. For the purpose of state salary increments and retirement, no teacher shall be granted credit for more than five (5) years of active duty in the military service or out-of-state teaching experience as a certified teacher or its equivalent. Nothing in this section shall prohibit boards of education from crediting more years of experience on district salary schedules than those allowed for state purposes.

8 E. The State Board of Education shall recognize, for purposes 9 of certification and salary increments, all the years of experience 10 of a:

Certified teacher who teaches in the educational program of
 the Department of Corrections, beginning with fiscal year 1981;

Vocational rehabilitation counselor under the Department of
 Human Services, if the counselor was employed as a certified teacher
 by the State Department of Education when the Division of Vocational
 Rehabilitation was transferred from the State Board of Career and
 Technology Education or the State Board of Education to the Oklahoma
 Public Welfare Commission on July 1, 1968;

3. Vocational rehabilitation counselor, which were completed
 while employed by the Department of Human Services, if such
 counselor was certified as a teacher or was eligible for
 certification as a teacher in Oklahoma;

4. Certified teacher, which were completed while employed by
 the Department of Human Services Child Study Center at University
 Hospital, if the teacher was certified as a teacher in Oklahoma; and

5. Certified school psychologist or psychometrist, which were
completed while employed as a doctoral intern, psychological
assistant or psychologist with any agency of the State of Oklahoma,
if the experience primarily involved work with persons of school- or
preschool-age and if the person was, at the time the experience was
acquired, certified as or eligible for certification as, a school
psychologist or psychometrist.

The provisions of this section shall not apply to teachers 11 F. 12 who have entered into postretirement employment with a public school 13 in Oklahoma and are still receiving a monthly retirement benefit. SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2015. 14 15 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby 16 17 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval. 18 19 1/13/2015 11:18:29 AM 55-1-525 LG 20 21 22 23
