AS INTRODUCED
An Act relating to chiefs of police; amending 11 O.S.
2021, Section 34-102, which relates to qualifications for chiefs of police; defining term; clarifying
certain authority; changing certain experience qualification; altering certain training requirement;
providing certain exception; making language gender neutral; updating statutory language; updating
statutory reference; and providing an effective date.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 11 O.S. 2021, Section 34-102, is
amended to read as follows:
Section 34-102. A. For the purposes of this section, "peace
officer" shall mean an individual who meets the definition
established in Section 648 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes who
is also paid for working on average more than twenty-five (25) hours
per week.
${f B.}$ The chief of police of a municipality shall be a peace
officer and shall be the chief law enforcement officer of a
municipality. The chief of police of a municipality shall enforce

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the municipal ordinances. The chief of police of a municipality

shall have such other powers, duties and functions as may be prescribed by law or ordinance.

- B. C. Any person elected or appointed to the position of chief of police of a municipality shall meet the following qualifications:
  - 1. Be at least twenty-one (21) years of age;
  - 2. Be a citizen of the United States;

- 3. Possess at least a high school diploma or General Education Diploma (GED);
- 4. Be certified as a peace officer in this state by the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET), or meet all requirements necessary for CLEET certification and obtain such certification within six (6) months of assuming the position of chief of police or as otherwise allowed by Section 3311 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes Have served as a duly certified peace officer for a period of five (5) years or more prior to the date of assuming the position of chief of police; and
- 5. Have successfully completed a course of training meeting at least the minimal criteria established police chief administrative school developed by the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET) for police chief administration, successfully completed an approved police chief administrative school which has been developed by the Oklahoma Association of Chiefs of Police and approved by the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET). Failure to complete the police chief administrative school

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within twelve (12) months of assuming the position of chief of police shall preclude a new chief of police from obtaining CLEET certification. New chiefs of police with prior CLEET certification who fail to complete the police chief administrative school within twelve (12) months shall have their CLEET certification revoked.

- C. D. 1. Any person who does not meet the qualifications of paragraph 4 or 5 of subsection  $\frac{1}{2}$  C of this section at the time of election or appointment to the position of chief of police and who fails after assuming the position of chief of police to meet such qualifications within the time required shall have their his or her CLEET certification revoked for the purpose of serving as chief and be removed from the position.
- 2. Any person assuming the position of chief of police without prior CLEET certification who fails to complete an approved course of training or police chief administration school within the time required shall be precluded from obtaining CLEET certification while in such position.

4	E. F. The provisions of this act Section 34-102 of Title 11 of
5	the Oklahoma Statutes and Section 3311 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma
6	Statutes relating to qualifications for a chief of police shall not
7	apply to any person who has assumed the position of chief of police
8	and is currently serving as the chief of police of a municipality on
9	or before November 1, $\frac{2006}{2024}$ .
10	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
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
