NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-2531.1 of Title 63, unless 15 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 16 A. For the purpose of promoting and coordinating an improved 17 model of emergency care for acute coronary syndrome (ACS) patients, 18 the State Department of Health shall establish a system of hospital 19 designations as provided by this section. 20 The Department shall designate hospitals licensed by the 21 Department that meet the qualifications established in this 22 subsection according to the designation levels established herein. 23

1 1. A hospital that meets one or more of the following criteria shall be designated as a Level 1 Heart Attack Center: 2 Comprehensive Heart Attack Center certification issued 3 a. by the Joint Commission and the American Heart 4 5 Association, Chest Pain Center with Primary Percutaneous Coronary 6 b. Intervention (PCI) and Resuscitation Accreditation 7 issued by the American College of Cardiology, or 8 9 C. substantially equivalent qualifications as determined by the State Commissioner of Health. 10 A hospital that meets one or more of the following criteria 11 shall be designated as a Level 2 Heart Attack Center: 12 Primary Heart Attack Center certification issued by 13 a. the Joint Commission and the American Heart 14 Association, 15 Chest Pain Center with Primary PCI Accreditation 16 b. issued by the American College of Cardiology, or 17 substantially equivalent qualifications as determined 18 by the Commissioner. 19 3. A hospital that meets one or more of the following criteria 20 shall be designated as a Level 3 Heart Attack Center: 21 Acute Heart Attack Ready certification issued by the 22 Joint Commission and the American Heart Association,

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b. Chest Pain Center Accreditation issued by the American
College of Cardiology, or

- c. substantially equivalent qualifications as determined by the Commissioner.
- C. 1. Designation as a heart attack center under this section shall be automatic, and a hospital shall not be required to apply or reapply for such designation. The Department shall access publicly available information on certification, accreditation, or other qualifications from, and may obtain additional information as necessary from, the Joint Commission, the American Heart Association, the American College of Cardiology, or any other appropriate entity to discern qualifications of hospitals for the designations established under this section.
- 2. The Department shall update designations not less than annually. The Department shall access the information described in paragraph 1 of this subsection and shall:
 - a. designate all hospitals that currently meet the applicable qualifications, and
 - b. remove designation of hospitals that no longer meet the qualifications.
- D. 1. The Department shall establish and maintain a categorized list of hospitals designated as heart attack centers under this section. The Department shall publish the list on its Internet website.

2. Not less than annually, the Department shall, for the purpose of implementing Section 2 of this act, send the list to the medical director of each ambulance service licensed by the Department and each regional medical director of an emergency medical services region.

- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-2531.2 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. All ambulance authorities in this state shall establish prehospital care protocols related to the assessment, treatment, transport, and routing of acute coronary syndrome (ACS) patients by ambulance services licensed by the State Department of Health.
- B. Such protocols shall take into account the heart attack center designations for hospitals established under Section 1 of this act. Routing protocols for triage and transport of ACS patients or other time-sensitive cardiac patients shall include the distance to the nearest designated heart attack center appropriate for the condition of the patient.
- C. All ambulance authorities in this state shall establish, as part of current training requirements, protocols to assure that licensed ambulance services receive training on the assessment, triage, and treatment of ACS patients. Training shall include the use of an ACS screening instrument including, but not limited to, an electrocardiogram and other cardiac life-saving equipment.
