L3	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified

L 6	A. As used in this section, "health benefit plan" shall have

L 9	B. For any health benefit plan which covers prescription drug

21	date of this act, a patient shall only be responsible for the

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Τ	1. The reimbursement rate for the claim does not cover the
2	entire cost of the drug and any dispensing fees incurred; and
3	2. There is one insurer providing sole reimbursement for the
4	claim.
5	C. For any health benefit plan which covers prescription drug
6	reimbursement and is issued or renewed on or after the effective
7	date of this act, when a copayment at the point of sale is the only
8	source of payment for the prescription drug, the copayment shall
9	include the cost of the prescription drug plus an average cost of
10	dispensing as recognized by the pharmaceutical industry.
11	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
