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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1210.508F,
16	as amended by Section 1, Chapter 60, O.S.L. 2017 (70 O.S. Supp.
17	2018, Section 1210.508F), is amended to read as follows:
18	Section 1210.508F. A. The State Board of Education shall
19	ensure that the reading competencies for elementary teachers are
20	included in the competencies for special education teachers.
21	B. The State Board of Education and the Commission for
22	Educational Quality and Accountability in collaboration with the
23	Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall ensure that all
24	teachers of early childhood education, elementary education $_{m  au}$ and

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special education are provided quality training in intervention, 1 instruction $_{\mathcal{T}}$  and remediation strategies in order to meet the needs 2 3 of students in kindergarten through third grade who are determined to be at risk of reading difficulties. In addition, quality 4 education for prospective teachers shall be provided in research-5 based instructional strategies for instruction, assessment and 6 7 intervention for literacy development for all students, including advanced readers, typically developing readers and struggling 8 9 readers who are coping with a range of challenges, including, but 10 not limited to, English learners and learners with handicapping 11 conditions and learning disabilities (including dyslexia). Quality 12 training shall include guidance from professional resources such as the Report of the National Reading Panel, Response to Intervention 13 guidelines and professional organizations such as the Council for 14 Exceptional Children, International Dyslexia Association, 15 International Literacy Association, National Council of Teachers of 16 English and National Association for the Education of Young 17 Children. 18

C. All institutions within The Oklahoma State System of Higher
Education that offer elementary, early childhood education, or
special education programs approved by the Commission for
Educational Quality and Accountability shall incorporate into those
programs the requirement that teacher candidates study the five
elements of reading instruction which are phonemic awareness,

Teacher candidates shall study strategies including, but not limited to, instruction that is explicitly taught, sequenced, multimodal (reading, writing, speaking, listening, hands-on, etc.), multidisciplinary and reflective to adapt for individual learners.

D. Effective July 1, 2010, teacher candidates enrolled in an 6 7 institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education in an elementary, early childhood education, or a special education 8 9 program approved by the Commission for Educational Quality and 10 Accountability shall pass, prior to graduation, a comprehensive 11 assessment to measure their teaching skills in the area of reading 12 instruction. The assessment shall be developed and administered by the institutions that offer elementary, early childhood education, 13 or special education programs that lead to certification. 14 The 15 assessment shall measure the knowledge and understanding of the teacher candidate in the teaching of the five elements of reading 16 instruction which are phonemic awareness, phonics, reading fluency, 17 vocabulary $_{\tau}$  and comprehension. The results of the assessment shall 18 be reported annually by the institution to the Commission for 19 Educational Quality and Accountability as a part of the required 20 annual report for the institution. The Commission shall include the 21 data in the annual report to the Oklahoma Legislature as required 22 pursuant to Section 6-186 of this title. It is the intent of the 23 Legislature to ensure that teachers graduating from institutions 24

3	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.
4	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
5	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
6	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
7	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
