| 13 | SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  |
| 14 | in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 800 of Title 15, unless there is                                  |
| 15 | created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:   |
| 16 | A. As used in this section:   |
| 17 | 1. "Encrypted" means plaintext data that has been processed   |
| 18 | into ciphertext with the goal of ensuring that the plaintext data is                                  |
| 19 | accessible only to parties authorized by the owner of the plaintext                                   |
| 20 | data;   |
| 21 | 2. "Texting software" means the software that comes preloaded   |
| 22 | on a device, and any subsequent updates to the software, that   |

enables the device to send a text message to or receive a text

message from any telephone number capable of sending or receiving a text message; and

- 3. "Texting software provider" means an entity that provides texting software for a device.
- B. 1. When a person sends a text message to an individual or a group using texting software, the texting software provider for the device sending the text message shall ensure the following:
  - a. that the data sent in the text message is encrypted and that when selecting a communication network to send the text message to another device, the texting software selects a network that is compatible with and supports such encryption,
  - b. a photo, video, or other media sent in the text message is sent in its original quality without degradation,
  - c. that the person who sent the text message receives real-time notification that the recipient of the text message has viewed it, if the recipient of the text message has enabled such a notification function on his or her device, and
  - d. that the intended recipient of a text message is sent a real-time notification that a person is typing text if the sender of the text message has enabled such a notification function on his or her device.

- 2. When a person uses a device to receive a text message from an individual or a group, the texting software provider for the device receiving the text message shall ensure that:
  - a. any photo, video, or other media received in the text message retains the same quality as when it was sent without degradation,
  - b. the person who sent the text message is sent a realtime notification that the recipient of the text message has viewed it, if the recipient of the text message has enabled such a notification function on his or her device, and
  - c. the intended recipient of a text message receives a real-time notification that a person is typing text if the sender of the text message has enabled such a notification function on his or her device.
- C. 1. The Attorney General may bring an action against a texting software provider that has violated subsection B of this section to enforce this section and to restrain the violation by temporary or permanent injunction.
- 2. A court shall require a texting software provider who violates subsection B of this section to be charged an administrative penalty of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per violation. Each device affected by a violation constitutes a separate violation, and
