12	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1835.1, is
13	amended to read as follows:
14	Section 1835.1. A. Every person, partnership, corporation or
15	other legal entity engaged in any public business, trade, or
16	profession of any kind wherein merchandise, goods or services are
17	offered for sale may forbid the entry or presence of any person upon
18	the premises of the place of business, if the person has been
19	convicted of a crime involving entry onto or criminal acts occurring
20	upon any real property owned, leased, or under the control of such
21	person, partnership, corporation or other legal entity. Such crimes
22	shall include, but are not limited to, shoplifting, vandalism, and
23	disturbing the peace while upon the premises of any place of

business of the person, partnership, corporation, or other legal
 entity.

B. In order to exercise the authority conferred by subsection A
of this section, the owner or an agent of the owner of a public
business, trade, or profession must shall notify the person whom the
owner or agent desires to prohibit from such owner's place of
business.

C. Every person, partnership, corporation, or other legal 8 9 entity engaged in any public business, trade, or profession of any kind wherein merchandise, goods, or services are offered for sale 10 may forbid the entry or presence of any person occupying a place of 11 12 business for the purpose of malicious occupation. As used in this subsection, "malicious occupation" means individuals who enter or 13 remain upon the premises for: 14 1. Noncommercial occupation; 15 2. Obstruction of egress or ingress of premises; 16 Intimidation or harassment of owners, vendors, or customers; 17 3. 4. Discouraging patronage through malicious compliance, noxious 18 smells, hygiene, threats, or erratic behavior; or 19 5. Diminishing business utility by encroaching, loitering, 20 occupying, sleeping, camping, sitting, standing, or vandalizing for 21 nonproductive or noncommercial purposes. 22 D. No person shall willfully enter or remain upon the premises 23 after being expressly forbidden to do so in the manner provided for 24

2	of this section, upon conviction, shall be guilty of trespass and

6	imprisonment.
7	$\frac{1}{2}$ D. The provisions of this act shall not preclude any other
8	remedy allowed by law.
