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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 840-8.1 of Title 74, unless
16	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
17	Social Networking and Social Media Policy and Standards
18	A. All state agencies and all political subdivisions of this
19	state, shall adopt a social networking and social media policy that
20	shall apply to the use of social media by state employees and
21	employees of any political subdivision of this state to discourage
22	abusive or offensive online behavior.
23	For purposes of this section, the following definitions shall
24	apply:

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1. "Social networking" or "social media" means interaction with
 external websites or services based upon participant contributions
 to the content. Types of social media include social and
 professional networks, blogs, micro blogs, video or photo sharing
 and social bookmarking; and

6 2. "Comment" means a response to an article or social media7 content submitted by a commenter.

B. The social media and social networking policy developed by
each agency and political subdivision of this state utilizing the
guidelines established in this section shall apply to all state
employees and employees of any political subdivision of this state
who utilize social media or social networking networks for work
purposes.

C. Social media and social networking policies developed by 14 15 each agency and political subdivision of this state shall discourage 16 the sharing of content or comments by state employees and employees of any political subdivision of this state containing the following, 17 when it is directed at a citizen of the State of Oklahoma: 18 Obscene sexual content or links to obscene sexual content; 19 1. Abusive behavior and bullying language or tone; 20 2.

Conduct or encouragement of illegal activity; and
 Disclosure of information which an agency and its employees
 are required to keep confidential by law, regulation or internal
 policy.

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1	D. Social media and social networking policies developed by
2	each state agency and political subdivision of this state in
3	accordance with the requirements established in this section shall
4	be distributed to each affected employee by email.
5	E. The state or a political subdivision shall not be liable if
6	a loss or claim results from any action undertaken in their
7	discretion pursuant to the provisions of this act.
8	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
